



Fairhope Walking Tours

April 1 – Fairhope Avenue – Stroll down the center of town and hear the history of the buildings and the many businesses that once occupied them. This tour begins at the Welcome Center.

April 8 – Fairhope Beach & Shoreline – This walk on the eastern shore, once the center of Fairhope's social activities, will reveal the history of the previous eight piers, Casino, hotels, baseball field, walk-in movie theater and more. This tour begins at the Rose Garden at the Fairhope Pier.

April 15 – Section Street – Touring both sides of Section and Magnolia Streets to Greer's and back, we stop along the way and talk about the buildings and their history. Learn how Fairhope developed over the years and about Single Tax in the early times. This tour begins at the Welcome Center.

April 22 – Knoll Park – Put on your best walking shoes as this tour takes you down Magnolia Street in front of many town founders homes and some early hotels, crosses by Knoll Park and back up Fairhope Avenue to the Welcome Center.

April 29 – Fairhope Colony Cemetery – Beginning at the cemetery front gate, a walk along the roads will pass by many interesting graves. Hear some amusing stories of Fairhope's early eccentric citizens and a good explanation of the founder's politics.
