The following questions have been submitted by potential bidders and answers have been provided by the City's Representative, John Saraceno, IEM, and Dan Ames, Purchasing Manager

- Question 1: Is there an existing contract similar to this in place or previously in place? Are the bid tabulations available?
- Answer 1: Yes, on the website (www.fairhopeal.gov) for the City of Fairhope under Purchasing / bids on page 1 of Archived Bids--- Bid No. 020-15 Disaster Debris Removal and Disposal 2015, with one Contract Extension dated July 5, 2016 and ending on July 10, 2017.
- Question 2: Please explain specifically how the pricing of one proposal will be evaluated against the pricing from another proposal, including the answer to these questions:

Will each pricing proposal be analyzed and refined to become one total number which can then be compared to the other proposals, and if so, what is the formula that will be used to derive that total number?

Will extended totals (unit price multiplied by estimated quantity) be used to evaluate pricing? Will all pricing line items be evaluated equally or will some line items receive more importance in the evaluation? If some line items will be evaluated as more important, what is the formula that will be used to weight the importance of each line item?

- Answer 2: Quantities from Hurricane Ivan are used as a standard for comparison. So that potential bidders will give lowest pricing to all line items, various line items will be selected for the evaluation, and used consistently for each bid response. The line items chosen for the last bid evaluation are on the website cited above, on the bid tabulation and recommendation sheet
- Question 3: Request that Copy of State of Alabama Contractor License requirement be removed.
- Answer 3: No. In checking with the Alabama General Contractors' Board, we were advised:

 "If the bid amount exceeds \$50,000.00 bidders shall be licensed in the proper classification prior to bid being submitted. There has been no change in State Law or Rules and Regulations of the Alabama General Contractors Board. There are no exemptions."
- Question 4: Item 8 of the Fee Schedule calls for Grinding or consolidation of C&D debris at the TDSRS.

 Will Compaction of C&D debris qualify as consolidation?
- Answer 4: Please remove Bidding Schedule and replace with Bid Schedule...rev1, and note items in yellow as changes to the schedule. Yes, compaction will qualify as consolidation.

Question 5: Will the City Self-Monitor the project?

Answer 5: Yes

Question 6: Shouldn't No 26 of Bid response form be measured in cubic yards?

Answer 6: Yes. # 26 SHOULD be cubic yards. Please see attached <u>Bidding Schedule...rev1 form</u>, note items highlighted in yellow as changes to the Bidding Schedule.
