The City Council, City of Fairhope, met in regular session at 12:00 p.m., Fairhope Municipal Complex Council Chamber, 161 North Section Street, Fairhope, Alabama 36532, on Friday, 27 May 2016.

Present were Council President Jack Burrell, Councilmembers: Diana Brewer and Kevin Boone, Mayor Timothy M. Kant, City Attorney Marion E. Wynne, and City Clerk Lisa A. Hanks. Councilmembers: Rich Mueller and Michael A. Ford were absent.

There being a quorum present, Council President Burrell called the meeting to order at 12:10 p.m. The invocation was given Deacon George Yeend, of St. Lawrence Catholic Church, and the Pledge of Allegiance was recited. Councilmember Brewer moved to approve minutes of the 9 May 2016, regular meeting; minutes of the 9 May 2016, work session; and minutes of the 9 May 2016, agenda meeting. Seconded by Councilmember Boone, motion passed unanimously by voice vote.

Mayor Kant addressed the City Council and commented we have a great Memorial Day holiday planned with the Baldwin Pops playing at 6:30 p.m. on the bluff. There will also be a Monday Memorial Ceremony for our veterans.

John Saraceno addressed the City Council regarding the "Siren Warning System" which is an alert system for storms. He said this siren is already in place, but just needs to be reactivated. Mr. Saraceno stated there is a need for this to be in place for super cell storms with winds in excess of 60 miles per hour and for tornados. He announced there will be a test on June 7, 2016 at 6:00 p.m.; and then will be tested on a monthly basis.

Arthur Bosarge, Assistant Public Works Director, addressed the City Council regarding the Zika virus and mosquitoes. Mr. Bosarge stated the virus has been found six hours from Fairhope. He said that on June 14, 2016 the City will have a larvicide tablet distribution at City Hall. Mayor Kant commented if you find brown mosquitoes in your yard then you have standing water within 100 feet nearby.

Council President Burrell stated there was a need to add on an agenda item after Agenda Item Number 9: a Resolution that the proposed Masonic Site Plan by Jade Consulting, LLC for the parking lot west of Masonic Drive is hereby approved.

Councilmember Boone moved to add on the above mentioned item **not** on the printed agenda. Seconded by Councilmember Brewer, motion passed unanimously by voice vote.

Council President Burrell read the following on behalf of Louis Tooker who is the architect working with the Hayeks:

My name is Louis Tooker – I live at 3942 Cole Drive W. in Mobile, Alabama. I apologize that a schedule conflict makes it impossible for me to attend tonight's rescheduled Council Meeting – in my absence, I have asked that my comments be read into the public record at tonight's meeting.

I am an architect, and for the past 14 months, I have been working closely with the City of Fairhope in the development of a design proposal for the rezoning of Mr. Fred Hayek's property at 848 Greeno Road.

I want to congratulate the Mayor, the City Council, and the Planning Commission for a job well done. Baldwin County is the fastest growing county in the State of Alabama, and the City of Fairhope is without question a major driver of that growth. With an abundance of desirable housing and a downtown area that is at the same time both beautiful and commercially successful, you have become one of the most desirable small cities in Alabama, some would say in the South. It should come as no surprise, then, that in the past 25 years, the City of Fairhope has more than doubled in population.

Growth is not a bad thing, but it is not without consequences. One of these consequences has been the impact of this growth on Greeno Road. Twenty-five years ago, when Fred Hayek purchased his home on a 3.23-acre parcel at 848 Greeno Road, the State was just beginning to convert the road from two lanes to four lanes. Now the road is four lanes, with accel/decel lanes on either side, and left hand turn lanes in each direction. I was unable to determine the traffic volume on Greeno Road in 1991, but you can be sure that it was significantly lower than the current volume of over 22,000 vehicles per day - and I would guess that the average maximum speed of all of these vehicles exceeds 50 miles per hour. Who would choose to build their home on such a road?

At the April 9 Council Meeting, a local resident suggested that Mr. Hayek is seeking to rezone his property because he "changed his mind". *I would suggest instead that his mind was changed for him.* The increased traffic on Greeno Road has made his property unsuitable for an R-1 zoning classification, and individuals like Mr. Hayek whose homes front on Greeno Road have been "trapped" by these changes which they could scarcely have predicted, and over which they had no control.

But there is an equitable solution. The City has mandated that any rezoning applications for properties on Greeno Road must be submitted in the form of a PUD, or Planned Unit Development. In a PUD rezoning, the Applicant is obliged to develop a detailed solution that will address all of the City's concerns regarding the impact of the proposed new development on the city, the roadway, and the surrounding properties. Because a PUD rezoning is approved only for the design solution as presented, the City retains control over the development of the property.

As an architect, I believe there are solutions to the development of properties such as Mr. Hayek's that are, at the same time, (1) compatible with the traffic volumes on Green Road, (2) sensitive to the scale and character of the surrounding residential neighborhoods, and (3) respectful of the City's emphasis on the value of landscaping. After working closely for over a year with Fairhope's Planning & Zoning Department and your Planning Commission, I believe we have arrived at just such a solution, and we ask for City Council's approval of our application.

We thank you for this opportunity to address the Council.
