The City Council, City of Fairhope, met in regular session at 6:00 p.m., Fairhope Municipal Complex Council Chamber, 161 North Section Street, Fairhope, Alabama 36532, on Monday, 24 September 2012.

Present were Council President Lonnie L. Mixon, Councilmembers: Debbie W. Quinn, Daniel Stankoski, Michael A. Ford, and Rick Kingrea, Mayor Timothy M. Kant, City Attorney Marion E. Wynne, and City Clerk Lisa A. Hanks.

There being a quorum present, Council President Mixon called the meeting to order. The invocation was given by Reverend Michael Davis, from Twin Beech AME Zion Church, and the Pledge of Allegiance was recited. Council President Mixon asked if there were any corrections to the minutes from the 10 September 2012, regular meeting. He then stated if there are no corrections, the minutes stand approved as written.

Council President Mixon asked if there were any corrections to the minutes from the 10 September 2012, public participation/work session meeting. He then stated if there are no corrections, the minutes stand approved as written.

Council President Mixon asked if there were any corrections to the minutes from the 18 September 2012, special city council meeting. He then stated if there are no corrections, the minutes stand approved as written.

Councilmember Quinn addressed the City Council regarding the following items:

- 1. Thanked the Financial Advisory Committee and the Budget Committee for all of their hard work during the last few years.
- 2. Mentioned we have reached the \$7.0 million dollars in the Rainy Day Fund and need to begin paying off our debt; and would like to see the Library debt paid.

Councilmember Stankoski addressed the City Council and said he agreed with the comments from Councilmember Quinn.

Councilmember Ford addressed the City Council and commented how proud he was of Judge Snedeker's brother (Brandt Snedeker) for winning this past weekend.

Calvin Hunt addressed the City Council and formally apologized to Mayor Kant and the Councilmembers for his behavior and comments if he offended anybody. He also apologized to the City of Fairhope and Mike Odom with the Fairhope Courier. Mr. Hunt said we need to work together and once again apologized to all of them.

City Administrator Mims addressed the City Council and briefly explained Agenda Items Number 6 through Number 16 prior to the City Council voting on same.

A Public Hearing was held as advertised on a proposed ordinance to Amend Zoning Ordinance No. 1253. Councilmember Ford introduced in writing Ordinance No. 1476, and ordinance to rezone the property of Darwin and Nikki Harris to be rezoned from R-1 Low Density Single Family Residential District to B-2 General Business District. The property is located at 19283 S. Greeno Road, Fairhope, Alabama. The Planning Commission forwarded a favorable recommendation of this ordinance, an ordinance. City Administrator Gregg Mims explained the proposed ordinance.

Council President Mixon opened the Public Hearing at 6:05 p.m.

1. Danny Calhoun addressed the City Council and stated he represented Darwin and Nikki Harris. He stated that Mr. Harris was a native to Fairhope and has worked for Terry Thompson Chevrolet for 15 years. He mentioned Mrs. Harris worked for Infirmary Health. Mr. Calhoun said that Mr. Harris wanted his own dealership and that was the reason for the request to rezone the property. He stated there was no opposition of the adjoining property owners and he requested the City Council to approve.

No one present opposed the proposed ordinance, the Public Hearing closed at 6:08 p.m.


