The City Council, City of Fairhope, met in regular session at 6:00 p.m., Fairhope Municipal Complex Council Chamber, 161 North Section Street, Fairhope, Alabama 36532, on Monday, 23 January 2012.

Present were Council President Lonnie L. Mixon, Councilmembers: Debbie W. Quinn, Daniel Stankoski, Michael A. Ford, and City Attorney Marion E. Wynne, and City Clerk Lisa A. Hanks. Councilmember Rick Kingrea and Mayor Timothy M. Kant were absent.

There being a quorum present, Council President Mixon called the meeting to order. The invocation was given by David Stookey, Pastor of Fairhope Community Church, and the Pledge of Allegiance was recited. Council President Mixon asked if there were any corrections to the minutes from the 9 January 2012, regular meeting. Council President Mixon stated the minutes needed to be amended by adding the City Administrator spoke to various items on the agenda. Councilmember Stankoski moved to amend the minutes. Seconded by Councilmember Quinn, motion passed unanimously by voice vote. He then stated if there are no other corrections, the minutes stand approved as amended.

Council President Mixon asked if there were any corrections to the minutes from the 9 January 2012, public participation/work session meeting. He then stated if there are no corrections, the minutes stand approved as written.

Councilmember Quinn moved to address the following items **not** on the printed agenda: Presentation of the Audit for fiscal year ending September 30, 2011 by Hartmann, Blackmon & Kilgore; Resolution authorizing Mayor Kant to execute an Amendment to Contract PS002-11 for Evaluation and Optimization of Well 5 Treatment Strategy; Approve the request for an RFQ for Solid Waste Equipment; and Approve the Traffic Recommendations for Striping. Seconded by Councilmember Stankoski, motion passed unanimously by voice vote.

Dennis Sherrin, Managing Shareholder of Hartmann, Blackmon & briefly went over Comprehensive Annual Financial Report "CAFR" for the year ending September 30, 2011. Mr. Sherrin thanked Rose Fogarty, Nancy Wilson, Jill Cabaniss, Lisa Hanks, and Nancy Bell for all of their help throughout the engagement by gathering information and answering our requests. He mentioned that the City of Fairhope will receive an unqualified opinion which is the best opinion his firm can provide. After further discussion, Councilmember Ford moved to accept the Comprehensive Annual Financial Report. Seconded by Councilmember Quinn, motion passed unanimously by voice vote.

Council President Mixon addressed the City Council as the Chairman of the Finance Committee and read the following statement:

Report by Lonnie L. Mixon, chairman of the City Council Finance Committee dated 1/23/2012 RE: Annual Audit Report

As chairman of the City Council Finance Committee, I sincerely thank the volunteers of the Financial Advisory Committee and the Budget Committee for their time and sage advice given to the Council.

I commend the Council for making difficult, conservative fiscal decisions which, at times, were unpopular. And, I commend the staff and department heads for working diligently to provide excellent services while staying within budget. This audit shows that over the past three years by working together we have accomplished our goal to achieve a high level of financial stability thus making Fairhope a fiscally strong city.

Three years ago when this Council was first seated, the auditors reported that City spending and income lines were crossing... In other words, we were spending more than we had, and our emergency reserves were depleted. And every year we had to secure a 2 million dollar line of credit just to pay our bills.

In contrast, today our situation is much, much better.

In the Electric Department:

- Three years ago we had 40 vehicles with the newest being 20 years old; today the fleet is modernized and even includes a state-of-the art hybridpowered lift unit.
- Employees had inadequate protective gear, while today we meet or exceed industry standards, which is credited with probably saving the life of a City employee who was recently electrocuted on the job.
- Transformers, switching gear, transmission poles, fuses and other necessary components of the electrical system were out of date in poor repair, with almost no spares on hand. Now our system is up-to-date, with lots of redundancy to minimize outages, and in an excellent condition.

A similar transformation has also occurred over the past three years in both the Gas Department and Water & Sewer Department. For example, we are making excellent progress on replacing cast iron pipe; and we have upgraded the fleet to include a new low-impact boring machine used by all three utility departments.

And in the government unit, our General Fund is also on a firm footing compared to three years ago. Reserves for emergencies are approaching appropriate levels, infrastructure improvements such as streets and sidewalks are now being funded and completed, and we have acquired land for continuing improvements to our outdoor recreation programs for youth sports.

Looking forward to next year and beyond, we still have financial challenges to meet. We know, for example that:

- more infrastructure improvements need to be accomplished such as additional street work, new sidewalks, recreation facilities, sewer plant upgrades, and improvements to the north section of our water system;
- > we have to recognize and plan for monies needed for unfunded liabilities in our retiree health care program; and
- > we have to make sure adequate funds are available to pay off long term debt.

But we also know from experience that these challenges can be met if we continue to control spending, protect revenue sources, devote careful thought and attention to the annual budget process, and plan for the future with improved strategic planning.

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Chief Bill Press addressed the City Council and introduced two new City of Fairhope Police officers: Damian Rehorn and Phelon Durggins. Chief Press stated "here are the best of the best."

Councilmember Quinn addressed the City Council regarding the CH2MHILL fecal study status. She mentioned the draft report has been presented to Dan McCrory. Councilmember Quinn recognized two Boy Scouts who were attending the meeting to earn merit badges for advancement to an Eagle Scout.

Councilmember Stankoski addressed the City Council regarding the following items:

A proposal was made to the city council to create an Education Advisory Committee (EAC). This was discussed by the city council and mayor at council meetings and work session. The council and mayor unanimously agreed to create an EAC. RICK KINGREA and I were designated as council liaisons to review applications and make recommendations to council. Potential members were to use existing committee applicant procedures with a deadline of 1/19/2012.

There have been no discussions by the council regarding funding of EAC.

KINGREA and I have been in contact with the Baldwin County Board of Education (BCBE) regarding the committee make up and jointly developing a mission statement for EAC. The goal is to have the EAC work with BCBE to make Fairhope Schools and feeder pattern as good as we can possibly make them. This is not a competition and the EAC should act in concert and cooperation with Dr. LEE or representative and the BCBE. The EAC is **not being** formed as a subterfuge for a movement to establish a Fairhope City School System.

The application deadline was 1/19/12. Twelve applications were filed. KINGREA and I will review them and make reconditions to the council for approval.

Councilmember Stankoski mentioned the City Sketches and the Library Section; and read the upcoming events for the Library. He said the City should be proud to hold the Senior Bowl practice at the Fairhope Stadium; and agreed with the comments made by Council President Mixon. He stated hard decisions had to be made with hard work from a lot of people.

City Administrator Gregg Mims addressed the City Council regarding the following items:

- 1) Mayor Kant requested that Mr. Mims address the City Council regarding the Dyas lawsuit. Statements from Caine O'Rear, attorney with Hand Arendall, from the January 24, 2011 City Council meeting were read. The only remaining issue from the Fly Creek PUD has to do with the traffic signal at Veterans Drive and Highway 98.
- 2) The City of Fairhope received the Bronze Award from the Municipal Worker's Compensation Fund in 2010 Risk Management. The claims from 2007 through 2011 were reviewed and in 2011 the City had the lowest number claims from its employees. Further improvement for these claims will be to set up an internal safety review committee.
- 3) The Gov Deals Program which was approved one year ago has netted in a short time \$54,000 plus.
- 4) The Greeno Road Sidewalk Project began today.
- 5) The Volanta Street Sidewalk Project is almost ninety percent complete.

City Administrator Mims addressed the City Council and briefly explained Agenda Items Number 6 through Number 13 and Number 15 prior to the City Council voting on same.

Councilmember Quinn introduced in writing, and moved for the adoption of the following resolution, a resolution authorizing Mayor Timothy M.
