The City Council, City of Fairhope, met in regular session at 6:00 p.m., Fairhope Municipal Complex Council Chamber, 161 North Section Street, Fairhope, Alabama 36532, on Thursday, 10 December 2018.

Present were Council President Jack Burrell, Councilmembers: Jay Robinson, Jimmy Conyers, Robert Brown, and Kevin Boone, Mayor Karin Wilson, City Attorney Marcus E. McDowell, and City Clerk Lisa A. Hanks.

There being a quorum present, Council President Burrell called the meeting to order. The invocation was given by Pastor William Parsons from Redeemer Lutheran Church and the Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

Council President Burrell stated there was a need to add on an agenda item after Agenda Item Number 20: a resolution to authorize a one-time pay increase for City employees.

Councilmember Robinson moved to add on the above-mentioned item (s) not on the printed agenda. Seconded by Councilmember Boone, motion passed unanimously by voice vote.

Councilmember Conyers moved to approve minutes of the 26 November 2018, regular meeting; minutes of the 26 November 2018, work session; and minutes of the 26 November 2018, agenda meeting. Seconded by Councilmember Boone, motion passed unanimously by voice vote.

Mayor Wilson addressed the City Council regarding the following items:

- 1) Lee Parks with Warren Averitt who is performing our audit. Since the Treasurer left several people have been doing the job which increases the risk of fraud and theft. The auditors recommend the Finance Department staff do Treasurer duties. Most Cities have the Finance Director over the Treasury Department;
- 2) Sales Tax Ordinance is not on agenda;
- 3) Finance Director Jill Cabaniss found debt prepayment does not need any funds added;
- 4) Quality of Life issues;
- 5) Fairhope Local (invest in the nest) and support local businesses;
- 6) Thanked everyone for a great Christmas Parade; and thanked the Public Works Department and Police Department for their hard work.

The following individuals spoke during Public Participation for Agenda Items:

- 1) Dr. Jerry Henry, 124 D'estrehan, addressed the City Council on Agenda Item Number 8: An Ordinance establishing an Entertainment District for the City of Fairhope; and said he was against the Entertainment District. He commented this is a family atmosphere for the Christmas Parade and Mardi Gras. He said we have a good Council and Mayor who make good/right decisions. Dr. Henry stated once you open the door to something, it gets out of control.
- 2) Ben Smith, 217 South Mobile Street, addressed the City Council on Agenda Item Number 8: An Ordinance establishing an Entertainment District for the City of Fairhope; and said he was against the Entertainment District. Mr. Smith said he agreed with Dr. Henry. He said get with the Chief of Police and the Police Department to discuss.
- 3) Amy Pippin, 855 Garden Circle, addressed the City Council on Agenda Item Number 8: An Ordinance establishing an Entertainment District for the City of Fairhope; and said she has over 2000 plus signatures on a petition for the Entertainment District. She asked the Council to protect small time businesses; and the Christmas Parade this year was on the anniversary of an ABC sting.
- 4) David Shepherd, 21210 County Road 13, , addressed the City Council on Agenda Item Number 8: An Ordinance establishing an Entertainment District for the City of Fairhope; and asked the following question: How will you control this area. In1959 he moved to this Community. Mr. Shepherd said he respected the past City leaders to do what they should or what they should not do. He commented this is the fastest growing City in Baldwin County; we have accolades in magazines without an Entertainment District.
- 5) Brent Shaw, Hunters Loop, addressed the City Council on Agenda Item Number 8: An Ordinance establishing an Entertainment District for the City of Fairhope; and wants Fairhope to remain safe. Mr. Shaw said he was against the Entertainment District; and this will not add to what we are for Fairhope.
- 6) Erik Hankins, 205 South Drive, addressed the City Council on Agenda Item Number 8: An Ordinance establishing an Entertainment District for the City of Fairhope. Mr. Hankins said he lived in Oxford, Mississippi for 10 years. He said with an Entertainment District alcohol increased and friendliness went down. He said family and friendliness will suffer. Mr. Hankins said he was against the Entertainment District.
- 7) Cecelia Brenny, 103 Mulberry Lane, , addressed the City Council on Agenda Item Number 8: An Ordinance establishing an Entertainment District for the City of Fairhope; and said her husband gets to work early and finds beer bottles and cans left in flower boxes and window seals. Ms. Brenny mentioned Andy Stanley who said "there is a time we adjust our lives for the law, etc."

Councilmember Robinson thanked the Police Department and Public Works Department for their work during the Christmas Parade. He also thanked the volunteers on the Christmas Parade Committee and City employee Paige Crawford.

Councilmember Conyers congratulated his Dad on his 71st Birthday. He asked everyone to shop local this Thursday with our Downtown merchants. Councilmember Conyers said he went to the Fairhope Junior Council and there are 10 individuals from the 9th and 12th graders. He said it is really good to see this inaugural group.

Councilmember Brown thanked the Public Works and Police Departments for the safe Christmas Parade.

Councilmember Boone said the Christmas Parade is a family fun event. He also thanked the Public Works and Police Departments for their hard work.

Council President Burrell said thank you to staff for the Christmas Parade and making it a great event.

Councilmember Robinson moved for final adoption of Ordinance No. 1629, an ordinance to amend Zoning Ordinance No. 1253 and to zone the property of LA Development, LLC to R-2 Medium Density Single Family Residential District concurrent with annexation into the City of Fairhope. This property is generally located on the south side of Manley Road, Fairhope, Alabama. PPIN #230553. Pinewood, Phase 2. (Introduced at the November 26, 2018 City Council Meeting) Councilmembers Conyers and Boone recused themselves from the vote. Seconded by Councilmember Brown, motion for final adoption passed by the following voice votes: AYE – Burrell, Robinson, and Brown. ABSTAIN – Conyers and Boone. NAY - None.

Councilmember Brown moved for final adoption of Ordinance No. <u>1630</u>, an ordinance to amend Zoning Ordinance No. 1253 and amend Ordinance No. 1582 known as Old Battles Village PUD, Phases 2, 3, 4, 5, and 6. The property owned by Truland Homes, LLC generally located on the east side of Garrison Boulevard, Fairhope, Alabama. (Introduced at the November 26, 2018 City Council Meeting) Seconded by Councilmember Boone, motion for final adoption passed by the following voice votes: AYE – Burrell, Robinson, Conyers, Brown, and Boone. NAY - None.

Councilmember Conyers introduced in writing an Ordinance of the City of Fairhope to Protect the Health, Safety and General Welfare of the People relating to Development along the Greeno Road Corridor and the Filing of Rezonings, Site Plan Approvals, and Multiple Occupancy Project applications within the Corporate Limits of the City of Fairhope.

Due to lack of a motion for immediate consideration, this ordinance will layover until the December 20, 2018 City Council meeting.

Council President Burrell explained a few highlights and changes to the proposed ordinance: changed the cups being approved and provided by the Downtown Merchants Association to the City of Fairhope or designated vendor. He also mentioned this being only for Special Events, one hour before and after the event.

Councilmember Brown introduced in writing an ordinance to establish an Entertainment District for the City of Fairhope.

Due to lack of a motion for immediate consideration, this ordinance will layover until the December 20, 2018 City Council meeting.

Councilmember Boone introduced in writing an ordinance amending Ordinance No. 1504 and Authorizing and Granting Bellsouth Telecommunications, Inc. d/b/a AT&T Alabama ("AT&T") the right to use the Rights-of-way of the City to provide Video Services to the citizens of the City under the terms of the original Agreement adopted on November 25, 2013; and the Addendum to the Agreement which amends Paragraph 2 of the Agreement by changing date of termination from December 31, 2108 to December 31, 2023; and Paragraph 13, the "Notices" paragraph of the Agreement by changing the address for AT&T Alabama.

Due to lack of a motion for immediate consideration, this ordinance will layover until the December 20, 2018 City Council meeting.

Councilmember Conyers introduced in writing, and moved for the adoption of the following resolution, a resolution that the City of Fairhope authorizes submission of a pre-application to ADECA requesting an FY 2020 Recreational Trails Program ("RTP") grant and authorizes Mayor Karin Wilson to sign the required grant application on behalf of the City to construct a recreational trail located throughout North Beach Park. Total projected costs estimate is \$499,962.65 (80/20 match; City's estimate \$99,992.53). Seconded by Councilmember Robinson, motion passed unanimously by voice vote.
