2.06 SITE EXAMINATION / CITY PROVISION / NON-RESIDENT STATE RECIPROCITY

The City of Fairhope will not furnish any labor, material or supplies unless specifically stated in the Contract documents. CONTRACTOR must be properly licensed to perform the work as outlined in the Scope of Work. Bidder must have a current business license or purchase a business license with the City of Fairhope prior to or (upon) bid being awarded. Where required by State law, State of Alabama CONTRACTOR'S license is required.

Except for contracts funded in whole or in part by funds received from a federal agency, preference shall be given to resident CONTRACTORS on the same basis as the non-resident bidder's state awards contracts to Alabama CONTRACTORS bidding under similar circumstances. 2.07 BID SECURITY

2.08 PERFORMANCE ASSURANCE AND INSURANCE

The bidder to whom award is made shall provide a Performance Bond equal to 100% (percent) of the Contract amount and a Labor and Materials Bond equal to 100% (percent) of the Contract amount. The accepted Bidder shall also provide insurance as required in section titled ITEM VII INSURANCE.

2.09 DURATION OF OFFER

Bids may be withdrawn by written or telegraphic request received from the bidder prior to the time fixed for opening. No bid shall be withdrawn for a period of THIRTY (30) days subsequent to the opening of bid without the consent of the City Council of the City of Fairhope.

2.10 EQUAL OPPORTUNITY

2.11 BID SUBMISSION AND PREPARATION

Sealed Bids, signed, executed, and dated will be received by the City of Fairhope as noted in section 2.03 above. Submit one copy of the executed offer, on the Bid Form provided, along with the required Bid Security. The bid shall be enclosed in a sealed opaque envelope approximately 9X12 inches or larger, clearly identified on the outside as a SEALED BID with PROJECT NUMBER, PROJECT NAME, OWNER'S NAME AND ADDRESS, BIDDER'S NAME AND ADDRESS, BIDDER'S LICENSE NUMBER. When sent by mail, or courier service, the sealed envelope containing the bid, marked as indicated above, shall be enclosed in another envelope for mailing.

- 2.11.1 Forms furnished, or copies thereof, shall be used, and strict compliance with the requirements of the Invitation, these instructions, and the instructions printed on the forms is necessary. Special care should be exercised in the preparation of bids. Bidders must make their own estimates of the facilities and difficulties attending the performance of the proposed contract, including local conditions, uncertainty of weather, and all other contingencies. All designations and prices shall be fully and clearly set forth. The proper space in the bid and guaranty forms shall be suitable filled in.
- 2.11.2 Fill in all blanks on the Bid Form with non-erasable ink or type. Erasers or other changes must be explained or noted over the signature of the bidder.
- 2.11.3 The Bid Form may have a Contingency Allowance listed. If so, add this amount to the Bid Base to derive the Total Bid. The Contingency Allowance covers unforeseen conditions and shall not be used by the CONTRACTOR without the written authorization of the Owner. At the conclusion of the project, the unused portion of the Contingency Allowance shall revert to the Owner. Note: There is no Contingency Allowance for this bid.
- Each bid must give the full business address of the bidder and must be signed by him with his usual signature. Combination bids, that is, bids on separate projects lumped together as a single bid or on all or none basis, will not be accepted unless the contract document expressly requests or permits same. Alternate bids will not be considered unless requested. Bidders are to provide with their bid, a reference list to include name/address/phone number.
- 2.12 BID INELIGIBILITY

Bids that contain irregularities of any kind may be declared unacceptable at the discretion of the Owner. The Owner may waive any minor irregularities and may reject any or all bids. Bids received after the deadline will be returned to the bidder unopened.

2.13 CONTRACT TIME

The CONTRACTOR agrees to perform the work within the time stated in the Bid Response Form. The bidder in submitting an offer accepts the conditions of the contract period stated for performing the work.

2.14 CONSTRUCTION DOCUMENT IDENTIFICATION

The Construction documents are the Bid Packet, Drawings, Addenda, and all other related documents bearing the Project Title and Number. Bidders shall use complete sets of Construction Documents in preparing their Bids. The City will not assume responsibility for errors or misinterpretation resulting from the use of incomplete sets of Construction Documents.

2.15 INQUIRIES/ADDENDA

2.15.1 All Addenda are part of the Contract Documents. Include resultant costs in the Bid. Addenda will be issued by posting to the City of Fairhope website: www.fairhopeal.gov., and posted on the City's bulletin board at 555 South Section St., Fairhope, AL. It is the responsibility of the bidder to obtain any addenda, and verify that all addenda have been received.

2.16 BID ACCEPTANCE

Bid with lowest Total Bid amount from a responsive and responsible bidder may be accepted if within the contract budget. In the event that alternates are listed on the Bid Form, the lowest combination of Total Bid and Alternate Bids accepted by the owner shall be the accepted bid. Alternates shall be awarded in the order in which they are listed on the Bid Form.

2.17 BIDDERS INTERESTED IN MORE THAN ONE BID

If more than one bid is offered by any one party, by or in a name of his clerk, partner, corporation in which he has a substantial interest, or in which he is an officer, or other person, all such bids may be rejected. A party who has quoted prices on materials to a bid is not thereby disqualified from quoting prices to other bidders or from submitting a bid directly for the materials or work. The City reserves the right to determine in its discretion whether the provisions of this clause have been violated by any bidder.

2.18 ERRORS IN BIDS

Bidders or their authorized agents are expected to examine the maps, drawings, specifications, and all other instructions pertaining to the work, which will be open to their inspection. Failure to do so will be at the bidder's own risk. In case of error, in the extension of prices the unit price will govern.

2.19 CONTRACT AND BOND

The bidder to whom award is made must, when requested, enter into written contract on the standard form as set out herein, with satisfactory security in the amount required, within the period specified, or, if no period be specified, within 15 days after the required forms are presented for signature.

2.20 COLLUSION

If there is any reason for believing that collusion exists among the Bidders, any or all bids may be rejected, and those participating in such collusion may be barred from submitting bids on the same or other work with the City.

2.21 SUBLETTING OR ASSIGNING OF CONTRACT

Limitations: The CONTRACTOR shall not sublet, assign, transfer, convey, sell or otherwise dispose of any portions of the contract, his right, title, or interest therein, or his power to execute

such contact, to any person, firm or corporation without written consent of the City, and such written consent shall not be construed to relieve the CONTRACTOR of any responsibility for the fulfillment of the contract. Unless otherwise stipulated in the proposal or special provisions, the CONTRACTOR shall perform with his own organization, and with the assistance of workmen under his immediate superintendence and reported on his payroll, all contract work of a value not less than 50 percent of the total contract amount, except that any items designated in the contract as "Specialty Items" so performed by sub-contract may be deducted from the total contract amount before computing the amount of work required to be performed by the CONTRACTOR with his own organization.

- 2.21.1 Sub-contractor's Status: A Sub-CONTRACTOR shall be recognized only in the capacity of an employee or agent of the CONTRACTOR and the CONTRACTOR will be responsible to the City for all of the sub-contractor's work, including failures or omissions; and his removal may be required by the Project Manager, as in the case of an employee.
- 2.22 PROSECUTION OF WORK
 The CONTRACTOR shall commence work within 10 days of issuance of the *Notice to Proceed*(NTP), or as otherwise directed in writing.
- 2.22.1 The CONTRACTOR shall prosecute the work continuously and diligently in the order and manner set out in his schedule as approved by the City. He shall provide sufficient satisfactory materials, labor, and equipment, to insure that the work will be completed in a satisfactory manner within the time specified in the contract.
- 2.22.2 Should the CONTRACTOR fail to maintain a satisfactory rate of progress, the City may require that additional forces and/or equipment be placed on the work to bring the project up to schedule and maintain it at that level.
- 2.22.3 Should the Contract fail to furnish sufficient satisfactory equipment and/or labor for maintaining the quality and progress of the work at satisfactory level, the City may withhold all estimates that may become due until satisfactory quality and progress are maintained; or the contract may be annulled.

EXCEPTIONS / CHANGES

1. Compliance with or variations from the specifications must be noted as to each item on the Specification Sheet. This requirement must be met even though the Purchasing Manager may alter the specifications in the form of an addendum to accommodate variances. A request for a change in the specifications to accommodate a variation must be called to the attention of the Purchasing Manager at least 72 hours before the bid opening date. 7.01 <u>All insurance</u> will be provided by insurers by admitted carriers in the State of Alabama, shall have a minimum A.M. Best rating of A-VII and must be acceptable to the City. Self-insured plans and/or group funds not having an A.M. Best rating must be submitted to the City for prior approval.

7.02 NO WORK IS TO BE PERFORMED UNTIL PROOF OF COMPLIANCE WITH THE INSURANCE REQUIREMENTS HAS BEEN RECEIVED BY THE CITY.

ITEM VIII

SCOPE OF WORK AND SPECIFICATIONS for Bid No. 014-18 Travel Lift Cell Repair

The Awarded vendor to provide all necessary supervision, labor, tools, materials and safety equipment to perform the following tasks:

8.0 SCOPE OF WORK: Sawgrass Consulting, LLC (Sawgrass) was retained by the City of Fairhope to provide inspection, reporting, and load rating analysis of the existing Travel Lift Dock Facility located at the Fairhope Docks Property. The safety inspection includes a "hands on" assessment of the docks substructure (pile and caps), superstructure (beams), approach slab, and other accessory components of the structure. The inspection also included an underwater review of the wood piling from the waterline to the mudline. AU work was done in accordance National Bridge Inspection Standards for In Service Bridges (NBIS).

8.01 GENERAL DESCRIPTION:

8.01.1 STRUCTURE INVENTORY

The dock consists of two (2) finger piers comprised of Steel Open Box Beams, Timber Caps and Piling (two pile supports), Aluminum Sheet Pile Bulkhead and Concrete Approach Slab. See Inventory Sketch.

8.01.2 Inventory includes:

Steel Box Beam-214 LF (4 EA)

Timber Bent Caps (8"x8"x60")-24 EA

Timber Piling w/Cross Bracing (12" Diameter)-48 EA

Concrete Approach/Apron (assumed 8" Thick)- 1102 SF Aluminum Sheet Pile Bulkhead-45.5 LF

8.02.1 DEFICIENCIES-Superstructure

The steel box beams (A-D) are in the moderate to advanced stages of deterioration. Sawgrass found section loss in both the top and bottom flanges of the beams; ranging from 50% to critical loss of section in isolated areas.

8.02.2 Finger Pier No.1

Top -There is up to 50% section loss in the top plate of the box beam for approximately 11FT; beginning at southern end or at Bent No. (See Photo 1);

The outside edges of the top plate have moderate to advanced deterioration; up to S0% section loss (typical)

Web-there is moderate deterioration in the faces of the vertical web sections though-out;

Bottom-The bottom flanges of both beams have moderate to advanced deterioration; up 50%- 60% (1/4") section loss (typical) to knife edge on the thickness (See Photo 2);up to 1" on the width (See Photo 3);-The eastern most or inside bottom flange on Beam B has no bearing on the Bent Caps (See Photo 4)

The steel cross braces are in advanced deterioration and/or missing throughout and have no structural value (See Photo 5)

8. 02.3 Finger Pier No.2

Top-There is a critical loss of section in the top plate of both beams and has penetrations in Beam D for approximately 7 LF beginning at Bent No.1; this section is unsafe for loading and requires closure and is in need of repair (See Photo 6);

There is up to 50% section loss in the top plates of the beams for approximately 24FT; beginning at southern end or Bent No. 1(See Photo 6);

The outside edges of the top plates have moderate to advanced deterioration; up to 50% section loss (typical);

Web- there is moderate deterioration in the vertical web plates of the beam section though-out;

Bottom-The bottom flanges of both beams have moderate to advanced deterioration; up 50%-60% (1/4") section loss (typical) to knife edge on the thickness; up to 1" on the width;

The steel cross braces are in advanced deterioration and/or missing throughout and have no structural value

8.03. DEFICIENCES-Sub-structure

The timber Bent Caps and Piling are sound with minor soft sections within the wet dry zone; however, the steel bent cap that was accessible at Bent No. 8 for Finger Piers No. 1 and 2 has critical section loss and has failed.

8.03.1 Bent Caps-Timber

Bent Cap No 1 on Finger Pier No 2 is missing; creating a cantilever section; *this section is unsafe for loading and requires closure and is in need of repair* (See Photo 7);

8.03.2 Bent Caps - Steel

Bent Cap No 8- for both Finger Piers (Beams A-D) was accessible and has advanced to **critical section loss** (See Photo 8); the remaining Bents 9-12 are not fully accessible due to the concrete apron, but are assumed to be pile support and integrated into the concrete slab.

8.03.3 Piling-Timber

No Deficiencies

Note; the timber cross bracing has moderate to advanced decay and has disconnected from the piling at multiple locations.

8.04 DEFICIENCIES-Approach Slab

The concrete apron section is undermined an average of 3 FT Deep; with up to 4 FT in or under the East and NE sides of Finger Pier No.2 (See Inventory/Deficiency Sketch and Photos 9 and 10). Based on the photos, it appears the slab is similar to a relief platform with some pile support; however, the slab section and steel reinforcement is unknown for rating.

- 8.04.1 There are major cracks (Class 5) migrating at 45 degree orientation from the anchor sections of Beams B and C (See Inventory/Deficiency Sketch and Photo 11)
- 8.04.2 There is minor to moderate cracking at 45 degree orientation on the east and west aisle sections of the concrete, random spacing (See Inventory/Deficiency Sketch)
- 8.04.3 Although the West Side is not accessible for a visible inspection, Sawgrass assumes that the West and NW sides of the Finger Pier No. 1 under the slab section are in the same condition.

8.05 DEFICIENCIES- Bulkhead

There are several puncture and penetrations randomly located throughout the perimeter of the wall-1 FT below the mean water line (See Photo 12)

8.06 **DEFICIENCIES- Appurtenances**

The Double Timber Fender System attached on the inside face of Finger Pier Nos 1 and 2 are in advance decay at the connection points and have loosed or failed throughout (See Photo 13 and 14)

8.07 LOAD RATING ANALYSIS

Sawgrass identified Span No.8 as the controlling or critical span to be analyzed. This support beam was analyzed based on 50% reduction in section modulus which was determined from field observation at the time of inspection. No field demolition of corroded parts was performed to specifically determine the amount of section loss. Nor was demolition performed at connections (rivets/welds/bolts} to analyze the connection integrity. No analysis was performed to determine the rate at which the beam and other components are deteriorating. The beam analysis was based on the maximum load of the Travel lift that is used onsite to lift and transport vessel is rated with a 24 Ton Capacity. (see Load Rating)

RECOMMENDATIONS

Priority Repairs-Immediate Action

Replace Bent Cap No. 1 for Beams C and D (Finger Pier No 2)

Replace or Supplement Bent Cap No.8 on both Finger Pier Nos. **1** and 2 (Beams A-D) Sandblast to new profile, clean and weld supplemental plates on the top plate of Beams A-D at the end of the Pier Sections from Bent No. 1 to Bent No. 8; secure ends from public access until penetrations are fixed

Schedule Repairs

Sandblast to new profile, clean, and weld supplemental plating on the web and flange sections of Beams A-D where losses of section are significant

Weld new sway bracing or blocking between Beams A-D

Core concrete slab section to determine is design load and capacity; investigate voids

Backfill known voids under slab

Repair penetrations or reskin the face of the bulkhead

Fix all fenders systems and add navigation lighting

Long Term Repairs

It is our opinion that this structure has exceeded its effective life due to the natural deterioration in a marine environment as shown by evidence of advanced stages of corrosion on all steel elements of the structure. The recommendations for repairs in critical sections will extend its life for short term use, but the remaining sections will continue to deteriorate and fail overtime. Depending on the City's intentions for this property, we recommend the City of Fairhope begin budgeting for Removal and Replacement of this structure under their Long Term Capital Plan.

CONCLUSION

The results of the pier inspection show that the condition of the pier is in "Poor" Condition. Immediate action is required as listed in the recommendations section of this report. Although the Load Rating calculations prove the finger piers have the capacity to support existing Travel Lift Equipment (24 Ton), we feel that is not a reflection of the overall condition of the superstructure. The favorable rating is due to short span lengths and original overdesigned steel beam section(s). Further investigation is recommended for the slab section, specifically if the City of Fairhope is considering a Fork Lift Operation as an alternate use of operation.

GENERAL SPECIFICATIONS

- 8.03 CONTRACTOR shall furnish all necessary supervision, labor, equipment, tools, and transportation, and other necessary resources for painting the roof.
- 8.04 The normal workweek shall consist of forty (40) productive hours between 7:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m. Monday through Friday unless authorized by the City of Fairhope to do otherwise. Time lost due to inclement weather may be made up by working extended workdays and /or by working on Saturdays with the approval of the City of Fairhope designated representative.
- 8.05 CONTRACTOR shall handle such material in a manner consistent with all applicable laws and regulations, and shall take care to avoid obstructing roads, sidewalks, and lawns. CONTRACTOR shall be responsible for all parts of the work area and the removal of all debris and surplus material, so as to leave the area in as good a condition as when the work commenced. Material can be disposed of at no charge to the CONTRACTOR.
- 8.06 CONTRACTOR shall designate one (1) person to be the main point of contact for all public relations with the general public and shall keep all pertinent information to include the phone number of the Fairhope Water Department designated representative, information about the particular day's service request, and other relevant information as required.
- 8.07 CONTRACTOR shall provide the crew with a cell phone for communications.
- 8.08 CONTRACTOR shall make every effort to create and build goodwill and healthy public relations for the City of Fairhope and the Fairhope Volunteer Fire Department.

8.09 All salvageable material remains property of the City of Fairhope, and to be delivered by **CONTRACTOR** to the City of Fairhope Warehouse, 555 South Section Street, Fairhope, Al.

8.10 SPECIAL CONDITIONS

8.10.1 EXCEPTIONS TO SPECIFICATIONS:

These specifications are based upon design and performance criteria which have been developed by the City of Fairhope as a result of extensive research and careful analysis of the data. Subsequently, these specifications reflect the only type of equipment, material(s) or supplies that is/are acceptable at this time. Therefore, exceptions may be accepted if they are minor, equal, or superior to that which is specified, and provided they are listed and fully explained on a separate page entitled, "Exceptions to Specifications". The CITY shall determine which (if any) exceptions are acceptable and this determination shall be final.

8.10.2 All maintenance of equipment is to be the responsibility of bidder and all equipment is to be provided by company awarded bid. The City <u>will not</u> be responsible for upkeep, parts, replacement, and liability of equipment or contract employees.

END OF SCOPE OF WORK

ITEM IX

STANDARD TERMS AND CONDITIONS CITY OF FAIRHOPE

1. ACCEPTANCE OF AGREEMENT

This Agreement contains all terms and conditions agreed upon by the Owner and Winning bidder. No other agreement, oral or otherwise, regarding the subject matter of this Agreement shall be deemed to exist or to bind either party hereto. The Winning Bidder shall not employ SUBCONTRACTORS without the express written permission of the Owner. No waiver, alteration, consent or modification of any of the provisions of the Agreement shall be binding unless in writing and signed by the Owner and CONTRACTOR. This Agreement shall not be construed against the party or parties preparing it. It shall be construed as if all the parties and each of them jointly prepared this Agreement, and any uncertainty or ambiguity shall not be interpreted against one or more parties.

2. ACCEPTANCE OF WORK

The City of Fairhope will be deemed to have accepted the Work after the City of Fairhope agrees the Work is completed by signature on delivery or service tickets. In the event Work furnished under the Contract / Agreement / Purchase Order is found to be defective or does not conform to the intent of the Contract / Agreement / Purchase Order, the awarded vendor shall, after receipt of notice from the City of Fairhope, correct the deficiencies. Failure on the part of the awarded vendor to properly correct the deficiencies within the time period allowed will constitute the City of Fairhope's right to cancel the Contract / Agreement / Purchase Order immediately, upon written notice to the awarded vendor.

3. ADDENDA

All Addenda are part of the Contract Documents. Include resultant costs in the Bid. Addenda will be issued by email to all Bidders on record, and posted to the City of Fairhope website www.fairhopeal.gov. It is the responsibility of the bidder to verify that all addenda have been received, and to include all signed addenda in the bid submission

4. ADDITIONAL ORDERS

Unless it is specifically stated to the contrary in the bid response, the City of Fairhope reserves the option to place additional orders against a contract awarded as a result of this solicitation at the same terms and conditions; to extend the renewal date until a new bid is in place, if it is mutually agreeable.

5. APPLICABLE LAW

This Agreement is deemed to be under and shall be governed by and construed according to the laws of the State of Alabama. Any litigation arising out of the Agreement shall be heard in the Courts of Baldwin County, Alabama.

6. ASSIGNMENT

The awarded vendor shall not assign the Contract / Agreement / Purchase Order or sublet it as a whole without the express written permission of the City of Fairhope. The awarded vendor shall not assign any payment due them hereunder, without the express

written permission of City of Fairhope. The City of Fairhope may assign the Contract / Agreement / Purchase Order, or sublet it as a whole, without the consent of the awarded vendor.

7. ASSURANCE OF NON-CONVICTION OF BRIBERY

The bidder hereby declares and affirms that, to its best knowledge, none of its officers, directors, or partners and none of its employees directly involved in obtaining contracts has been convicted of bribery, attempted bribery or conspiracy to bribe under the laws of any state or Federal government.

8. AWARD CONSIDERATION

The following factors will be considered in determining the lowest responsible bidder: Overall quality, Conformity with specifications both general and specific, Purposes for which materials or services are required, Delivery dates and time required for delivery, Unit acquisition cost, financial ability to meet the contract, previous performance, facilities and equipment, availability of repair parts, experience, delivery promise, terms of payments, compatibility as required, other costs, and other objective and accountable factors which are reasonable.

9. AWARD OR REJECTION OF BIDS

The Bid will be awarded to the lowest responsible bidder complying with conditions of the invitation for bids, provided his bid is reasonable and it is in the interest of the City of Fairhope to accept it. The bidder to whom the award is made will be notified at the earliest possible date. The City of Fairhope, however, reserves the right to reject any and all bids and to waiver any informality in bids received whenever such rejection or waiver is in the interest to the City of Fairhope.

10. BACK ORDERS

If it is necessary to back order any items, the vendor must notify the Purchasing Department and advice as to the expected shipping or delivery date. If this date is not acceptable, the City of Fairhope may seek remedies for default.

11. BID AND PERFORMANCE SECURITY

If bid security is required, a bid bond or cashier's check in the amount indicated on the bid cover must accompany the bid and be made payable to The City of Fairhope of Baldwin County, Al. Corporate or certified checks are not acceptable. Bonds must be in a form satisfactory to the City and underwritten by a company licensed to issue bonds in the State of Alabama. If bid security fails to accompany the bid, it shall be deemed unresponsive, unless the Purchasing Manager deems the failure to be non-substantial. All checks will be returned to the bidders after the contract has been approved. If a performance bond is required, the successful bidder will be notified after the awarding of the contract.

12. BRAND NAMES

Reference to brand names and numbers is descriptive, but not restrictive, unless otherwise specified. Bids on equivalent items

meeting the standards of quality thereby indicated will be considered, providing the bid clearly describes the article offered and indicates how it differs from the referenced brands. Descriptive literature or manufacturers specifications plus any supplemental information necessary for comparison purposes should be submitted with the bid or the bid on that item may be rejected. Reference to literature submitted with a previous bid or on file with the Division of Purchasing will not satisfy this requirement. The burden is on the bidder to demonstrate that the item bid is equivalent to the item specified in the ITB. Bids without sufficient documentation to fully support equality, may be considered nonresponsive. Reference by the City of Fairhope in the ITB to available existing specifications shall be sufficient to make the terms of such specifications binding on the bidder. Unless the bidder specifies otherwise in its bid, it is understood the bidder is offering a referenced brand item as specified in the ITB or is bidding as specified when no brand is referenced. Failure to examine drawings, specifications and instructions will be at the bidder's risk.

13. BUSINESS LICENSE

- b) Appropriate hazard warnings, and manufacturer, importer, or other responsible party.

20. EQUIPMENT DEMONSTRATION

The City of Fairhope may require equipment/ product materials or service techniques to be demonstrated at a time, date and location to be specified by the City of Fairhope.

21. EQUIPMENT ELECTRICAL CERTIFICATION

All electrical equipment purchased shall conform to, and be identified in, the applicable standard(s), or otherwise be certified as applicable, as of the bid opening date and time, by Underwriters Laboratories, Inc. or other recognized laboratory facility. Bidder must provide satisfactory documentation with returned bid that all such equipment meets the applicable product standard or has otherwise been certified as outlined above. Unless indicated in the bid document, the above certification shall apply to the equipment itself, not the individual components of that equipment.

22. ERRORS IN BID

Bidders are assumed to be informed regarding conditions, requirements and specifications prior to submitting bids.

Failure to do so will be at the bidder's risk. Bids already submitted may be withdrawn without penalty prior to bid opening. Errors discovered after the bid opening may not be corrected.

23. FORCE MAJEURE

Neither the City nor the awarded vendor shall be deemed in breach of any contract / Purchase Order or Agreement which may result from this proposal submission if it is prevented from performing any of the obligations hereunder by reason of Acts of God, acts of the public enemy, acts of superior governmental authority, strikes or labor disputes, floods, riots, rebellion, sabotage, or any similar other unforeseeable causes beyond its control and not due to its fault or negligence. Each party shall notify the other immediately in writing of the cause of such after the beginning period thereof. The awarded vendor may request cancellation and the City of Fairhope may grant the request if performance is prevented by any of the above referenced causes, or other unavoidable circumstances not attributable to the fault or negligence of the vendor. The burden of proof for such relief rests with the vendor. All correspondence pertaining to cancellation of a purchase order or term contract must be addressed to the City of Fairhope Purchasing Manager.

24. HAZARDOUS AND TOXIC SUBSTANCES

Bidder must comply with all applicable Federal, State, County and City laws, ordinances and regulations relating to hazardous and toxic substances, including such laws, ordinances and regulations pertaining to information hazardous and toxic substances, and as amended from time to time. Bidder shall provide the City of Fairhope with a "Material Safety Data Sheet" for all goods that carry one.

25. INDEMNITY

Indemnity: The awarded vendor hereby agrees to indemnify and save harmless the City of Fairhope, its officers, agent, and employees, from and against any and all liabilities, claims, demands, damages, fines, fees, expenses, penalties, suits, proceedings, actions and cost of actions, including reasonable attorney's fees for trial and on appeal, of any kind and nature, arising or growing out of, or in any way connected with the performance of this Contract / Agreement / Purchase Order, to the extent caused by a negligent act or omission of the awarded vendor, their agents, servants, employees, SUBCONTRACTORS or others associated with the awarded vendor. The awarded vendor shall be responsible for damage to any equipment excluded from this agreement, or damage or injury caused by any equipment excluded from this agreement, only to the extent that the damage or injury is caused by a negligent act or omission of the awarded vendor, or caused by failure of the awarded vendor's supplied product to perform as specified.

26. INSPECTION

All materials, workmanship, equipment, and supplies are subject to inspection and test at any source or time. Final inspection, acceptance or rejection will be made at delivery destination. Goods that do not meet specifications will be rejected unless substitutions have been approved by the City of Fairhope. Failure to inspect or

to reject upon receipt, however, does not relieve the awarded vendor of liability. When subsequent tests, after receipt, are conducted and when such tests reveal a failure to meet specifications, the City of Fairhope will reject the goods and the awarded vendor shall immediately supply goods meeting specifications or the City of Fairhope may seek damages including but not limited to the testing expense, regardless of whether a part of or all of the goods have been consumed through the testing process. Rejected goods shall be removed by the awarded vendor promptly after rejection, at his expense. If not removed in fourteen (14) calendar days, they may be disposed of at the discretion of the City of Fairhope. Disposal costs will be the awarded vendor's responsibility.

27. INSPECTION OF PREMISES

At reasonable times, the City may inspect those areas of the awarded vendor's place of business that are related to the performance of a Contract / Agreement / Purchase Order. If the City makes such an inspection, the awarded vendor must provide reasonable assistance. The City of Fairhope reserves the right on demand and without notice all the vendor's files associated with a subsequent Contract / Agreement / Purchase Order where payments are based on the awarded vendor's record of time, salaries, materials, or actual expenses. This same clause will apply to any SUBCONTRACTORS assigned to the Contract / Agreement / Purchase Order.

28. INSURANCE

If a Contract / Agreement / Purchase Order results from this RFQ /ITB /RFP, or other form of solicitation, the awarded vendor shall maintain such insurance as will indemnify and hold harmless the City of Fairhope from Workmen's Compensation and Public Liability claims from property damage and personal injury, including death, which may arise from the awarded vendor's operations under this Contract / Agreement / Purchase Order, or by anyone directly or indirectly employed by him/her.

29. INVITATION TO BID

Any provisions made in the RFQ / ITB / RFP, or other form of solicitation, supersedes any provisions outlined here in the General Terms and Conditions.

30. INVOICING, DELIVERY, PACKAGING

Invoices shall be prepared only after ordered materials have been delivered. All invoices must show the purchase order number. Unless otherwise specified in writing, vendors shall not ship any material without an authorized Purchase Order from the City of Fairhope Purchasing Department. All packages delivered must show the purchase order number. The awarded vendor will be required to furnish all materials, equipment and/or service called for at the bid price quoted. In the event the awarded vendor fails to deliver within a reasonable period of time, as determined by the City of Fairhope, the right is reserved to cancel the award and subsequent purchase order and purchase from the next lowest responsible bidder the items needed. The original awarded vendor will be back charged the difference between the original contract price and the price the City of Fairhope has to pay as a result of the failure to perform by the original awarded vendor. All bids will remain firm for acceptance for 60 days from the date of bid opening. Prices shall be net F.O.B., Prepaid and Allow, City of

Fairhope chosen site, Baldwin County, Al. The title and risk of loss of the goods will not pass to the City of Fairhope until receipt and acceptance takes place at the F.O.B. point.

31. LABELING

Individual shipping cartons shall be labeled with the name "City of Fairhope", Purchase Order Number, and where applicable, Contract Number, date of manufacture, batch number, storage requirements, conditions, and recommended shelf life. Bidders are encouraged to offer product packaging with recycled content.

30. LOSS OR DAMAGE IN TRANSIT

Delivery by a vendor to a common carrier does not constitute delivery to the City of Fairhope. Any claim for loss or damage incurred during delivery shall be between the vendor and the carrier. The City of Fairhope accepts title only after satisfactory receipt at the delivery point. The City of Fairhope shall note all visible damages on the freight bill and may refuse the damaged goods. The vendor shall make immediate replacement of the damaged merchandise or be subject to damages for breach of contract. If damage is to a small portion of a total shipment and the City of Fairhope will not be inconvenienced because of the shortage, the vendor may be permitted by the Purchasing Manager to deduct the amount of damage or loss from its invoice, in lieu of replacement. Risk of loss during delivery is borne by the vendor until the goods have been accepted by the City of Fairhope, unless otherwise specified in the RFQ / ITB / RFP or other form of solicitation.

31. MANDATORY SITE VISIT

If the RFQ / ITB /RFP or other form of solicitation requires a mandatory site visit, bidders must inspect the site where installation or service is to take place to obtain a full understanding of scope of work outlined therein. Date of site visit will be determined by the City of Fairhope.

32. MONITORING OF SERVICES

Performance of services will be monitored by the requisitioning department and/or the Purchasing Department, and evaluation reports may be filed with the Purchasing Department. Performance not meeting specifications will result in cancellation of Contract / Agreement / Purchase Order and may result in vendor being removed from the vendor list.

33. NONCONFORMING MERCHANDISE

When merchandise received from the lowest responsible bidder is not in accordance with the purchase order, it will be returned to the bidder, at bidder's expense.

34. NON-DESCRIMINATION

The City of Fairhope is an Equal Opportunity Employer and requires that all CONTRACTORS comply with the Equal Employment Opportunity laws and the provisions of the Contract / Agreement / Purchase Order documents in this regard. The City also encourages and supports the utilization of Minority Business Enterprises on this and all public bids.

35. NON-EXCLUSIVE

Unless otherwise specified, this Contract / Agreement / Purchase Order is considered a non-exclusive Contract / Agreement / Purchase Order between the parties.

36. NOTIFICATION AND ACCIDENT REPORTS

In the event of accidents of any kind, in the performance of a Contract / Agreement / Purchase Order, the awarded vendor shall notify the City of Fairhope immediately and furnish, without delay, copies of all such accident reports to the City of Fairhope. If in the performance of their Work, the awarded vendor fails to immediately report an accident to the City of Fairhope, of which the awarded vendor has knowledge of and which results in a fine levied against the City of Fairhope then the awarded vendor shall be responsible for all fines levied against the City of Fairhope.

37. PACKAGING

All goods must be packaged in new packing containers. Packing that meets the requirements of common carriers is acceptable, unless otherwise required. A packing slip or invoice must accompany all shipments and must reference the purchase order number.

38. PAYMENT

Invoices -- Upon completion of service and delivery of materials specified in the applicable purchase order, awarded vendor will submit an invoice and signed delivery ticket to:

39. PAYMENT WITHHELD

Payment may be withheld until all items have been delivered and all requirements of the Contract / Agreement / Purchase Order have been fulfilled.

40. RECEIPT BY CITY OF FAIRHOPE

If not otherwise stated in the order, the City of Fairhope will be said to have received goods when they have been delivered, unloaded and placed on the agency's dock or if there is no dock, inside an accessible building, and signed for by an authorized City employee. Shipments will be checked against the receiving copy of the Purchase Order. If the purchase order requires grading certificates, USDA Stamps, or any proof of quality, such proof must accompany the shipment.

41. SET-UP AND INSTALLATION

Unless otherwise specified, bid / quotation to include cost of all uncrating, disposal of shipping materials, set-up, testing and initial instruction to agency personnel.

42. SPILL CLEAN UP

The awarded vendor shall be responsible for spillage

patent claims arising from the purchase of goods or services.

45. PACKAGING

Unless otherwise specified, goods are to be packaged in cartons meeting federal specifications and shipped on non-returnable pallets.

46. PERMITS LICENSES AND CERTIFICATES

The awarded vendor is to procure all permits, licenses, and certificates, or any approvals of plans or specifications as may be required by Federal, State, Local Laws, ordinances, rules, and regulations, for the proper execution and completion of Work covered under the Contract / Agreement / Purchase Order.

47. PREPARATION OF BID

All bids / proposals shall be typewritten or in ink on the form(s) prepared by the City of Fairhope. Bids / proposals prepared in pencil will not be accepted. All bids / proposals must be signed by officials of the corporation or company duly authorized to sign bids / proposals. Any bid / proposal submitted without being signed will automatically be rejected. If there are discrepancies between unit prices quoted and extensions, the unit price will prevail.

48. QUESTIONS / CONTACT

Commencing with the issuance of the RFQ / ITB / RFP, or other form of solicitation, no vendor or anyone acting on **a vendor's** behalf, shall make direct or indirect contact with City personnel or undertake any activities or take any action to otherwise promote its quotation / bid / proposal to the City or its personnel. All communications shall be made to the contact identified in the quotation / bid / proposal documents. Violation of this requirement may, at the City's sole and absolute discretion, be grounds for disqualifying a vendor from further consideration.

49. REJECTION OF BIDS

The City of Fairhope reserves the right to accept or reject any or all bids in whole or in part for any reason, to waive technicalities or informalities, or to advertise for new proposals, if, in the judgment of the awarding authority, the best interest of the City of Fairhope will be promoted thereby. Bidders may be disgualified and

rejection of proposals may be recommended for any of (but not limited to) the following causes: Failure to use the bid forms furnished by the City of Fairhope, Lack of signature by an authorized representative on the bid form, Failure to properly complete the bid form and vendor compliance, Evidence of collusion among bidders, Unauthorized alteration of the bid form.

50. RIGHT TO AUDIT

The awarded vendor shall maintain documentation of all work performed. The awarded vendor shall make any and all documentation available to the City of Fairhope at all reasonable times, for inspections and audit by the City of Fairhope, during the entire term of the Contract / Agreement / Purchase Order and for a period of Three (3) years after the expiration of the Contract / Agreement / Purchase Order.

51. SAMPLES

52. SAFETY MEASURES

54. TABULATION

55. TAXES

Prices quoted shall be delivered prices, exclusive of all federal or state excise, sales, **and manufacturer's taxes**. **The City will** assume no transportation or handling charges other than specified in the RFQ, ITB, RFP or other form of solicitation. The City is tax exempt by law – Code of Alabama 1975.

56. TERMINATION FOR CONVENIENCE

Any Contract / Agreement / Purchase Order may be terminated for convenience by the City of Fairhope, in whole or in part, by written notification to the awarded vendor.

57. TERMINATION FOR DEFAULT

Performance of Work under the Contract / Agreement / Purchase Order Agreement may be terminated by the City of Fairhope, in whole or in part, in writing, whenever the City of Fairhope determines that the awarded vendor has failed to meet the requirements of the Contract / Agreement / Purchase Order.

58. TERMINATION FOR NON-APPROPRIATION

Termination for Non-appropriation — The continuation of any financial obligation beyond the current fiscal year is subject to and contingent upon sufficient funds being appropriated, budgeted, and otherwise made available by the local source, State Legislature and/or federal sources. The City of Fairhope may terminate any financial obligation, and awarded vendor waives any and all claim(s) for damages, effective immediately upon receipt of written notice (or any date specified therein) if for any reason the City of Fairhope's funding from local, State and/or federal sources is not appropriated, withdrawn or limited.

59. TIME IS OF THE ESSENCE

The City of Fairhope and awarded vendor agree that time is of the essence in the performance of work called for under this Contract / Agreement / Purchase Order. The awarded vendor agrees that all work will be accomplished regularly, diligently and uninterrupted at such a rate of progress as will ensure full completion thereof within reasonable time periods.

60. TITLE

All titles, fees, as well as other charges, are to be paid by awarded vendor. Awarded vendor is to furnish prepaid certificate of title in the name of the City of Fairhope, Title shall change upon acceptance of delivery at the City of Fairhope approved delivery location.

61. VENDOR LIST

A vendor may be removed from the City of Fairhope's Bidders List if a vendor fails to respond to three (3) consecutive ITB's. A properly submitted "No Bid" is considered as a response and the vendor will receive credit for the response.

62. WARRANTY

The awarded vendor further warrants all items for a period of one year, unless otherwise stated, from the date of acceptance of the items delivered and installed or work completed. Awarded vendor will provide written warranty for all parts and labor for a period of (1) one year commencing from date of written acceptance of delivery by City of Fairhope. Those warranties, if any, will be in addition to the awarded vendor's warranty, and the terms of which will not be altered by the awarded vendor's warranty.

63. IMMIGRATION LAW

The **OWNER** and the **CONTRACTOR** agree as set forth below:

- 1. The Contract consists of all of the items contained within this Contract, the Bid package, Bid, Scope of Work, Specifications and if any drawings, Addenda, Amendments, and "City of Fairhope Standard Terms and Conditions", which are attached hereto and made a part hereof, as if fully contained herein; for the performance of all work and the furnishing of all labor and materials required for completion of the **WORK**.
- 2. The **CONTRACTOR** shall perform all the **WORK** described herein.

3. Term of Agreement

The WORK to be performed under this CONTRACT shall commence upon execution of this CONTRACT and within TEN (10) days of the <u>date specified in</u> the *Notice to Proceed* (NIP) to be issued to the CONTRACTOR by the OWNER. This date will be determined AFTER the mandatory EPA water testing scheduled for this well, which may be as late as April 30, 2018. The work shall be completed, subject to authorized adjustments, within Forty-Five <u>(45) calendar days</u> from and after the commencement date stipulated in said *Notice to Proceed*. Liquidated damages for non-completion of the work within this time limit will be assessed at the rate of \$200 per working day.

4. Compensation

The **OWNER** shall pay the **CONTRACTOR** in current funds for the performance of the **WORK**, the **CONTRACT SUM** of:

Line Items are based on attached Bid Response Form, and "Scope of Work and Specifications". This represents a LUMP SUM payment for performance of each Bid Item of the WORK, which each payment may be issued in Monthly estimates, if all items are not completed before a monthly payment schedule is submitted after, and only after, each item is fully performed and the OWNER has inspected the WORK. The scope of work appearing in the bid specifications are prepared from the report, copy attached to the Bid Form and Request for Proposals. Payment to the CONTRACTOR will be made only for the actual quantities of work performed and accepted, or materials furnished, in accordance with the contract. The estimated quantities or work to be done and materials to be furnished may each be increased, decreased, or omitted as provided herein.

5. Payment Withheld

The Owner may withhold approval for payment on any request and the Owner may withhold payment to such extent as may be necessary to protect the Owner from loss on account of:

- a. Negligence on the part of the CONTRACTOR to execute the work properly or fail to perform any provision of this Agreement.
- b. The Owner, after three (3) days written notice to the CONTRACTOR, may without prejudice to any other remedy, make good such deficiencies and may deduct the cost thereof from the overall Contract sum.
- c. Claims filed or reasonable evidence indicating probable filing of claims.

- Failure of the CONTRACTOR to make payments properly to SUB-CONTRACTORs for material or labor.
- e. A reasonable doubt that the Agreement can be completed for the balance then unpaid.
- f. Damage to the property, or another CONTRACTOR or another CONTRACTOR'S work.

When the above grounds are removed, payment shall be made for the amount withheld because of them. The CONTRACTOR waives all cancellation rights under the agreement, if payment is withheld for one or more of the above reasons.

6. General Conditions

- a. Indemnity: The CONTRACTOR hereby agrees to indemnify and save harmless the Owner, its officers, agent, and employees, from and against any and all liabilities, claims, demands, damages, fines, fees, expenses, penalties, suits, proceedings, actions and cost of actions, including reasonable attorneys' fees for trial and on appeal, of any kind and nature, arising or growing out of, or in any way connected with the performance of this Contract, to the extent caused by a negligent act or omission of the CONTRACTOR, their agents, servants, employees, SUB-CONTRACTORs, or others associated with the CONTRACTOR. The CONTRACTOR shall be responsible for damage to any elevator equipment excluded from this agreement, or damage or injury caused by any equipment excluded from this agreement, to the extent that the damage or injury is caused by a negligent act or omission of the CONTRACTOR.
- b. Notification and Accident Reports: Written Notice shall be deemed to have been duly served if delivered in person to the individual or member of the firm or entity or to an officer of the corporation for whom it was intended, or if delivered at or sent by registered or certified mail to the last business address known to the party serving the notice. In the event of accidents of any kind, the CONTRACTOR shall notify the Owner immediately and furnish, without delay, copies of all such accident reports to the Owner. If in the performance of their Work, the CONTRACTOR fails to immediately report an accident to the Owner, of which the CONTRACTOR has knowledge of and which results in a fine levied against the Owner then the CONTRACTOR shall be responsible for all fines levied against the Owner.

7. **Termination of Agreement**

- a. **Termination for Default:** Performance of Work under this Agreement may be terminated by the Owner, in whole or in part, in writing, whenever the Owner determines that the CONTRACTOR has failed to meet the requirements of this Agreement.
- **b. Termination for Convenience:** The Owner has the absolute right to terminate the Agreement upon "Award of Contract" to another CONTRACTOR, to perform work referenced herein. In such event, payment of the monthly Contract fee shall cease on the date of cancellation of the Contract by the Owner.

8. Warranty

- a. The CONTRACTOR warrants that the Work including equipment and materials provided shall conform to professional standards of care and practice in effect at the time the Work is performed, be of the highest quality, and be free from all faults, defects or errors. If the CONTRACTOR is notified in writing of a fault, deficiency or error in the Work, the CONTRACTOR shall at the Owner's option, either re-perform such portions of the Work to correct such fault, defect or error, at no additional cost to the Owner, or refund to the Owner the charge paid by the Owner, which is attributable to such portions of the faulty, defective or erroneous Work, including costs for re-performance of Work provided by other CONTRACTORS.
- b. All equipment and materials provided by the CONTRACTOR shall be merchantable and for the purpose intended and meet the all industry quality standards.

9. Time of Completion

The Owner and CONTRACTOR understand and agree that time is of the essence in the performance of this Agreement. The CONTRACTOR or Owner, respectively, shall not be liable for any loss or damage, resulting from any delay or failure to perform its contractual obligations within the time specified, due to acts of God, actions or regulations by any governmental entity or representative, strikes, fire, water damage, loss of power, loss of funding or any other causes, contingencies, or circumstances not subject to the Owner or CONTRACTOR'S control, respectively, whether of a similar or dissimilar nature, which prevent or hinder the performance of the Owner's or CONTRACTOR'S contractual obligations, respectively. Any such causes of delay, even though existing on the date of the Contract, or on the day of the start of Work, shall extend the time of the Owner's or CONTRACTOR'S performance respectively, by the length of the delays occasioned thereby, including delays reasonably incident to the resumption of normal Work schedules.

However, under such circumstances as described herein, the Owner may, at their discretion, cancel this Contract for their own convenience.

10. Acceptance of Work

The Owner will be deemed to have accepted the Work after the Owner agrees the Work is completed. In the event Work furnished under the Contract is found to be defective or does not conform to the intent of the Contract, the CONTRACTOR shall, within ten (10) days from receipt of notice from the Owner, correct the deficiencies. Failure on the part of the CONTRACTOR to properly correct the deficiencies within the time period allowed will constitute the Owner's right to cancel the Contract immediately, upon written notice to the CONTRACTOR.

11. Correction of Work

The CONTRACTOR shall promptly correct all Work rejected by the Owner as faulty, defective or failing to conform to the Contract, whether observed before or after completion of the Work. The CONTRACTOR shall bear all costs of correcting such rejected Work.

12. Right to Audit

The CONTRACTOR shall maintain documentation of all work performed. The CONTRACTOR shall make any and all documentation available to the Owner at all reasonable times, for inspections and audit by the Owner, during the entire term of the Contract, and for a period of Three (3) years after the expiration of this Contract.

13. Contract Rights and Remedies

The duties and obligations imposed by the **CONTRACT DOCUMENTS** and the **RIGHTS AND REMEDIES** available thereunder shall be in addition to, and not a limitation of, any duties, obligations, rights and remedies otherwise imposed or available by law.

14. Time is of the Essence

The Owner and CONTRACTOR agree that time is of the essence in the performance of Work called for under this Contract. The CONTRACTOR agrees that all work will be accomplished regularly, diligently and uninterrupted at such a rate of progress as will ensure full completion thereof within reasonable time periods.

15. Safety Measures

The CONTRACTOR shall take all necessary precautions for the safety of the Owner's and CONTRACTOR's employees at the Work site, and shall erect and properly maintain at all times, all necessary safeguards for the protection of the workmen and the public. The CONTRACTOR shall post signs warning against hazards in and around the Work site.

16. Extra Work and Associated Costs

a. Changes in the Work: The Owner, without invalidating the Contract, may order changes in the Work within the general scope of this Contract, consisting of additions, deletions, or other revision, the Contract price and time for execution of the Work being adjusted accordingly.

 All such changes in the Work shall be authorized by a written Amendment to the Contract or a separate Change Order and shall be executed under the applicable conditions of the Contract.

17. Familiarity with the Work

The CONTRACTOR, by executing this Contract, acknowledges full understanding of the extent and character of the Work required and the conditions surrounding the performance thereof. The Owner will not be responsible for any alleged misunderstanding of the Work to be furnished or completed, or any misunderstanding of conditions surrounding the performance thereof. It is understood that execution of the Contract by the CONTRACTOR serves as his stated commitment to fulfill all requirements and conditions referred to in this Contract.

18. Scope of Work – Please see Section VIII

19. Miscellaneous Provisions

- a. The CONTRACTOR shall not employ SUB-CONTRACTORS without the express written permission of the Owner.
- b. The CONTRACTOR shall not assign the Contract or sublet it as a whole without the express written permission of the Owner. The CONTRACTOR shall not assign any payment due them hereunder, without the express written permission of Owner. The Owner may assign the contract, or sublet it as a whole, without the consent of the CONTRACTOR.
- c. No waiver, alteration, consent or modification of any of the provisions of the Contract shall be binding unless in writing and signed by the Owner and CONTRACTOR.
- d. The CONTRACTOR is to procure all permits, licenses, and certificates, or any approvals of plans or specifications as may be required by Federal, State, Local Laws, ordinances, rules, and regulations, for the proper execution and completion of Work covered under this Contract.
- e. The CONTRACTOR shall at all times keep the Work area free from accumulation of waste materials or rubbish caused by his operations, and promptly remove any such materials to an area designated by the Owner or remove to a waste site as directed by the Owner. If the CONTRACTOR fails to clean up the Work site, the Owner will complete the task and charge the CONTRACTOR for such services.
- f. This Contract is considered a non-exclusive Agreement between the parties.
- g. This Contract is deemed to be under and shall be governed by and construed according to the laws of the State of Alabama.
- h. Any litigation arising out of the Contract shall be heard in the Courts of Baldwin County, Alabama.
- This Contract contains all terms and conditions agreed upon by the Owner and CONTRACTOR. No other agreement, oral or otherwise, regarding the subject matter of this Contract shall be deemed to exist or to bind either party hereto.
- j. This Contract shall not be construed against the party or parties preparing it. It shall be construed as if all the parties and each of them jointly prepared this Contract, and any uncertainty or ambiguity shall not be interpreted against one or more parties.

<u>ITEM XI</u> Alabama Immigration Act Contract Requirements

1.0 Background

The Beason-Hammon Alabama Taxpayer and Citizen Protection Act, Act No 2011-535, as amended by Act No 2012-491, *Code of Alabama* (1975) Section 31-13-1 through Section 31-13-30 (also known as and hereinafter referred to as "the Alabama Immigration Act") is applicable to contracts with the City of Fairhope, Alabama. All business entities entering into contracts with the City of Fairhope, Alabama will comply with the Alabama Immigration Act.

2.0 Definitions

ALIEN. Any person who is not a citizen or national of the United States, as described in 8 U.S.C. § 1101, et seq., and any amendments thereto.

BUSINESS ENTITY. Any person or group of persons employing one or more persons performing or engaging in any activity, enterprise, profession, or occupation for gain, benefit, advantage, or livelihood, whether for profit or not for profit. Business entity shall include but not be limited to the following:

- a. Self-employed individuals, business entities filling articles of incorporation, partnerships, limited partnerships, limited liability companies, foreign corporations, foreign limited partnerships, foreign liability companies authorized to transact business in this state, business trusts, and any business entity that registers with the Secretary of State.
- b. Any business entity that possesses a business license, permit, certificate, approval, registration, charter, or similar form of authorization issued by the state, any business entity that is exempt by law from obtaining such a business license, an any business entity that is operating unlawfully without a business license.

CONTRACTOR. A person, employer, or business entity that enters into an agreement to perform any service or work or to provide a certain product in exchange for valuable consideration. This definition shall include, but not be limited to, a general CONTRACTOR, sub-contractor, independent CONTRACTOR, contract employee, project manager, or a recruiting or staffing entity.

EMPLOYEE. Any person directed, allowed, or permitted to perform labor or service of any kind by an employer. The employees of an independent CONTRACTOR working for a business entity shall not be regarded as the employees of the business entity, for the purposes of this chapter. This term does not include any inmate in the legal custody of the state, a county, or a municipality.

EMPLOYER. Any person, firm, corporation, partnership, joint stock association, agent, manager, representative, foreman, or other person having control or custody of any employment, place of employment, or of any employee, including any person or entity employing any person for hire within the State of Alabama, including a public employer. This term shall not include the occupant of a household contracting with another person to perform casual domestic labor within the household.

E-VERIFY. The electronic verification of federal employment authorization program of the Illegal Immigration Reform and Immigrant Responsibility Act of 1996, P.L. 104-208, Division c, Section 403 (a); 8 U.S.C. §1324(a), and operated by the United States Department of Homeland Security, or its successor program.

STATE-FUNDED ENTITY. Any governmental entity of the state or a political subdivision thereof or any other entity that receives any monies from the state or a political subdivision thereof; provided, however, an entity that merely provides a service or a product to any governmental entity of the state or a political subdivision thereof, and receives compensation for the same, shall not be considered a state-funded entity.

SUBCONTRACTOR. A person, business entity, or employer who is awarded a portion of an existing contract by a CONTRACTOR, regardless of its tier.

UNAUTHORIZED ALIEN. An alien who is not authorized to work in the United States as defined in 8 U.S.C. § 1324a (h) (3) .

3.0 Mandatory Clause

All contracts or agreements to which the state, a political subdivision, or state-funded entity are a party shall include the following clause:

"By signing this contract, the contracting parties affirm, for the duration of the agreement, that they will not violate federal immigration law or knowingly employ, hire for employment, or continue to employ an unauthorized alien within the state of Alabama. Furthermore, a contracting party found to be in violation of this provision shall be deemed in breach of the agreement and shall be responsible for all damages resulting therefrom."

For purposes of this section, "contract" shall mean a contract awarded by the state, any political subdivision thereof, or any state-funded entity that was competitively bid or would, if entered into by the state or an agency thereof, be required to be submitted to the Contract Review Permanent Legislative Oversight Committee.

4.0 Contracts Involving Business Entity, or Employer

As a condition for the award of any contract, grant, or incentive by the state, any political subdivision thereof, or any state-funded entity to a business entity or employer that employs one or more employees, the business entity or employer shall not knowingly employ, hire for employment, or continue to employ an unauthorized alien within the State of Alabama.

As a condition for the award of any contract, grant, or incentive by the state, any political subdivision thereof, or any state-funded entity to a business entity or employer that employs one or more employees within the state of Alabama, the business entity or employer shall provide documentation establishing that the business entity or employer is enrolled in the E-Verify program. During the performance of the contract, the business entity or employer shall participate in the E-Verify program and shall verify every employee that is required to be verified according to the applicable federal rules and regulations.

5.0 Contracts Involving Subcontracting

Any SUB-CONTRACTOR on a project paid for by contract, grant, or incentive by the state, any political subdivision thereof, or any state-funded entity shall not knowingly employ, hire for employment, or continue to employ an unauthorized alien within the State of Alabama and shall also enroll in the E-Verify program prior to performing any work on the project. Furthermore, during the performance of the contract, the sub-contractor shall participate in the E-Verify program and shall verify every employee that is required to be verified according to the applicable federal rules and regulations. This subsection shall only apply to sub-contractors performing work on a project subject to the provisions of this section and not to collateral persons or business entities hired by the sub-contractor.

6.0 Proof of E-Verify documentation will be in the form of a copy of the signed Memorandum Of Understanding (MOU) generated upon completion of the E-Verify program.

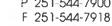

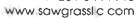

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Sawgrass Consulting, LLC (Sawgrass) was retained by the City of Fairhope to provide inspection, reporting, and load rating analysis of the existing Travel Lift Dock Facility located at the Fairhope Docks Property. The safety inspection includes a "hands on" assessment of the docks substructure (pile and caps), superstructure (beams), approach slab, and other accessory components of the structure. The inspection also included an underwater review of the wood piling from the waterline to the mudline. All work was done in accordance National Bridge Inspection Standards for In Service Bridges (NBIS).

STRUCTURE INVENTORY

The dock consists of two (2) finger piers comprised of Steel Open Box Beams, Timber Caps and Piling (two pile supports), Aluminum Sheet Pile Bulkhead and Concrete Approach Slab. See Inventory Sketch.

Inventory includes:

Steel Box Beam – 214 LF (4 EA)
Timber Bent Caps (8"x8"x60") – 24 EA
Timber Piling w/Cross Bracing (12" Dia) – 48 EA
Concrete Approach/Apron (assumed 8" Thick) - 1102 SF
Aluminum Sheet Pile Bulkhead – 45.5 LF

DEFICIENCIES – Superstructure

The steel box beams (A-D) are in the moderate to advanced stages of deterioration. Sawgrass found section loss in both the top and bottom flanges of the beams; ranging from 50% to critical loss of section in isolated areas.

Finger Pier No. 1

Top - There is up to 50% section loss in the top plate of the box beam for approximately 11 FT; beginning at southern end or at Bent No. 1 (See Photo 1);

- -The outside edges of the top plate have moderate to advanced deterioration; up to 50% section loss (typical)
- -Web there is moderate deterioration in the faces of the vertical web sections though-out;
- -Bottom The bottom flanges of both beams have moderate to advanced deterioration; up 50%- 60% (1/4") section loss (typical) to knife edge on the thickness (See Photo 2); up to 1" on the width (See Photo 3);



- -The eastern most or inside bottom flange on Beam B has no bearing on the Bent Caps (See Photo 4)
- -The steel cross braces are in advanced deterioration and/or missing throughout and have no structural value (See Photo 5)

Finger Pier No. 2

- -Top There is a critical loss of section in the top plate of both beams and has penetrations in Beam D for approximately 7 LF beginning at Bent No. 1; this section is unsafe for loading and requires closure and is in need of repair (See Photo 6);
- -There is up to 50% section loss in the top plates of the beams for approximately 24 FT; beginning at southern end or Bent No. 1 (See Photo 6);
- -The outside edges of the top plates have moderate to advanced deterioration; up to 50% section loss (typical);
- -Web there is moderate deterioration in the vertical web plates of the beam section though-out;
- -Bottom The bottom flanges of both beams have moderate to advanced deterioration; up 50%- 60% (1/4") section loss (typical) to knife edge on the thickness; up to 1" on the width;
- -The steel cross braces are in advanced deterioration and/or missing throughout and have no structural value

DEFICIENCES – Substructure

The timber Bent Caps and Piling are sound with minor soft sections within the wet dry zone; however, the steel bent cap that was accessible at Bent No. 8 for Finger Piers No. 1 and 2 has critical section loss and has failed.

Bent Caps - Timber

Bent Cap No 1 on Finger Pier No 2 is missing; creating a cantilever section; this section is unsafe for loading and requires closure and is in need of repair (See Photo 7);

Bent Caps - Steel

Bent Cap No 8- for both Finger Piers (Beams A-D) was accessible and has advanced to critical section loss (See Photo 8); the remaining Bents 9-12 are not fully accessible due to the concrete apron, but are assumed to be pile support and integrated into the concrete slab.

Piling - Timber

No Deficiencies

Note; the timber cross bracing has moderate to advanced decay and has disconnected from the piling at multiple locations



DEFICIENCIES – Approach Slab

The concrete apron section is undermined an average of 3 FT Deep; with up to 4 FT in or under the East and NE sides of Finger Pier No. 2 (See Inventory/Deficiency Sketch and Photos 9 and 10) Based on the photos, it appears the slab is similar to a relief platform with some pile support; however, the slab section and steel reinforcement is unknown for rating.

There are major cracks (Class 5) migrating at 45 degree orientation from the anchor sections of Beams B and C (See Inventory/Deficiency Sketch and Photo 11)

There is minor to moderate cracking at 45 degree orientation on the east and west aisle sections of the concrete, random spacing (See Inventory/Deficiency Sketch)

Although the West Side is not accessible for a visible inspection, Sawgrass assumes that the West and NW sides of the Finger Pier No. 1 under the slab section are in the same condition.

DEFICIENCIES - Bulkhead

There are several puncture and penetrations randomly located throughout the perimeter of the wall -1 FT below the mean water line (See Photo 12)

DEFICIENCIES – Appurtenances

The Double Timber Fender System attached on the inside face of Finger Pier Nos 1 and 2 are in advance decay at the connection points and have loosed or failed throughout (See Photo 13 and 14)

LOAD RATING ANALYSIS

Sawgrass identified Span No. 8 as the controlling or critical span to be analyzed. This support beam was analyzed based on 50% reduction in section modulus which was determined from field observation at the time of inspection. No field demolition of corroded parts was performed to specifically determine the amount of section loss. Nor was demolition performed at connections (rivets/welds/bolts) to analyze the connection integrity. No analysis was performed to determine the rate at which the beam and other components are deteriorating. The beam analysis was based on the maximum load of the travel lift that is used onsite to lift and transport vessel is rated with a 24 Ton Capacity. (see Load Rating)

Critical Span (Bent 7 to 9)

10 Ft Span with Bearing – Pass
Safety Check (unknown support from Bent 7 to 10)

15 Ft Span with Bearing - Pass

RECOMMENDATIONS

Priority Repairs-Immediate Action

- Replace Bent Cap No. 1 for Beams C and D (Finger Pier No 2)
- Replace or Supplement Bent Cap No. 8 on both Finger Pier Nos. 1 and 2 (Beams A-D)
- Sandblast to new profile, clean, and weld supplemental plates on the top plate of Beams A-D
 at the end of the Pier Sections from Bent No. 1 to Bent No. 8; secure ends from public access
 until penetrations are fixed



Schedule Repairs

- Sandblast to new profile, clean, and weld supplemental plating on the web and flange sections
 of Beams A-D where losses of section are significant
- Weld new sway bracing or blocking between Beams A-D
- Core concrete slab section to determine is design load and capacity; investigate voids
- Backfill known voids under slab
- Repair penetrations or reskin the face of the bulkhead
- Fix all fenders systems and add navigation lighting

Long Term Repairs

It is our opinion that this structure has exceeded its effective life due to the natural deterioration in a marine environment as shown by evidence of advanced stages of corrosion on all steel elements of the structure. The recommendations for repairs in critical sections will extend its life for short term use, but the remaining sections will continue to deteriorate and fail overtime. Depending on the City's e intentions for this property, we recommend the City of Fairhope begin budgeting for Removal and Replacement of this structure under their Long Term Capital Plan.

CONCLUSION

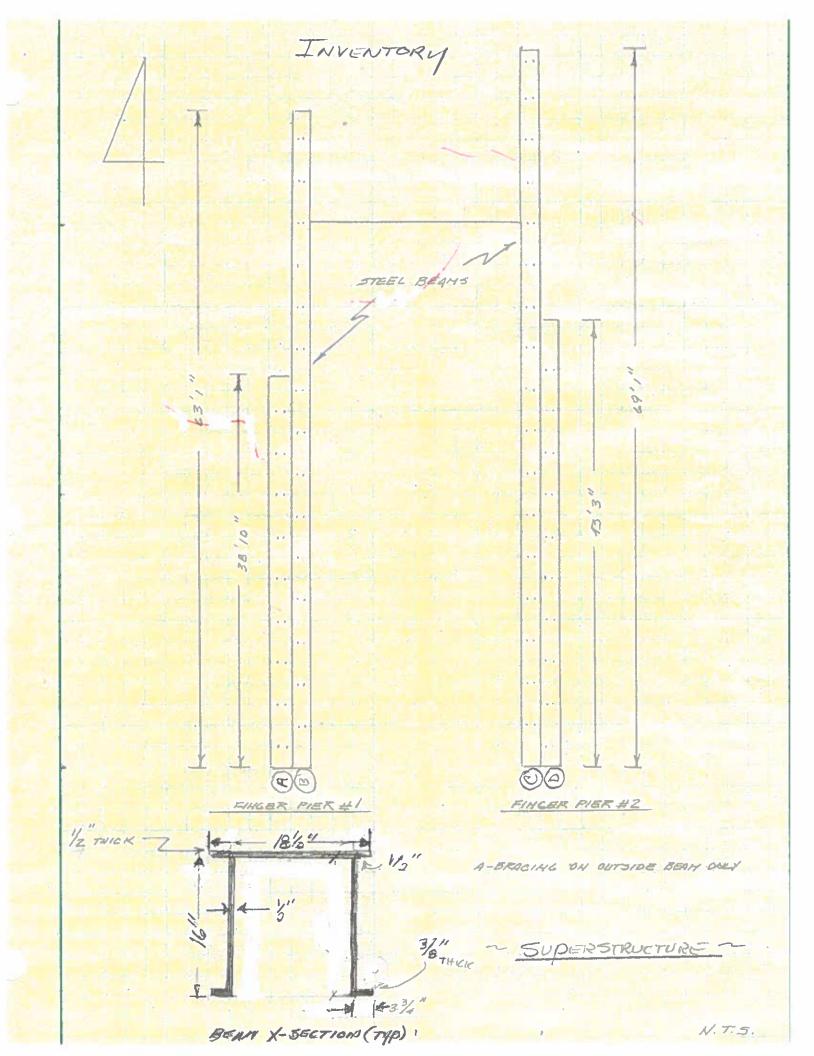
The results of the pier inspection show that the condition of the pier is in "Poor" Condition. Immediate action is required as listed in the recommendations section of this report. Although the Load Rating calculations prove the finger piers have the capacity to support existing Travel Lift Equipment (24 Ton), we feel that is not a reflection of the overall condition of the superstructure. The favorable rating is due to short span lengths and original overdesigned steel beam section(s). Further investigation is recommended for the slab section, specifically if the City of Fairhope is considering a Fork Lift Operation as an alternate use of operation.



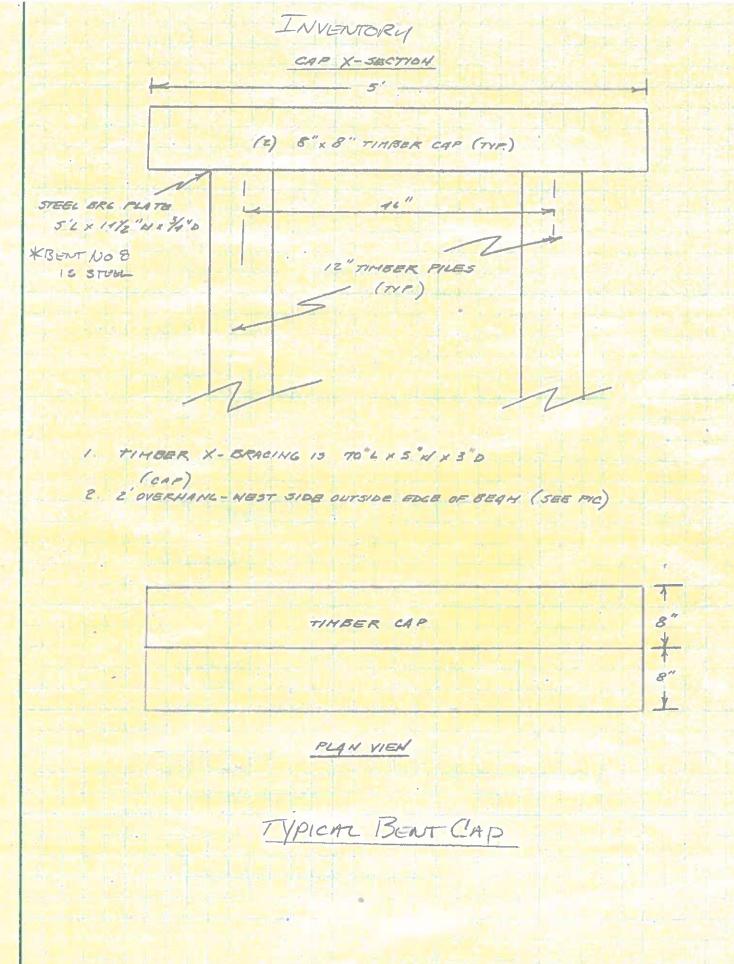

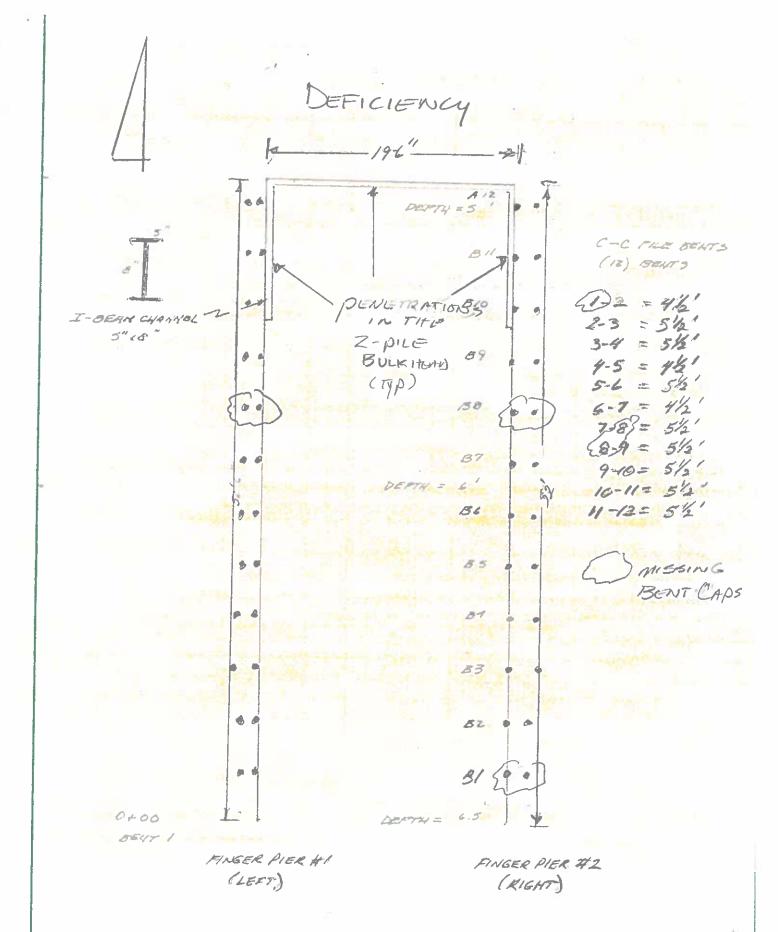

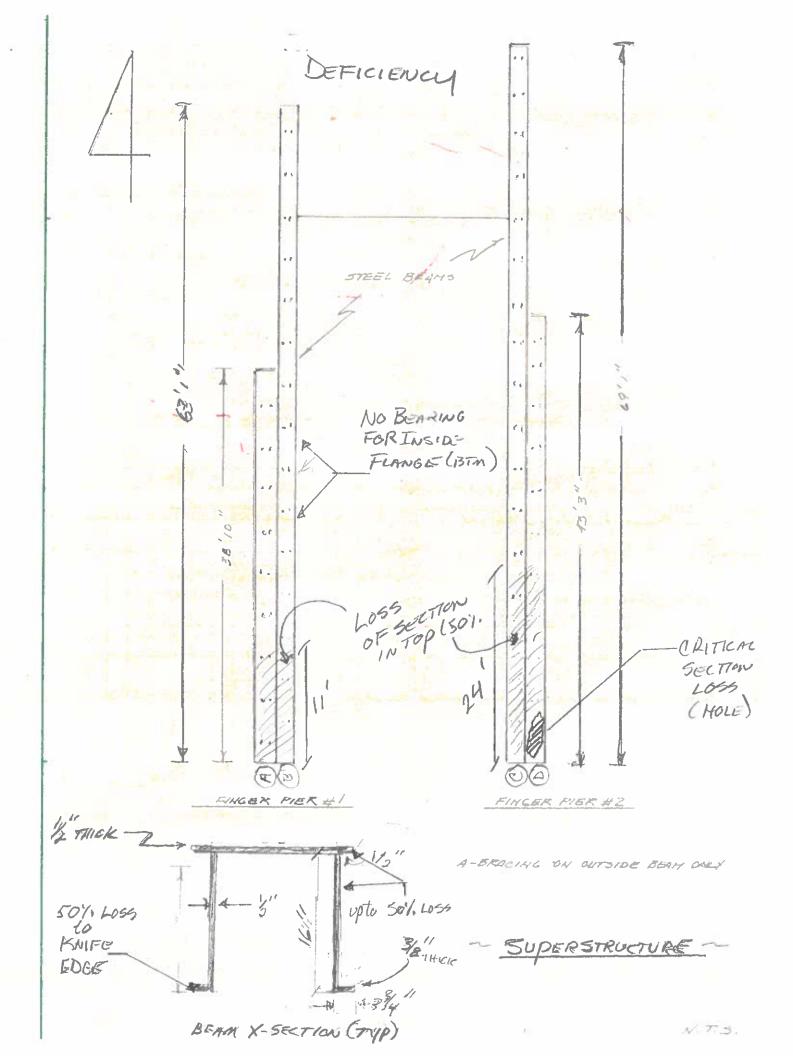

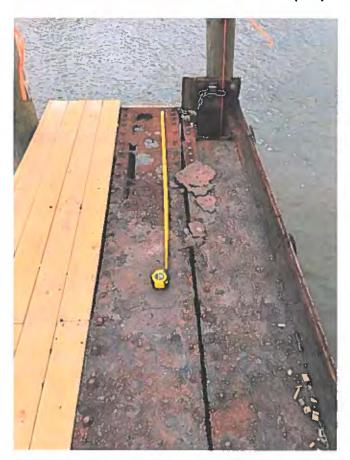


PHOTO 6 - FINGER PIER NO. 2 -BEAMS C AND D CRITICAL SECTION LOSS IN TOP PLATE

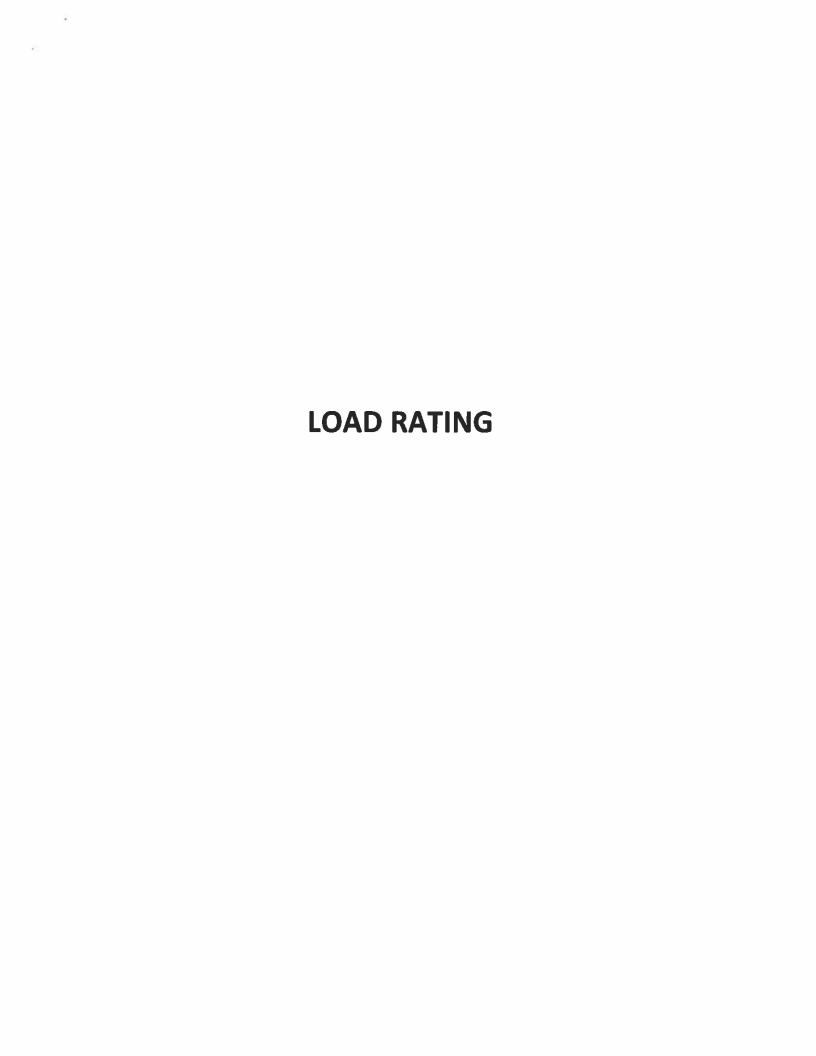

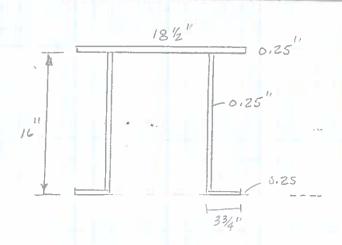

BEAM STRUCTURAL ANALYSIS





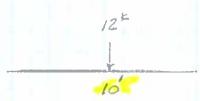
