I'm happy to report that Munis has expanded options for payment processing and you will be able to have a much smoother process starting in July to conveniently pay bills online. Thanks to Kim, our City treasurer!

The Class of 2020 had their Graduation ceremony this past Tuesday at the Fairhope stadium – the rain held off and it wasn't even that hot.

I want to congratulate this class once again as they persevered through a global pandemic and adapted to a new way of learning in the process.

## A few dept updates

#### Recreation:

- 1. The Recreation Center is back to normal hours of operation including Saturday and Sundays. We are still practicing social distancing in the fitness room and sanitizing the equipment every hour. Some of the classes have resumed and others are still being done virtually on our Facebook page. The Nursery is back open and available. Basketball and racquetball are open for individual play only.
- 2. The Indoor Pool is back to normal hours. We are still asking that you call in to reserve a time to swim. The swim team started up practicing this week and are following the guidelines we have set forth with limited numbers in the building and restrictions on swimmers per lane. 
