The City Council, City of Fairhope, met in regular session at 6:00 p.m., Fairhope Municipal Complex Council Chamber, 161 North Section Street, Fairhope, Alabama 36532, on Thursday, 14 February 2013.

Present were Council President Jack Burrell, Councilmembers: Rich Mueller, Diana Brewer, Michael A. Ford, and Kevin Boone, Mayor Timothy M. Kant, City Attorney Marion E. Wynne, and City Clerk Lisa A. Hanks.

Council President Burrell stated there was a need to add on an agenda item after Agenda Item Number 14; an Executive Session to discuss pending litigation.

Councilmember Boone moved to add on the above mentioned item **not** on the printed agenda. Seconded by Councilmember Mueller, motion passed unanimously by voice vote.

There being a quorum present, Council President Burrell called the meeting to order. The invocation was given by Reverend William Parsons, from the Redeemer Lutheran Church, and the Pledge of Allegiance was recited. Councilmember Brewer moved to approve minutes of the 28 January 2013, regular meeting; minutes of the 28 January 2013, work session; minutes of the 28 January 2013, agenda meeting; minutes of the 31 January 2013, work session; and minutes of the 5 February 2013, Special City Council meeting. Seconded by Councilmember Boone, motion passed unanimously by voice vote.

Mayor Kant addressed the City Council regarding the following items:

- 1. Recognized the Police Department and the Public Works Department for their hard work with Mardi Gras which went well and everyone had a great time. He mentioned a need to buy more barricades.
- 2. Need to update our committees; a list will be put in your boxes to advertise and fill the ones vacant or expired.
- 3. Mentioned the ordinance for take home vehicles which is on the agenda. This is the exact ordinance which used to be in the Personnel Handbook. He said an analysis was done for the last three and a half years which showed the City paid approximately \$436,000 for these vehicles. This figure includes 16 vehicles in accidents and worker compensation claims.

The following individuals spoke during Public Participation:

- 1. Colin Keleher, 105 Orleans Drive, addressed the City Council regarding Agenda Item Number 5, request to rezone the property of George B. Klumpp, Jr., Fran K. Riggs, and Michael B. Klumpp to be rezoned from R-A Residential/Agriculture District to R-2 Medium Density Single Family Residential District. He requested the City Council take off the last part which states "to be a part of Idlewild, Phase 9 and 10." He commented the Property Owners' Association was not asked about this addition.
- 2. Ken Lacey, 120 Royal Lane, addressed the City Council regarding Agenda Item Number 5. He said Morphy Avenue would run straight through Subdivision; and there are no requirements on homes like with Idlewild, so they should not use same name.
- 3. Jonas Lyborg, President of the Property Owners' Association and resident of 211 Royal Lane, addressed the City Council regarding Agenda Item Number 5. He was asked to speak at the Public Hearing which would be held after Council Comments.

Councilmember Ford addressed the City Council regarding the Recycling Committee and asked for anyone who wants to be a member to put their name in at the City.

Councilmember Boone addressed the City Council regarding the Harbor Board and also requested anyone who wants to be a member to put their name in at the City. Councilmember Boone announced that he would be abstaining on Agenda Item Number 5 due to a conflict.

Council President Burrell addressed the City Council regarding the Festival of Flight to be held in September 2013. He said there are sponsorships available and there will be a job fair onsite. He requested from Mayor Kant the economic impact of Mardi Gras for the City of Fairhope.

A Public Hearing was held as advertised on a proposed ordinance to Amend Zoning Ordinance No. 1253. Councilmember Ford introduced in writing an ordinance to rezone the property of George B. Klumpp, Jr., Fran K. Riggs, and Michael B. Klumpp to be rezoned from R-A Residential/Agriculture District to R-2 Medium Density Single Family Residential District. The Planning Commission decision was a favorable recommendation of this ordinance. The property is located at the east side of Thompson Hall Road just north of Windmill Road, Fairhope, Alabama to be a part of Idlewild, Phase 9 and 10.

Council President Burrell opened the Public Hearing at 6:19 p.m.

- 1. Jonas Lyborg, 211 Royal Lane, addressed the City Council and stated no previous discussions were held with Property Owner's Association as to whether it should be a part of Idlewild. He mentioned retention ponds and storm drains. Traffic will increase. He also mentioned Page 13 of the Subdivision Regulations regarding name change in subdivision.
- 2. Terry Jensen, 264 Royal Lane, addressed the City Council and stated he does not see a great benefit for this addition. They should put a fence up and have their own subdivision.
- 3. Colin Keleher, 105 Orleans Drive addressed the City Council and requested the Property Owners' Association to be part of the preconstruction meeting.

Jonathan Smith, Planning Director, addressed the City Council and said this is a zoning issue not a Subdivision issue. The property owners will have covenants and restrictions of their own. The Planning Commission is the final decision for subdivisions. Drainage issue will be kept up and maintained per the City requirements.

Council President Burrell questioned the zoning for the original Idlewild. Mr. Smith replied R-2 which is what the property owners' are requesting to be rezoned.

Mayor Kant commented the name maybe could be changed to something other than Idlewild.

- 4. Steve Pumphrey of Preble-Rish, LLC addressed the City Council and said he agreed with Mr. Smith and will take back the request of possibly renaming the subdivision.
- 5. David Jester, 208 Orleans Drive, addressed the City Council and said the depreciation of homes is my biggest issue. He does not want the property to depreciate.

The Public Hearing closed at 6:36 p.m.

Due to the fact that Councilmember Boone previously announced his abstention from this Agenda Item, motion for immediate consideration failed for lack of a unanimous vote. This ordinance will layover until the February 25, 2013 City Council meeting.

A Public Hearing was held as advertised on a proposed ordinance to Amend Zoning Ordinance No. 1253. Councilmember Ford introduced in writing Ordinance No. 1483, an ordinance to amend the Planned Unit Development known as North Village at Stone Creek, Fairhope; and to approve a site plan. The Planning Commission gave a favorable recommendation of this ordinance. The property is Lot 4, North Village at Stone Creek PUD, located north of Stone Creek Subdivision, west of State Highway 181 (aka County Road 27); Fairhope, Alabama.

Council President Burrell opened the Public Hearing at 6:38 p.m. Steve Pumphrey of Preble-Rish, LLC mentioned that this amendment reduces density in the PUD. No one present opposed the proposed ordinance, the Public Hearing closed at 6:40 p.m.

In order to take immediate action, Councilmember Boone moved for immediate consideration. Seconded by Councilmember Brewer, motion for immediate consideration passed unanimously by the following voice votes: AYE – Burrell, Mueller, Brewer, Ford, and Boone. NAY - None. Councilmember Mueller then moved for final adoption of Ordinance No. 1483. Seconded by Councilmember Brewer, motion for final adoption passed by the following voice votes: AYE – Burrell, Mueller, Brewer, Ford, and Boone. NAY - None.

Councilmember Boone introduced in writing Ordinance No. 1484, an ordinance to Repeal Ordinance No. 1416 and Amending Ordinance No. 1255 Known as the Personnel Rules, Policies and Procedures Ordinance, Section 8.10 Use of City Vehicles. In order to take immediate action, Councilmember Brewer moved for immediate consideration. Seconded by Councilmember Mueller, motion for immediate consideration passed unanimously by the following voice votes: AYE – Burrell, Mueller, Brewer, Ford, and Boone. NAY - None. Councilmember Boone then moved for final adoption of Ordinance No. 1484. The motion was seconded by Councilmember Brewer; and she requested from Mayor Kant to see the cost down the road and any net savings. Council President Burrell commented that they did not want to impose any hardship on employees and there was no harm intended. After further discussion, motion for final adoption passed by the following voice votes: AYE – Burrell, Mueller, Brewer, Ford, and Boone. NAY - None.

Councilmember Brewer introduced in writing, and moved for the adoption of the following resolution, a resolution to award bid for a Self-Contained 200 Gallon Sprayer for Quail Creek Golf Course (Bid No. 013-13) with a cost of \$32,560.00. Seconded by Councilmember Boone, motion passed unanimously by voice vote.
