Present were Council President Jack Burrell, Councilmembers: Jay Robinson, Jimmy Conyers, Robert Brown, and Kevin Boone, Mayor Karin Wilson, City Attorney Marcus E. McDowell, and City Clerk Lisa A. Hanks.

There being a quorum present, Council President Burrell called the meeting to order. The invocation was given by Councilmember Kevin Boone and the Pledge of Allegiance was recited. Councilmember Brown moved to approve minutes of the 13 January 2020, regular meeting; minutes of the 13 January 2020, work session; and minutes of the 13 January 2020, agenda meeting. Seconded by Councilmember Boone, motion passed unanimously by voice vote.

Mayor Wilson addressed the City Council regarding the following items:

- 9) Fairhope Storm football team's first game in on Saturday, February 29, 2020;
- 10) Fairhope Docks update; and
- 11)Big Brother/Big Sister of South Alabama presented with a Mentoring Proclamation; and January is National Mentoring Month; and
- 12) January is also Human Trafficking Awareness Month and the proclamation was mailed last week to Montgomery and posted on Facebook; and
- 13) Erik Cortinas announced that Kaleigh Spears won the 6A7A State Championship in the 100 Butterfly; and came in second for the 200 Individual Medley Race.

The following individuals spoke during Public Participation for Agenda Items:

 Mark Roshetko, 9727 Derby Lane, addressed the City Council regarding Agenda Item Number 5: ordinance the property of the Fairhope Single Tax Corporation and Pauline J. Moyd from RA Residential/Agriculture District to Planned Unit Development (PUD). Mr. Roshetko said he would not support this ordinance in its current form. He commented the Power of Attorney was not legitimate; and asked the City Council to please look at it before voting.

Councilmember Conyers mentioned a Special Called meeting for the Historic Preservation Committee.

Councilmember Boone gave an at-a-boy to Paige Crawford delivering twins.

Councilmember Brown moved for final adoption of Ordinance No. <u>1672</u>, an ordinance to amend Zoning Ordinance No. 1253 and to rezone the property of the Fairhope Single Tax Corporation ("FSTC") and Pauline J. Moyd from RA Residential/Agriculture District to Planned Unit Development (PUD). The property is generally located at the southwest corner of the intersection of Bay Meadows Avenue and State Highway 181, Fairhope, Alabama; known as Live Oaks Estates PUD. PPIN Number: 15078; parcel containing 37.961 acres, more or less. (Introduced at the January 13, 2020 City Council Meeting) The motion was seconded by Councilmember Robinson who questioned the Power of Attorney and the issue with same. City Attorney McDowell said that this POA was for the governmental agencies reviews. Development Services Manager Buford King said the entity handling the zoning application does not need a POA to represent the owners; and this is unusual in this file. Planning and Zoning Manager Hunter Simmons agreed with Mr. King. Building Official Erik Cortinas said they cannot build unless proof of ownership is provided.

Councilmember Robinson commented the ordinance has been through several times and the property owners did many changes that were suggested; and the ordinance is more acceptable in the form presented. The City Council met in a Work Session at 4:30 p.m., Fairhope Municipal Complex Council Chamber, 161 North Section Street, Fairhope, Alabama 36532, on Monday, 27 January 2020.

Present were Council President Jack Burrell, Councilmembers: Jay Robinson, Jimmy Conyers, Robert Brown, and Kevin Boone, Mayor Karin Wilson, City Attorney Marcus E. McDowell, and City Clerk Lisa A. Hanks.

Council President Burrell called the meeting to order at 4:32 p.m.

The following topics were discussed:

• Brandon Goertz, a representative from the film "Map of Tiny Perfect Things," along with Community Affairs Director Jessica Walker addressed the City Council and gave an update on Filming Sites and Process. Mr. Goertz explained the changes and stop light shots. He said traffic flow would be intermittent with at least 40 to 50 minutes each hour.

Councilmember Robinson commented they did best they could to film and keep closures less; being intermittent. Council President Burrell stated he needed to hear from the Downtown Merchants Association; and send their feedback to the City Clerk. Councilmember Brown agreed that they wanted to hear from the merchants before deciding. Council President Burrell suggested Mr. Goertz and Ms. Walker to take a straw poll to get a "Warm Fuzzy" response.

• Recreation Director Pat White addressed the City Council regarding the Discussion of Parks and Franchise Agreement and Use of City Property. Mr. White mentioned the Fairhope Soccer Club with the Soccer Travel Clubs, Soccer Academy, and Gulf Coast Rangers being under their umbrella. He said that these needed to have a franchise agreement with the City to use their facilities; and handed out the Fairhope Soccer Club's 2018 financial statement and the Gulf Coast Rangers Football Club fees for fall 2019.

Council President Burrell commented the Fairhope Recreation Leagues should be priority for public use. City Attorney Marcus McDowell said this possibly is a bid law issue; using fields exclusively for private entity.

Mr. White brought the Summer Camp Program and the salaries of the coaches being under his budget; and listed under Summer Camp. He said the exercise room is open and they hold a three to four day football camp. Mr. White stated that other Cities have the coaches too, but channel funds through the Baldwin County Board of Education. Mayor Wilson said we need to set goals for these coaches. Councilmember Conyers questioned who will handle the Academy and Rants regarding franchise agreements. Councilmember Brown said we should not charge them the 20 percent for gross revenues. Council President Burrell mentioned the charges for tournament registration and tournament parking listed on the financial statement. Councilmember Robinson said a private entity should not be using a public facility and charging entry.

Mr. White stated he would present at the Recreation Summit and then take to the Recreation Board.

- Councilmember Robinson stated the Youth Baseball Team (12 year-olds) are going to a tournament in Cooperstown; and Fairhope has secured a spot for each year. He was we were asked to sponsor the team; being the "Pin Sponsor" in the amount of \$1,000.00. Council President Burrell commented if we fund this team, we will open Pandora's Box for all teams.
- Council President Burrell gave an update on the Airport Authority and said they discussed a ground lease for T-hangars; and questioned whether to allow ground lease, build hangars, and then lease to the entity. He announced the Industrial Development Board meeting Tuesday night.
- Public Works Director Richard Johnson addressed the City Council regarding the Section Street cross walks project with pavers being delivered this week; signal equipment being delivered by next week; and drop dead completion date of February 14, 2020. He briefly addressed the following items: Rebuild Alabama Act grant for sidewalks denied; Turn lanes for U. S. 98 (Greeno Road) and Twin Beech; Gayfer Road and U. S. 98 (Greeno Road) project; and County Road 13 sidewalks and bridge completion. He suggested setting a ribbon cutting date for the sidewalks and for Mayor and City Council to walk sidewalks after cutting.

Council President Burrell asked about the Parking Garage and Alley Project. Mr. Johnson replied that the City was asked for more information on the property; i.e. cultural and historical significance of area. He said the Fairhope Single Tax Corporation owns 99 percent of the area being looked at; and are helping with that documentation. Mr. Johnson said the goal is to let bids for the project in February.

Councilmember Conyers asked about the roundabout at Highway 104 and Section Street. Mr. Johnson stated there are grants we can submit for funding, but the MPO funding is guaranteed in FY 2023. Council President Burrell suggested Mr. Johnson to look at the MPO funding schedule and the MPO could possibly move to FY 2022.

• City Treasurer Kim Creech addressed the City Council and said the City received a \$1,000.00 donation towards the "Clock Property" purchase.





# Summary of Request:

Public hearing to consider the request of GMC, Inc for a conditional annexation to Tourism Resort District that amends the original TR District established by RSA on behalf of the Retirement Systems of Alabama. The subject property, approximately 7.23 acres, is currently unzoned in Baldwin County located on the south side of Old Battles Road across from Poviner Place subdivision. The property lies between the current Lakewood Azalea Golf course holes two and three. If approved the subject property would be designated as Low-Rise Residential Zone in the TR District.

# Comments:

- The subject property was subdivided out in 2006 case *SD 06.08 Colony at the Grand North Subdivision*. The approval of a waiver from the stormwater standards was also approved stating that "Drainage calculations and plans will be provided at the time each parcel is individually subdivided or developed."
- A current Subdivision Application containing 10 lots was submitted, but due to the required Community Meeting not being held until after the application deadline it was held off the November Agenda and is scheduled for the December 2, 2019 Planning Commission Agenda. Attached is the proposed preliminary plat.
- The proposed site contains a mixture of trees predominately live oaks and pines. During the subdivision application proper tree protection would be required per Fairhope's Subdivision Regulations and if annexation is approved Fairhope's Tree and Landscape Ordinance would be applicable.
- The TR District has criteria that the overall density for all residential areas shall be no greater than 3.5 units per gross acre within all of the acreage comprising the TR District.
  - Important to note that the proposed 10 lot subdivision which is 1.38 units per acre would give the TR District 3.0 units per acre (882units/294acres)
  - The TR District has criteria that all TR Districts provide at least 20% open space and/or green space.
    - Currently there is 63.8 acres of green space exceeding the required 20% (58.8 acres).

# Surrounding Area:

- North: R-1 Low Density Single Family Residential District and Planned Unit Development
- South: Unincorporated Baldwin County
- East: Tourism Resort District
- West: Unincorporated Baldwin County

# **Staff Recommendation:**

Staff recommends **approval** of the Conditional Annexation to the Tourism Resort District with the following conditions:

- 1. Subject property development zone shall be labeled as low-rise residential zone.
- 2. Subject property use shall be limited to Single-Family Residential use only.
- 3. Future development shall be in substantial conformance to the simultaneously submitted Subdivision Request SD 19.41 Watershed West a 10-lot major subdivision.
- 4. This approval does not determine the applicability or proper interpretation of any existing easements, covenants, restrictions or other private contract rights, and accordingly does not abrogate, limit, or impair any such existing easements, covenants, restrictions, or private contract rights which may impose greater restrictions than this approval, the Zoning Ordinance, the Subdivision Regulations, or other law.

# Planning Commission Recommendation:

The Planning Commission of the City of Fairhope, at its December 2, 2019 regular meeting, heard the referenced case and Hollie MacKellar made a motion to **DENY** the request due to concerns with health, safety, and welfare. #### AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 1253 KNOWN AS THE ZONING ORDINANCE

The ordinance known as the Zoning Ordinance (No. 1253), adopted 27 June 2005, is changed and altered as described below;

WHEREAS, the City of Fairhope Planning Commission directed the Planning Department to prepare amendments to our Zoning Ordinance; and,

WHEREAS, the proposed amendments relate to Director of Planning, Lot Coverage, Driveways, Fencing, PUD (Planned Unit Development), and Non-Conforming Structures; and,

WHEREAS, after the appropriate public notice and hearing of ZC 19.17, the Planning Commission of the City of Fairhope, Alabama has forwarded a favorable recommendation;

# NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FAIRHOPE, ALABAMA;

1. **THAT**, Article II, Section A.3. Director of Planning and Building be amended to read as follows:

#### 3. Director of Planning

The Director of Planning shall be the municipal zoning officer, or the zoning officer's representative whose duties shall be as follows:

- a. The Director of Planning is authorized and empowered on behalf and in the name of the council to administer and enforce the provisions of this ordinance including:
  - (1) Receive applications:
  - (2) Inspect premises, and issue certificates of coning compliance, and certificates of occupancy for uses and structures which are in conformance with the provisions of this ordinance:
  - (3) Interpret the meaning of the ordinance in the course of enforcement;
  - (4) Propose zoning amendments as provided in this ordinance; and,
  - (5) Advise the Planning Commission and City Council on implementation of the Comprehensive Plan.
- b. The Director of Planning shall keep records of certificates of occupancy issued, maps, plats and other documents with notations of all special conditions involved. He shall file and safely keep copies of all sketches and plans submitted, and the same shall form a part of the records of his office and shall be public record.
- THAT, Article III, Section C.1., Table 3-2: Dimension Table Lots and Principle Structure regarding lot coverage be amended to read as follows:

Max. total lot coverage by all structures.

 THAT, Article III, Section C.1., Table 3-2: Dimension Table – Lots and Principle Structure, b. regarding side setbacks and driveways be amended to read as follows:

b. Where a driveway is in the side, and extends past the front of the principle structure, the side setback shall be 15°. Driveways shall not be within 3 feet of the side lot line. The area between the side lot line and driveway shall be vegetated and remain pervious.

 THAT, Article III, Section C.2., Table 3-3: Dimension Table – Residential Accessory Structures be amended to add a column regarding separation between structures to read as follows:

Min. separation between structures  $R/A = 5^{\circ}$ , R-3 PGH = 5°, and All other residential districts = 5°

5. THAT, Article IV, Section B.5. Fencing be amended to read as follows:

#### 5. Fencing and/or Walls

- a. Fences and/or walls are permitted in every zoning district. A building permit shall be obtained prior to construction of any fence. Fences and/or walls may be permitted on the property lines or anywhere else on the lot provided that:
  - (1) Fences and/or walls shall not be constructed in a drainage easement, floodway, or other watercourse: and

(2) Fences and/or walls shall not be constructed in any required clear sight distance.

- b. Fences and/or walls in all residential zoning districts are subject to the following requirements:
  - (1) No fence and/or walls shall be higher than eight (8') feet. Any fence and/or walls forward of the front building line shall not be higher than four (4') feet:

- (1) No fence and/or walls shall be higher than 12 feet. Any fence and/or walls in front of the front building line shall be limited to between two and one-half and four feet high and shall have a design style consistent with the architectural elements of the buildings on the site.
- (2) No corrugated metal sheets, solid sheets of metal, plywood, particleboard, barbed wire, razor wire, or similar materials shall be allowed.
- 6. THAT, Article V, Section A. PUD Planned Unit Development be amended to read as follows:

#### A. PUD – Planned Unit Development

- 1. Intent The special standards listed in this section for the Planned Unit Development district are intended to:
  - Permit flexible development of projects which are comprehensively planned as a single development with a functional master development plan which fully considers the entire site as an integrated project and give broad consideration to impacts and relationships to surrounding areas.
  - encourage opportunities for development innovation tailored to a
    particular site, that while clearly furthering the goals of the comprehensive
    plan, could not explicitly be established by generally applicable standards

- 4. Ordinance and Master Development Plan Required Each Planned Unit Development shall have an Ordinance that establishes the development of regulations for the district. In approving a Planned Unit Development, the ordinance shall reference the master development plan, which shall prescribe development standards. The master development plan after approval shall become part of the amending ordinance. All development shall be in conformance with the approved master development plan and development regulations.
  - a. Master development plan. The master development plan shall include the following information:
    - (1.) Written Documentation
      - a. A legal description of the parcel upon which the PUD is to be built:

At the preapplication conference the prospective applicant shall present to the Planning Director a proposed plan for review, and discuss pertinent development matters including, but not limited to, the following:
  - b. Application. In addition to the general criteria for zoning map amendments, a map amendment to the PUD district shall include a preliminary master development plan to be reviewed for compliance with the goals and intent of the Comprehensive Plan, this ordinance, and the health, safety, and general welfare of the people of the City.
    - (1.) The required preliminary master development plan shall include those items described in Article V. Section A.4.a (master development plan). The preliminary master development plan is intended as a draft, which will be edited and improved based upon review of staff.       - x. Pedestrian circulation
      - xi. Signs
      - xii. Mitigation of noise, fumes, odors, vibration or airborne particles
      - xiii. Exterior lighting
      - xiv. Exterior construction materials
- 6. Building Permit Compliance No building permit for any structure shall be issued, nor shall a Certificate of Occupancy be granted until the development plans are consistent with the site plan and development regulations of the approved Planned Unit Development. All building permits must be consistent with the Planned Unit Development.
- 7. Planned Unit Development Amendments Changes or amendments to a Planned Unit Development shall be processed in the same manner as the original request. Slight changes in the detail of the Planned Unit Development that do not change the intent, meaning, relationship of structures to each other may be approved by the Director of Planning.
- 8. Failure to begin construction Construction of the approved development must begin within one year from the date of the approval of the master development plan by the City Council. Any approved changes in the plan shall not extend the time at which said one-year period begins to run.

> The planning commission may, no sooner than 60 days prior to the end of said one-year period, upon the written request of the applicant, extend such oneyear period for a period of not more than one year if, in the judgment of the planning commission, such additional time is warranted.

> In any event, the construction of the PUD must be started within two years of the approval of the master development plan by the city council. Failure to being the development of the PUD within said one-year period. or the period as extended, shall automatically void the master development plan, and the zoning classification shall automatically revert to the zoning classification of RA - Residential/Agriculture District.

7. THAT, Article VII, Section B. Non-conforming Structures be amended to read as follows:

#### **B.** Non-conforming Structures

Structures that were legally constructed prior to the adoption of this ordinance, but which could not be constructed under the terms of this ordinance are considered legal non-conforming structures. A legal non-conforming structure may continue to exist subject to the following:

- Non-conforming structures, or those parts of a structure that are non-conforming may not be expanded either horizontally, or vertically. Alteration and expansions shall conform to all current regulations.
- 2. The structure shall remain legal in all other regards except for the nonconformance that existed upon adoption of the ordinance that made the structure non-conforming.
- 3. A non-conforming structure, which is not intentionally damaged, destroyed, or removed, may be restored within one year from the date of the event. If the structure is not re-constructed in one year all restorations and improvements shall be in compliance with applicable ordinances. The burden of proof of date of damage or destruction shall be on the person proposing the restoration.

Severability Clause - if any part, section or subdivision of this ordinance shall be held unconstitutional or invalid for any reason, such holding shall not be construed to invalidate or impair the remainder of this ordinance, which shall continue in full force and effect notwithstanding such holding.

Effective Date – This ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its due adoption and publication as required by law.



#### Resolution Supporting a Proposed Scope Across Mobile River and Mobile Bay

WHEREAS, the Eastern Shore Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) is the organization designated by the Governor of the State of Alabama as being responsible, together with the State of Alabama, for implementing the applicable provisions of 23 USC 134 and 13 (amended by FAST Act, Sections 1201 and 1202, December 2015); 42 USC 2000d-1, 7401; 23 CFR 450 and 500; 40 CFR 51 and 93; and

**WHEREAS**, the U. S. Department of Transportation requires all urbanized areas, as established by the U. S. Bureau of the Census, doing area-wide urban transportation planning that involves more than one Department of Transportation operating administration, to submit a Long Range Transportation Plan as a condition for meeting the provisions of Title 23 USC 134; and

WHEREAS, it has been requested that the Coastal Alabama region provide an alternative plan for the capacity needs to the transportation network across the Mobile River and Mobile Bay; and

WHEREAS, an alternate concept of constructing the new Mobile River Bridge together with new capacity across Mobile Bay in the form of an "expressway" that would augment the existing capacity provided by I-10 and the Causeway has been re-introduced as a potential basis for such a solution; and

WHEREAS, an expressway based concept has merit as it provides much needed additional capacity at a cost much lower than previous solutions;

**THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** that the Eastern Shore Metropolitan Planning Organization hereby:

- 1. adopts the attached scope found in Exhibit "A" as an ESMPO supported solution to the additional capacity need across the Mobile River and Mobile Bay;
- 2. appeals to ALDOT to further investigate the feasibility of a project based on this scope and if feasible, undertake steps to move the concept to a more defined project;
- 3. encourages the state legislature and ALDOT to identify funding sources for the project so that an acceptable funding plan may be developed for the project;
- 4. suggests that all citizens, organizations, governmental entities and elected leaders in Coastal Alabama become familiar with this scope and endorse a scope that they believe will lead to a consensus for a solution within the Coastal Alabama region;
- 5. adds the engineering (PE) phase for a project based on the adopted scope to the ESMPO Transportation Improvement Plan (TIP) should ALDOT find it desirous and agrees in writing to be sponsor of said PE project;
- 6. will consider adding the construction (CN) phase to the TIP once ALDOT develops a more defined project based on the adopted scope;
- 7. requests the Mobile MPO to consider adopting this scope in order to achieve consensus between the two MPOs and foster a true Coastal Alabama consensus plan;
- 8. invites ALDOT to bring forward the ESMPO for consideration any alternate ideas, concepts, or plans it may deem as a more viable solution;

The foregoing resolution was adopted and approved on the 22<sup>nd</sup> day of January 2020, by the Eastern Shore Metropolitan Planning Organization Policy Board.

#### Mobile River Bridge and Expressway Concept – Project Scope

#### 1. Project Description.

The segment of Interstate 10 (I-10) between Mobile and Baldwin Counties has been identified as one of the greatest bottleneck on I-10. Further, the traffic counts and associated traffic congestion on this segment is on par with the worst in the Southeast. With the strong regional growth being experienced in Coastal Alabama, it is critical to address the aging and limiting transportation network traversing Mobile Bay and the Mobile River to handle the rapidly growing local traffic in addition to the growing interstate traffic traversing this area. To increase capacity, the Mobile Metropolitan Planning Organization (Mobile MPO) and the Eastern Shore Metropolitan Planning Organization (Eastern Shore MPO) propose the Mobile River Bridge and Expressway project. This high-priority project involves three major components:

- Mobile River Bridge: a new cable stay bridge built to provide six lanes of travel over the Mobile River
- Expressway: 7.5 miles of new bridges over Mobile Bay built above the 100-year storm surge level that will supplement the existing I-10 route over Mobile Bay
- Access: Limited access along the Expressway with mid-bay egress to address safety and access concerns

#### 2. Design Parameters.

The Project has been conceived and intentionally designed to utilize the same routes as the Original Mobile River Bridge and Bayway Project with the intent of leveraging the existing Final Environmental Impact Statement (FEIS) and Record of Decision (ROD) which was received in 2019 for the Original Project.

#### Design Factors/Constraints:

**Mobile River Bridge**: The design for the main span Mobile River Bridge shall be consistent with the original design from the original ALDOT Mobile River Bridge and Bayway Project.

**Expressway:** A four lane, divided expressway with two travel lanes in each direction to be constructed from the termination of the Mobile River Bridge to the Eastern Shore in Baldwin County and between the existing Eastbound and Westbound Bayway bridge spans.

#### Access:

- 1. A new diverging diamond interchange at Virginia Street on Interstate 10 in Mobile.
- 2. The existing access to US Highway 98 (Exit 35A) and US Highway 90 (Exit 35B) from Interstate 10 to remain accessible as well as be accessible from the eastbound Expressway route.
- 3. The existing Causeway (Exit 30) access from Interstate 10 to remain, as well as access to the Causeway from Expressway be provided.
- 4. The Expressway to be accessible from US Highway 98 on the Eastern Shore to enable local traffic to utilize the Expressway.

#### 3. Budget.

Since an estimate of cost is a required for a MPO to add a project to it's Long Range Transportation Plan (LRTP) or it's Transportation Improvement Program (TIP), it is necessary to develop an estimate of cost for a project based on this project scope. Building upon existing plans and cost estimates available from prior Expressway concepts, and the recent efforts by state Senator Albritton to highlight an Expressway based concept as a potential solution, engineers have produced a proof of concept that meets objectives set forth in the project scope provided here within. Cost estimates for the proof of concept were generated and are estimated at \$1.227 billion. A detailed cost estimate is provided in Exhibit B. The proof of concept represents one potential design and it will be necessary for ALDOT to produce a design that satisfactorily balances the complex array of design parameters that accompany a project of this nature. For reference purposes, the proof of concept generated by the engineering team is provided in Exhibit A.

#### 4. Funding.

Detailing source(s) of funding is required for a project to be placed on the TIP by a MPO. Ultimately, a funding plan for this project will need to be developed by ALDOT in parallel with the development of a more detailed project. Generally speaking, the project is intended to be funded utilizing state funding, Federal Grant programs (e.g., INFRA) and federal financing programs (e.g. TIFIA, private activity bonds). Given the large scale nature and cost of this project, it is understood that ALDOT, together with the executive and legislative branches of the state, will need to work to identify and earmark funding, likely consisting of a combination of one-time allocations as well as recurring funding sources, for construction of the project, with the hope that the project can be funded without the use of tolling.

#### 5. Legacy Routes.

(i) Free and available. The existing Interstate 10 route across Mobile Bay (the "Bayway") together with the I-10 tunnel traversing the Mobile River (the "Wallace tunnel") as well as the US Highway 90/98 route across Mobile Bay (the "Causeway") together with the US Highway 90/98 tunnel traversing the Mobile River (the "Bankhead tunnel") (collectively, the "Legacy Routes") shall remain inplace, in-service and usable by the public without any toll or fee.

(ii) Maintenance. No restrictions may be placed that prevent maintenance of the Legacy Routes to ensure that they remain in good working order.

(iii) Substitution of Free Routes. In the unlikely event it becomes necessary to remove one or more of the Legacy Routes from service, or a portion thereof, due to (i) costs to repair Legacy routes become economically undesirable; (ii) federal requirements prevent the continued use of a particular route or structure; or (iii) the State of Alabama determines it to be advantageous to abandon any portion of the Legacy Routes for any reason, the Legacy Routes being removed from service shall be replaced equivalent with a new route of a similar travel path and travel time with equal or greater traffic capacity. The replacement route shall be subject to the same provisions as the original Legacy Route being replaced.


