The City Council, City of Fairhope, met in regular session at 6:00 p.m., Fairhope Municipal Complex Council Chamber, 161 North Section Street, Fairhope, Alabama 36532, on Monday, 10 June 2019.

Present were Council President Pro Tempore Jay Robinson, Councilmembers: Jimmy Conyers, Robert Brown, and Kevin Boone, City Attorney Marcus E. McDowell, and City Clerk Lisa A. Hanks. Council President Jack Burrell and Mayor Karin Wilson were absent.

There being a quorum present, Council President Pro Tempore Robinson called the meeting to order. The invocation was given by Councilmember Kevin Boone and the Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

Council President Pro Tempore Robinson announced that Agenda Items Number 8, Number 9, and Number 12 have been pulled from the Agenda.

Councilmember Conyers moved to approve minutes of the 29 May 2019, regular meeting; minutes of the 29 May 2019, work session; and minutes of the 29 May 2019, agenda meeting. Seconded by Councilmember Boone, motion passed unanimously by voice vote.

Lynn Maser addressed the City Council and gave the Mayor's Report. Ms. Maser mentioned Glow in the Park with Mary Poppins Returns; and Men's Health Month with PSA Screenings and Colorectal Kits at the James P. Nix Center on June 12, 2019.

Councilmember Conyers recognized the City of Fairhope's Junior City Council members in attendance. He also announced Auburn being in the College World Series; and said, "War Eagle."

Councilmember Conyers moved for final adoption of Ordinance No. 1650, an ordinance to amend Zoning Ordinance No. 1253 and to zone the property of The Teachers' Retirement Systems of Alabama to Tourist Resort (TR) concurrent with annexation into the City of Fairhope. This property is generally located west of S. Section Street and the south side of Twin Beech Road, Fairhope, Alabama. PPIN Numbers: 5499, 20948, 286294, and 63314. The property to be known as Colony at the Grand with parcel containing 99.15 acres, more or less. (Introduced at the May 29, 2019 City Council Meeting) Seconded by Councilmember Brown, motion for final adoption passed by the following voice votes: AYE – Robinson, Conyers, Brown, and Boone. 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The City Council met in a Work Session at 4:30 p.m., Fairhope Municipal Complex Council Chamber, 161 North Section Street, Fairhope, Alabama 36532, on Monday, 10 June 2019.

Present were Council President Pro Tempore Jay Robinson, Councilmembers: Jimmy Conyers (arrived at 4:46 p.m.), Robert Brown, and Kevin Boone (arrived at 4:36 p.m.), City Attorney Marcus E. McDowell, and City Clerk Lisa A. Hanks. Council President Jack Burrell and Mayor Karin Wilson were absent.

Council President Pro Tempore Robinson called the meeting to order at 4:35 p.m. and announced that on the City Council Meeting agenda Item Number was pulled by the developer; and Items Number 8 and 9 were pulled by the City Council and Mayor. He also announced the first item on the Work Session Agenda had been pulled by Mayor Wilson.

# The following topics were discussed:

- Historic Preservation Committee member Lisa introduced Mary Shell, Alabama Historical Commission Community Services/Preservation Planner, to the City Council. Ms. Shell addressed the City Council regarding a Historical Preservation Commission and said the Historic Preservation Committee at this moment has no purpose which was to make recommendations to the City Council on the establishment of an Historic Preservation Commission, which would serve to promote the educational, cultural, economic and general welfare of the City. Ms. Shell explained the Commission would recommend Districts and National Register of Historic Places. She said the regulations are intended to keep integrity of areas and would be for new development and buildings. Ms. Shell said that homes designated historic would have less property taxes and tax benefits (advocate Federal programs and State programs that apply). She mentioned the City being categorized as a Certified Local Government; answered a question that Foley and Magnolia Springs have a Historical Preservation Commission and Districts. Ms. Shell explained that Fear of Regulations causing Towns and Cities to not form a Historical Preservation Commission. Councilmember Conyers stated the Committee's mission is whether to have a Historical Preservation Commission and this is the next step.
- City Treasurer Kim Creech addressed the City Council regarding the Discussion of funding options for a New Western Star 4700SB Chassis with New Way Sidewinder TXR 22-yard Automated Side Loader for Sanitation Department. She explained the difference between leasing or purchasing the vehicle; and said it is not in the 2019 budget. She mentioned one of the leases we have has interest at 5.35 percent and after calling a bank we do business with we can get interest at 2.87 percent. Ms. Creech said this is a Master Lease Mechanism which allows Public Works Director Richard Johnson better funding over three years. She said the original intent was to budget over years which leaves more money available in the General Fund.

The consensus of the City Council was to allow for the lease mechanism which is buying vehicle from the bank; and to go forward with reduction of interest if possible.

- Councilmember Conyers gave an update on the following: Historic Preservation Committee was the presentation we just heard; Library Board met earlier this month, mentioned Maker's Space and 3-D printer, and repairs are doing well; and Fairhope Environmental Advisory Board will meet Friday.
- Councilmember Brown commented that the Pedestrian and Bicycle Committee did not meet this month; and the Education Advisory Committee will move forward with steps for Special Tax District after the Baldwin County Commission votes on it.
- Councilmember Boone said the Personnel Board held two meetings and discussed the proposed new job descriptions for Community Development Department and the Compensation Plan.
- Water and Sewer Superintendent Jay Whitman addressed the City Council regarding the contract with Volkert expired in April and the need for CE&I for the cured in pipe until the end of the year. He commented this item would be on the next agenda with a not-to-exceed cost of \$40,000.00.
- Interim Planning Director Buford King addressed the City Council and thanked the citizens at the last Work Session and Planning Commission for their input on the first draft of the Greeno Road Overlay District. Mr. King stated they are working on and revising the ordinance to simplify; and should be addressed at the next Planning Commission scheduled for July 1, 2019.
- Mr. King said he would briefly explain City Council Agenda Items Number 5, 6, and
   7; and would address the questions brought up at the last meeting regarding sewer infrastructure.

There being no further business to come before the City Council, the meeting was duly adjourned at 5:10 p.m.

The City hired a professional engineering firm to complete the CE&I work initiated in RFQ No. PS013-18 CE&I for Rehabilitation of Wastewater Collection Services 2018. The Mayor selected Volkert, Inc for this RFQ (Request for Qualifications) for the project. The RFQ was issued, the response received and evaluated, and the fee was negotiated for presentation to City Council authorizing the Mayor to execute the associated contract. The Not-to-Exceed amount for this RFQ is THIRTY-FIVE THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$35,000.00).

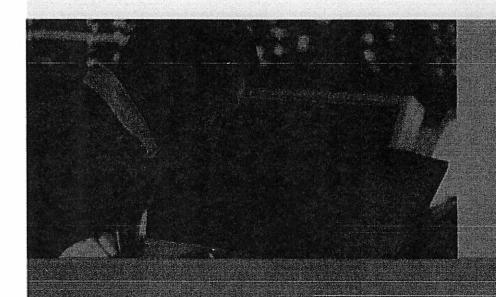

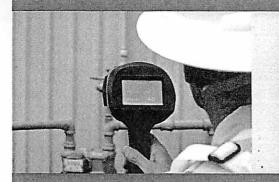

#### **CONSERVATION EASEMENT AGREEMENT**

THIS CONSERVATION EASEMENT AGREEMENT (this "Agreement") is made by and between the City of Fairhope, Alabama, (the "Landowner") and Weeks Bay Foundation, Inc. (the "Organization"). This Agreement shall be effective upon the date of execution and delivery by all parties hereto (the "Effective Date").

The purpose of this Agreement is to document that the Landowner and the Organization intend to enter into two conservation easements for the properties known collectively as the Dyas/Triangle property, (the Property) and to outline the terms of the easement transaction. (Attachment A: Map of the Property)

### ARTICLE I THE CONSERVATION EASEMENT

- 1.1 <u>The Conservation Easement</u> Per the request of the Landowner, the Organization will hold a conservation easement on the Property for the Landowner. This easement will ensure the conservation of the Property in perpetuity.
- 1.2 <u>Terms of the Easement</u>. The Landowner and the Organization will work together to outline the terms of the conservation easements for the Property. They will consult with appropriate partners on the creation of the Conservation Easement Deed.
- 1.3 <u>Execution of the Easement Deed</u>. The final Conservation Easement Deed shall be approved in writing by the Landowner and the Organization before the Closing. The Conservation Easement Deed will be signed at a Closing and be recorded with the Baldwin County Probate.

## ARTICLE II COST OF THE EASEMENTS

2.1 Cost of the Easements. The total cost of the conservation easement, due diligence, and closing fees for the Property shall be \$39,025. These costs will be paid by the Landowner to the Organization. Should the Landowner, or any of their agents, request additional services beyond those outlined in the proposal (Attachment B: Scope of Work Proposal), the cost of the Easement may increase. Due Diligence costs shall be paid as the work is completed and invoices are submitted. The remainder of the costs shall be paid at the Closing.

#### ARTICLE III DUE DILIGENCE

3.1 <u>Due Diligence</u>. The Organization will be responsible for Due Diligence activities on the Property. These activities will include Title Search Update, Phase I ESA, and Baseline Documentation Report. Due Diligence costs shall be paid as the Organization submits invoices for completed work to the Landowner.

- 3.2 <u>Due Diligence Timeline</u>. The Organization shall complete the due diligence activities within 90 days of the signing of the Agreement. If the Conservation Easement Deed has not been approved within 30 days of the completion of the Due Diligence activities, updates to these activities may be required, at additional cost to the Landowner.
- 3.3 <u>Inspection and Cooperation</u>. During the term of this Agreement, the Organization and its agents shall be entitled to enter the Property during daylight hours for the purpose of making or conducting any inspection or investigation related to the preservation of the Property.

## ARTICLE IV REPRESENTATIONS, WARRANTIES AND COVENANTS OF LANDOWNER

- 4.1 <u>Representations and Warranties of Landowner</u>. For the purpose of inducing the Organization to enter into this Agreement and to consummate the transaction contemplated hereby pursuant to the terms and conditions hereof, Landowner hereby makes the following representations and warranties to the Organization (each and all of which are true and correct as of the date hereof and shall be true and correct as of the Closing):
  - (a) Except for Permitted Exceptions, if any, there are no outstanding contracts, leases, easements or other agreements, whether written or oral, recorded or unrecorded, relating to the Property or which give or purport to give any person any rights of access or use with respect to the Property or any portion thereof, including, without limitation, any outstanding timber cutting or sale contracts, any options to purchase or rights of first refusal, or any oral or written agreements giving or purporting to give or grant any access rights to any person with respect to the Property or any portion thereof.
  - (b) Landowner has good, indefeasible, merchantable and marketable fee simple title to the Property, free and clear of any liens or other encumbrances. If such encumbrances exist, they will be subordinated to the conservation easement.
  - (c) There are no pending or, to Landowner's knowledge, any threatened, claims, disputes, litigation, arbitration or administrative hearings before any governmental agency, or asserted by any third party, concerning or affecting the Property or its use.
  - (d) To Landowner's knowledge, there are no hazardous waste, hazardous substances or hazardous materials located on the Property.
  - (e) The Property are contiguous to a county road, which provides public access to the Property.

- **4.2** <u>Covenants of Seller</u>. From the date of this Agreement until the Closing, Landowner shall:
  - (a) Not enter into any written or oral agreement with respect to the Property without the prior written consent of the Organization, including without limitation any timber cutting or sale contracts or agreements giving or purporting to give or grant any access rights to any person, or entity, with respect to the Properties or any portion thereof. Prior to Closing, Landowner shall not conduct timber harvest activities on the Property;
  - (b) Notify Organization immediately in writing of any event or condition hereafter that Landowner becomes aware of prior to Closing that affects the Property; and
  - (c) Not sell, assign, or convey any right, title or interest whatsoever in or to the Property, or grant, create or voluntarily allow the creation of, or amend, modify or change, any access easement, right-of-way, encumbrance, restriction, covenant, lease or other right affecting the Property or any part thereof, without Organization's prior written consent. Landowner may perform any curative title or perfection of title as deemed necessary.

# ARTICLE V CLOSING

5.1 <u>Closing</u>. Provided that all of the contingencies of this Agreement have been fulfilled (or waived by the Organization), the Closing of the transaction and the recording of the Conservation Easement Deed shall be held on a date that is mutually agreed to by the Landowner and the Organization.

#### ARTICLE VI RISK OF LOSS

- 6.1 <u>Casualty</u>. Landowner assumes all risks and liability for damage to or injury occurring to the Properties by fire, storm, or any other casualty or cause until the Closing has been consummated. If the Properties, or any part thereof, suffers any damage prior to the Closing from fire, storm, or other casualty, the Closing Date shall be extended for thirty (30) days from the date of loss. The parties shall make a good faith effort to agree on an adjustment to the Baseline Documentation Report and Conservation Easement Deed during said 30 day period.
- 6.2 <u>Condemnation</u>. If, prior to the Closing, action is initiated or threatened to take any of the Properties by eminent domain proceedings or by deed in lieu thereof, the Organization may either (a) terminate this Agreement or (b) consummate the Closing with adjustments to the Due Diligence documents and edits to the Conservation Easement Deed.

#### ARTICLE VII MISCELLANEOUS

- 7.1 <u>Brokers' Commission</u>. Neither party shall owe any commission as a result of the transaction contemplated herein.
- 7.2 <u>Modification of Termination</u>. This Agreement cannot be changed or terminated orally or in any manner other than by a written agreement executed by both parties.
- 7.3 <u>Waiver</u>. Landowner or Organization may, at any time or times, at their election, waive any of the conditions to its obligations hereunder by a written waiver expressly detailing the extent of such waiver (and no other waiver or alleged waiver by such party shall be effective for any purpose). No express or implied consent to or waiver of any breach or default by a party in the performance by such party of its obligations under this Agreement shall be deemed or construed to be a consent to or waiver of any other breach or default in the performance by such party of the same or any other obligations of such party under this Agreement.
- 7.4 <u>Binding Effect</u>. The covenants and agreements herein contained shall be binding upon and inure to the benefit of the respective parties hereto, their legal representatives, heirs, successors and assigns.
- 7.5 <u>Notices</u>. Any notice permitted or required hereby shall be made in writing as follows:

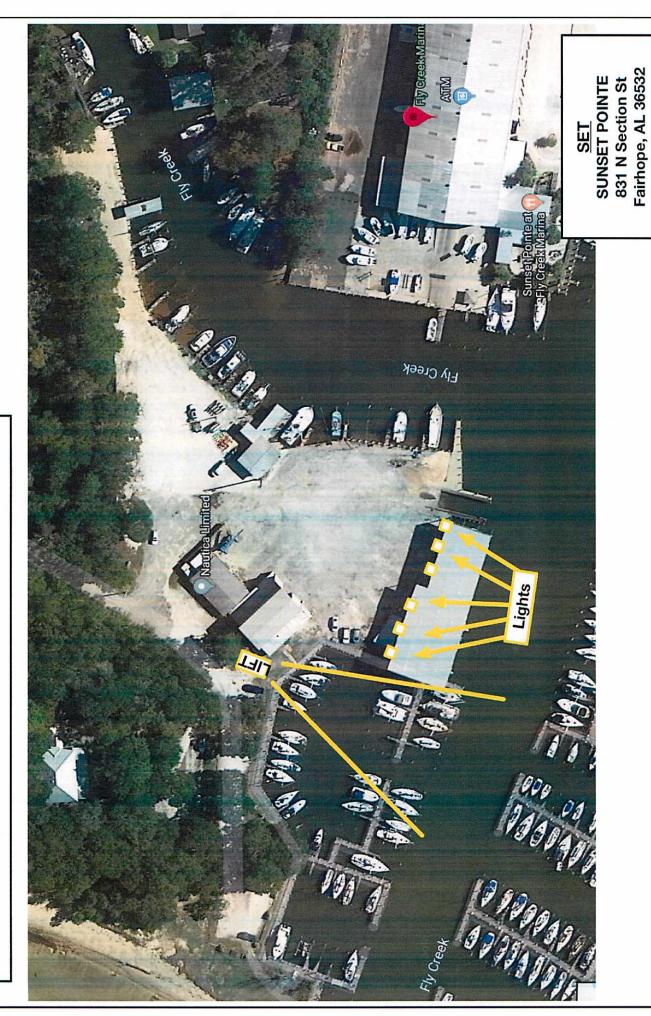
