The City Council, City of Fairhope, met in regular session at 6:00 p.m., Fairhope Municipal Complex Council Chamber, 161 North Section Street, Fairhope, Alabama 36532, on Monday, 14 January 2013.

Present were Council President Jack Burrell, Councilmembers: Diana Brewer, Michael A. Ford, Rich Mueller and Kevin Boone, Mayor Timothy M. Kant, City Attorney Marion E. Wynne, and Assistant City Clerk Candace G. Antinarella. City Clerk Lisa A. Hanks was absent.

There being a quorum present, Council President Burrell called the meeting to order. The invocation was given by Dr. Jerry Henry of First Baptist Church and the Pledge of Allegiance was recited. Councilmember Boone moved to approve minutes of the 27 December 2012, regular meeting; minutes of the 27 December 2012, work session; and minutes of the 27 December 2012 agenda meeting. Seconded by Councilmember Mueller, motion passed unanimously by voice vote.

Fairhope Police Officer and Explorer Advisor Bunky Bishop came forward to introduce the Fairhope Police Explorer Cadets and present the Explorer of the Year award. Officer Bishop explained the Explorer Cadet program and noted they assist in City events such as Mardi Gras and Arts & Crafts. These teens, ranging from 14-20 years old, also receive police training. Police Reserve Officer and Explorer Advisor Alan Bishop and Police Chief Joe Petties came forward to present Explorer Victoria Hughes with the Explorer of the Year Award.

Mayor Kant addressed the City Council regarding the following items:

- 1. The City's finances for the first quarter of the fiscal year will be ready and distributed at the next council meeting as well as the audit.
- 2. Mayor Kant asked Sherry Sullivan to come forward to give a report of three items:
  - a) Community Health Initiative this awareness has been in the media and the City of Fairhope is becoming involved to get the community active and healthy. This was a brainstorm of the Mayor. The City will be participating in Scale Back Alabama. There is no cost to walk at the Fairhope Recreation Center or the Football Stadium with weigh-ins at the Recreation Center. The City now has a Facebook page for this initiative.
  - b) Senior Bowl Practice Two practice sessions will be held in Fairhope; South will practice on Monday, January 21<sup>st</sup> at 1:30 p.m. and the North squad will practice Thursday, January 24<sup>th</sup> at 9:30 a.m. There will be an autograph session following each.
  - c) The Nix Center fees were recently reduced and so far they have 40 new members in January.

Council President Burrell opened Public Participation and no one came forward.

#### Council Comments:

Councilmember Brewer – Education Advisory Committee has met with the Fairhope Principals and relayed that the City has allocated funds to the schools. The principals are looking at plans and will report back by January 31, 2013.

Councilmember Ford — We need to revisit the ordinance on fires in the City and look at a fire versus a fire pit. We need to hire another Animal Control Officer to work later hours. Questioned the bike racks around town and asked who authorized the painting of these. Mayor responded that he only knows what he read in the newspaper.

Councilmember Boone – The Police Chief search has narrowed down to four candidates that are ready to be interviewed and have background checks run. They are Joe Petties, Joe Bettner, Mike Reynolds and Stan Stabler.

Council President Burrell – Thanks to everyone for the emails and phone calls. All pets are to have a pet license as required by City Ordinance and we should push this. Recommended the Dog Park have a sign that requires pets to have a pet license. Festival of Flight is in the works and they are looking at late fall 2013. This is an Air Show/Trade Show/Job Fair and Burrell spoke to each council member and the council supports the Festival of Flight.

Councilmember Mueller introduced in writing, and moved for the adoption of the following resolution, a resolution to rescind (Bid No. 002-13) City Sketches Printing 2013 and authorize rebid. Motion failed for lack of a second. Discussion ensued that this is a quarterly printing and the City is going back to mailing this to the citizens. The bid was public and Councilmember Boone said it is not fair to the only bidder.

#### **RESOLUTION NO. 2021-13**

WHEREAS, in Fairhope, Alabama, Ecumenical Ministries Incorporated (EMI) is a public, non-profit, non-denominational, United Way social service agency; and,

WHEREAS, EMI's mission is to improve the quality of life in Baldwin County by meeting basic needs, encouraging personal growth, effecting social and economic justice and celebrate our common life; and,

WHEREAS, EMI provide services to the socio-economic and those in crisis situations and have no place to turn for help on the Eastern Shore, including Fairhope and South Baldwin County. The services rendered include:

- Emergency Aid Direct assistance for medical, food, utilities, rent, clothing, child care, transportation and other emergency needs.
- Meals on Wheels (MOW'S) Volunteer's deliver nutritious, warm meals six days a week. Meals are subsidized based on need and funding Fairhope area has nine routes.
- Home Repair These projects include plumbing, electrical work, rebuilding floors, installing windows
  and doors, roofing, building wheelchair ramps and more. This program is for the elderly and disabled.
- Food Pantry Our pantries provide a week's supply of food based on the size of the family and their situation.
- Prescription Assistance This program allows under-insured and non-insured persons to receive life sustaining medications at reduced or no cost through pharmaceutical companies indigent care program.
   EMI also provide prescription assistance through the Ozanam Charitable Pharmacy in Mobile.
- Church-based Community Organizing This program empowers poor and moderate income families to
  participate effectively in our democratic system and allow community members the opportunity to
  address the issues affecting their lives: paved streets, lighting, sewage, recreation and drainage.
- EMMY'S Thrift Shop Through our emergency aid center vouchers are given at no cost. With these vouchers, people can receive such items as appliances, furniture, clothing, etc.

WHEREAS, Ecumenical Ministries Incorporated has served Fairhope residents since 1969 on a continuous basis and successfully demonstrated the capacity to operate a neighborhood based on social service agency improving countless lives; and,

WHEREAS, Ecumenical Ministries support for 2012 - 2013 fiscal year will provide for two new programs. The first is a Housing Counseling Agency which offers budget counseling classes, credit repair/building classes, assistance with down payment program applications

etc. The second is a pilot program for the South Alabama Regional Planning Commission, Area Agency on Aging involving a nutritional supplement program for Baldwin County. This program provides ensure to individuals 60 years of age and over who are medically prescribed this liquid supplement and meet the income eligibility for this program.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF FAIRHOPE, FAIRHOPE, ALABAMA, that Mayor Timothy Kant is hereby authorized to establish a contract for services between the City of Fairhope and Ecumenical Ministries Incorporated to appropriate the sum of \$10,000.00 to be used for the needs of Fairhope residents.
