Abundant deep layer moisture associated with Harvey will begin to slowly spread into our area, bringing high rain chances to generally the southern portion of our area on Tuesday, with rain likely across the entire area on Wednesday. Locally heavy rains will be possible with the stronger storms Tuesday into Wednesday mainly across much of southeast Mississippi, extreme southwest Alabama and the western Florida panhandle.

We have created a flooding threat graphic for Tuesday which depicts an Elevated Threat Area generally along and south of a line from Mobile, Alabama to Pensacola, Florida where isolated flash flooding cannot be ruled out. A Limited Threat Area exists generally along and south of a line from Waynesboro, Mississippi to Crestview, Florida where predominately nuisance type flooding is possible of low lying and poor drainage areas. A similar flooding threat graphic may become necessary for Wednesday.
