Why does the FAA regulate the use of drones?	A drone is an aircraft and the FAA is mandated to regulate all aircraft to protect persons and property on the ground and to prevent collisions in the air.
I just purchased a drone. What do I need to do first?	ALL drones between .55 pounds and 55 pounds must be registered with the FAA at faa.gov.  Operators of drones used for commercial purposes

	To register you must be 13 years of age or older

Drones can only be flown during daylight hours
fly my drone?

Where can I fly my drone and are there other regulations? Drones cannot be flown within five miles of an airport without prior approval. Locally, the Fairhope Airport Authority must be contacted for authorization to fly by calling 990-5080.

You may have to wait for a call-back.

DRONES CANNOT BE FLOWN:

Drones must be flown within sight of the operator and below 400 feet

Recent FAA penalties have averaged \$400 to \$5,000 but can certainly increase based on the severity of the incident.

Criminal penalties can reach \$250,000 or three years in prison.

Fines and charges may also be pursued for failure to obey regulation or flying in a reckless manner.

Operators are also susceptible to civil lawsuits related to harassment, damage to property or personal injury.

Can local police
enforce FAA
regulations for
drones?

Primarily, the FAA will issue warning notices, issue fines or withdraw flight privileges for offenders.

However, local law enforcement officers have authorization to enforce FAA restrictions.

Also, existing criminal charges can be applied based on the situation.

Failure to register a drone can result in a maximum civil

penalty up to \$27,500 (based on existing FAA requirements
