The City Council, City of Fairhope, met in regular session at 6:00 p.m., Fairhope Municipal Complex Council Chamber, 161 North Section Street, Fairhope, Alabama 36532, on Monday, 11 July 2016.

Present were Council President Jack Burrell, Councilmembers: Rich Mueller, Diana Brewer, and Kevin Boone, Mayor Timothy M. Kant, City Attorney Marion E. Wynne, and City Clerk Lisa A. Hanks. Councilmember Michael A. Ford was absent.

There being a quorum present, Council President Burrell called the meeting to order. The invocation was given by Rick Malugani, Pastor of Fairhope Christian Church, and the Pledge of Allegiance was recited. Councilmember Brewer moved to approve minutes of the 27 June 2016, regular meeting; minutes of the 27 June 2016, work session; and minutes of the 27 June 2016, agenda meeting. Seconded by Councilmember Mueller, motion passed unanimously by voice vote.

Mayor Kant addressed the City Council and reminded everyone to thank the Fairhope Volunteer Fire Department for an excellent Fourth of July fireworks display; and thank our Police Department who was there from the beginning until the end of the celebration. He mentioned there were no altercations this year; and also that the Art Walk went without a hitch.

Chief Petties addressed the City Council and introduced Fairhope's newest Police Officer Travis Long who comes to the City from Mobile. Officer Long thanked the City Council and Mayor for allowing him to be a part of Fairhope.

Mayor Kant told the Fairhope Police Department that the City is proud of all of you; we respect all of you; and thank all of you for what you do for Fairhope.

Council President Burrell stated there was a need to add on an agenda item after Agenda Item Number 12: a Resolution that Option No. 4 of the proposed striping plan for De La Mare Avenue by Jade Consulting, LLC with a one-way east to west traffic direction is hereby approved.

Councilmember Boone moved to add on the above mentioned item **not** on the printed agenda. Seconded by Councilmember Brewer, motion passed unanimously by voice vote.

The following individual addressed the City Council during Public Participation for Agenda Items:

1. Jacob Hartley, 134 Song Grove Boulevard, addressed the City Council regarding Agenda Item Number 5: a resolution that the City of Fairhope is authorized to enter into a partnership with the Fairhope Single Tax Corporation for the Parking Lot behind the fairhope Public Library construction and renovation project. Mr. Hartley stated this was not a solution for parking in Fairhope; and the parking deck is underutilized. He requested the City Council to reconsider the construction and renovation project of a parking lot; and to create a park for all to use.

Councilmember Boone addressed the City Council and stated that he thoroughly enjoyed this year's Fireworks Celebration.

Council President Burrell addressed the City Council and asked; "where is the parking shuttle for downtown Fairhope and when will it be implemented?"

Councilmember Mueller introduced in writing, and moved for the adoption of the following resolution, a resolution that the City of Fairhope is authorized to enter into a partnership with the Fairhope Single Tax Corporation for the Parking Lot behind the Fairhope Public Library construction and renovation project. The motion was seconded by Councilmember Boone.

Councilmember Brewer questioned if there was a committee for downtown parking. Mayor Kant said that the Fairhope Single Tax Corporation brought this to the City Council as a proposal. Council President Burrell asked Ms. Sullivan if the Farmers Market and Christmas Trees would still be held in this lot. Ms. Sullivan replied that all of the events that are normally held in the lot will continue; i.e. Arts and Crafts, Mardi Gras, Hoot Scoot, etc. This will be pervious parking with greenspace. Councilmember Brewer commented greenspace is limited in downtown Fairhope. Ms. Sullivan replied the plan has a great landscape buffer and will use LIDs; and the Fairhope Single Tax Corporation went to great lengths to maintain trees and buffers in the plan. She said there will also be more parking for senior citizens which is needed; and the Walking School Bus will originate at this site.

Councilmember Brewer questioned Dan Burden's suggestions and will these be implemented. Mayor Kant replied he will propose the suggestions in the budget. After further discussion, motion passed unanimously by voice vote.
