The City Council, City of Fairhope, met in regular session at 6:00 p.m., Fairhope Municipal Complex Council Chamber, 161 North Section Street, Fairhope, Alabama 36532, on Tuesday, 29 May 2012.

Present were Council President Lonnie L. Mixon, Councilmembers: Debbie W. Quinn, Daniel Stankoski, Michael A. Ford, and Rick Kingrea, Mayor Timothy M. Kant, City Attorney Marion E. Wynne, and City Clerk Lisa A. Hanks.

There being a quorum present, Council President Mixon called the meeting to order. The invocation was given by Dr. Jerry Henry, Pastor at First Baptist Church, and the Pledge of Allegiance was recited. Council President Mixon asked if there were any corrections to the minutes from the 14 May 2012, regular meeting. He then stated if there are no corrections, the minutes stand approved as written.

Council President Mixon asked if there were any corrections to the minutes from the 14 May 2012, work session meeting. He then stated if there are no corrections, the minutes stand approved as written.

Mayor Kant addressed the City Council and presented Jennifer Fidler, Public Works Director, with an award from the AARP for the restriping and paving project which made the streets more pedestrian friendly and more walkable.

Councilmember Quinn addressed the City Council and mentioned the complaints being received on the parking garage and cleanliness. Mayor Kant replied that Gregg Mims was working with the Police Department for cameras; and we have a regular clean-up crew for the parking garage.

Councilmember Stankoski addressed the City Council on the following items:

- 1. Education Advisory Committee has gone to all five schools for a walk through and spoke with staff at each. We are committed to find ways to improve education.
- 2. Met with Mayor Kant regarding water truck to water flowers and to also do repairs at Library.

Council President Mixon appointed a committee to work on Fairhoper's Community Park: Sherry Sullivan, Tom Kuhl, Ken Eslava, Councilmember Kingrea, Councilmember Stankoski, two members from Leanne Pearson's group, two members from Play by the Bay, and Councilmember Ford.

Councilmember Kingrea addressed the City Council regarding the Fairhope Baseball team and their outstanding season. He said they are one of the best and most consistent teams in the State. Councilmember Kingrea mentioned receiving a couple of requests for funds from the City and he will give those to Sherry Sullivan.

City Administrator Gregg Mims addressed the City Council regarding the following item: Police Chief introduced our newest Police Officer Gregory Williams who will be in the Uniform Patrol Division. Officer Williams will be going to the Police Academy in July.

Councilmember Stankoski moved to address the following items **not** on the printed agenda: Resolution for CH2MHILL Amendment No. 2 to Contract, Motion to fill vacancy for Corrections Officer, and Motion to direct staff to prepare a draft resolution to authorize \$38,000 from the Impact Fees Fund or other City Funds for Bleachers and Goal Posts as requested from the previous meeting for the Recreation Department. Seconded by Councilmember Ford, motion passed unanimously by voice vote.

- 1. Bob Keyser, representing the Fairhope Booster Club and Recreation Board member, addressed the City Council regarding Agenda Item Number 9, an Ordinance to provide for rules and regulations for recreation areas including Fairhope Municipal Park, Volanta Park, Stimpson Field, Founder's Park, Barnwell, and Manley Road. Mr. Keyser first mentioned we have two State champions: one for the Triple Jump and one for 6-A Golf. Then he said the challenges in the ordinance are in the spaces that we use and there are health and safety concerns. Enforcement of the ordinance and coolers were questioned. Mr. Keyser stated that a Board member would request for the violation to stop, and if needed, would contact the Police Department. He also said that these rules and regulations are only while event are being played.
- 2. Erik Cortinas, Commissioner of Fairhope Baseball and Recreation Board member, addressed the City Council regarding Agenda Item Number 9. Mr. Cortinas mentioned a dog obedience class, with 20 to 25 dogs, at one of the fields and the owners left a mess. He said skateboarding is an issue with children being run down. The City also has a "Young Lungs at Play" ordinance.

City Administrator Mims addressed the City Council and briefly explained Agenda Items Number 6 through Number 12 prior to the City Council voting on same.

Councilmember Ford moved for final adoption of <u>Ordinance No. 1469</u>, an Ordinance adopting New Building, Mechanical, Plumbing, Fuel and Gas, and Electric Codes. (Introduced at May 14, 2012 City Council Meeting). The motion was seconded by Councilmember Kingrea. City Administrator Mims stated for the record "that anytime you adopt new codes, you have existing plans that are under review, any officially stamped-in plans that are under review by the Building Department, will be judged under the old codes not the newly adopted 2012 code." After further discussion, motion for final adoption passed unanimously by the following votes: AYE – Quinn, Stankoski, Mixon, Ford, and Kingrea. NAY – None.

Councilmember Ford introduced in writing <u>Ordinance No. 1470</u>, an Ordinance to provide for Rules and Regulations for Recreation Areas including Fairhope Municipal Park, Volanta Park, Stimpson Field, Founder's Park, Barnwell and Manley. In order to take immediate action, Councilmember Ford moved for immediate consideration. Seconded by Councilmember Kingrea, motion for immediate consideration passed unanimously by the following votes: AYE – Quinn, Stankoski, Mixon, Ford, and Kingrea. NAY – None.

Councilmember Kingrea mentioned he would like to amend the ordinance by changing the wording from "No coolers allowed during scheduled athletic events" to "No coolers allowed at scheduled athletic events." Councilmember Kingrea then moved for final adoption of <u>Ordinance No. 1470</u> with the amendment. Seconded by Councilmember Quinn with the amendment, motion for final adoption as amended passed unanimously by the following votes: AYE – Quinn, Stankoski, Mixon, Ford, and Kingrea. NAY – None.

Councilmember Stankoski commented that the folks on the Recreation Board have done a good job and are the ones on the playing field; and said he did not have a problem with any aspect of this ordinance. Councilmember Quinn commented that the people that she had talked with were the ones at the beach and pool; and if these were not considered a field then they don't have a problem. Councilmember Ford stated the he had attended the Recreation Board meetings and this was thoroughly discussed by both sides. This ordinance is a safety measure for the playing areas.

Councilmember Stankoski introduced in writing Ordinance No. 1471, an Ordinance to Exempt Certain "Covered Items" from the Municipal Sales and Use Tax beginning at 12:01 a.m. on Friday, July 6, 2012 and ending at twelve midnight the following Sunday July 8, 2012; authorized by Act 2012-256 known as the Severe Weather Preparedness Tax Holiday. Seconded by Councilmember Kingrea, motion for immediate consideration passed unanimously by the following votes: AYE – Quinn, Stankoski, Mixon, Ford, and Kingrea. NAY – None. Councilmember Stankoski then moved for final adoption of Ordinance No. 1471. Seconded by Councilmember Kingrea, motion for final adoption passed unanimously by the following votes: AYE – Quinn, Stankoski, Mixon, Ford, and Kingrea. NAY – None.

City Council reviewed an application for a Restaurant Liquor License by Virginia H. Walcott, Windmill Market, L.L.C., d/b/a Windmill Market located at 85 N. Bancroft Street, Fairhope, Alabama. Councilmember Quinn moved to approve the issuance of the license. Seconded by Councilmember Ford, motion passed unanimously by voice vote.

The request of the Marietta Johnson Museum was postponed until the next meeting. Maggie Mosteller, Director of the Museum, addressed the City Council regarding the request for directional signs and showed the City Council a facsimile of the signs. Council President Mixon stated the City Council needed more information on the signs and placement. Ms. Mosteller was told this request needs to go before the Board of Adjustments and Appeals and she would be contacted.

At the request of the City Attorney, Marion E. Wynne, the City Council will rise from the meeting to go into Executive Session to discuss based on Section 36-25A-7(a)(3) to discuss pending litigation. The approximate time to be in Executive Session is 30 minutes.

Councilmember Quinn moved to go into Executive Session. Seconded by Councilmember Stankoski, motion passed unanimously by voice vote.

Exited the dais at 6:37 p.m. Returned at 7:10 p.m.
