



LETTER FROM THE MAYOR



A year ago I came into office as your mayor with specific goals to achieve on your behalf to preserve and protect Fairhope for our present and for our future while honoring our past. During the past year we have identified ordinances that need updating and are presenting changes to Council for approval. We've applied for and received funding to help study, model and find solutions to our storm water problems. We conducted a long-overdue study of our waste water transmission system and have a clear path forward to solving our near-capacity problems. We are developing programs that include resident input and mandatory premeetings so that we can determine the appropriateness of a development before large amounts of money are spent

and neighborhoods are disrupted. We've hired the best when it comes to expertise in public works, utilities, economic and community development. We've widened our communication efforts using social media to reach out to the community. Our new, more user-friendly website will be completed soon. We're bringing on board an alert system that can advise our whole city, or just specific neighborhoods as necessary, of emergency OR non-emergency events which will keep our citizens safe and better informed. We're ending wasteful spending in several ways: reduced lawsuits; new planning procedures to weed out bad development and poor planning; having engineers on staff instead of having to hire outside services, and more. And we have applied for, and already received some, grants that will help us safe guard our environment and improve our traffic and parking issues. Getting these projects started is a significant step forward in our effort to preserve and protect mission. This is only the beginning.


