In a <u>non-political way</u>, it is my hope we can make things happen that best serve all people regardless of ethnic background, status and/or political persuasion.



Orrville dedicates bald eagle statue to those who serve and their families

ORRVILLE — Bob Weltlich wanted to recognize all of those who serve to protect the safety and freedom of their community but more so, their families who wait at home, not knowing whether their loved ones will return home at the end of the day.

Weltlich, who grew up in Orrville but lives in southern Alabama, reached out to Mayor Dave Handwerk about six months ago with the idea to pay tribute to servicemen and women in the military, the community's first responders and those who don't necessarily wear a uniform but find themselves on the front lines of today's greatest dangers.

The city of Orrville, Orrville Exchange Club and Orrville Veterans of Foreign Wars brought Weltlich's idea to fruition and presented it to the public Thursday outside City Hall — a statue of a majestic bald eagle perched on a branch with an American Flag in its claws.

A plaque reads: "Dedicated to honor those and their families who serve to protect our safety and freedoms."

"The eagle has landed," said Jim Clymer, representing the Orrville Exchange Club.

Bob Hollwager, commander of the Orrville VFW, added: "It didn't take 30 seconds to receive approval from the board" to take part in this project.

The city service department transformed a former landscaped plot for the statue and used old bricks that previously were on Main Street. The department also fixed the eagle when it arrived damaged. The eagle was mounted Tuesday. A student of history, Weltlich began to wonder why those who die in battle are honored and celebrated for their service more than those who lived, sacrificed and served. Not to diminish the ultimate sacrifice made by those who died in battle, he only wished the ones who return from war or face dangerous situations at home be paid the same respect.

"In many instances, the bad guys are receiving more attention than the good guys," he said.

The "good guys" he wished to recognize may wear a uniform such as police officers, firefighters, emergency medical technicians, doctors, nurses, and other first responders. They also are the teachers and security guards charged to protect children in school, volunteers who arrive after a natural disaster, and the bystander who "acts instinctively to danger."

Then, there are their families.

"The families of those who protect us on a daily basis. Imagine their angst and stress and concerns each day when a spouse, a mother, a father, a son or daughter leaves for work in the uncertain world we live in," Weltlich said.

His hope is the "eagle with the flag" will serve as a timeless memorial and remind the public of the few who served and are serving to protect them all.

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Cleaning and Maintaining

Outdoor Bronze Statues

One of the wonderful things about bronze sculptures is that they need little care or maintenance and will last for hundreds of years. Recently, I have seen some bronze dealers offering special cleaning solutions, polishing oils and other equipment to care for bronze sculptures. Well, to put it bluntly, that is hogwash, bunk, malarkey, baloney, and just plain not true. In fact, those things are more likely to do harm to your fine bronze sculpture than help it. Even common sense should tell you that if you put oil on a sculpture it is just going to collect dust and dirt. When I was in the Navy we used polishing oil to get brass to a high shine, but if you use that same oil on a bronze sculpture you are just going to remove the patina and destroy your sculpture.

Before opening our art gallery I was a bronze collector for more than 20 years and read much on the care and cleaning of bronze sculptures. In additon, our company has been involved in several restoration projects of outdoor bronze statues that actually did need some work, but I can tell you that none of the materials included funky cleaning solutions or exotic oils. However, before writing this piece I read several books on the topic including "The Care of Bronze Sculpture" by Patrick Kipper, which is available on www.Amazon.com. Then, I spoke with several bronze artists to get their recommendations. Finally, I spoke with two bronze foundry managers to get their feedback. What I discovered is that there is a lot of misinformation out there and yes some dishonest dealers that would like to sell you additional cleaning products at outrageous markups. So, I'm going to set the record straight and give you the straight scoop on the care and cleaning of bronze sculptures.

First, it is important to point out that bronze is a copper alloy (a metal created by the combination of other metals). In the United States the minimum copper content for bronze is 90%. In far-eastern countries such as Thailand and China, bronze has a copper content of between 60-70% and that is recycled copper from radiators, pipes, etc. So, what I am going to describe here only applies to quality bronze sculptures and statues.

The very last step in creating a bronze sculpture is to apply a coat of wax. This is usually done when the metal is still warm and allows for the wax to enter the pores of the bronze. The wax acts as a barrier to the air and humidity that can cause the bronze to oxidize and turn green. While that green look may appeal to some, others prefer to keep their sculptures looking new for as long as possible.

Unless the sculpture has been cleaned aggressively, the initial wax coating should last at least three months outdoors and probably much longer. However, differences in weather conditions can vary greatly, so a good rule of thumb is that if the water no longer beads up on the sculpture it is time to give it a cleaning and waxing.

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The best cleaner for bronze sculptures (now get ready) is plain soap and water. I read and was told several times that the best cleaner is just a little mild soap, like lvory liquid dishwashing soap and water. Just avoid any soaps with scents like lemon scent or other additives that might have unknown consequences. Also, I was told that if you have water "issues" in your area you might like to use distilled bottled water. But in most situation a hose or bucket of regular tap water is fine. Just add enough soap to make bubbles in the water because all you really need to do is loosen the dirt from the surface.

If you are cleaning an outdoor sculpture just add just enough soap to a bucket of water that it has some bubbles floating on top. Too much soap could leave a soap residue that will require more rinsing later. Then dampen a clean rag in the soapy water and wipe down the sculpture. If the piece has a lot of nooks and crannies or bird droppings, a soft toothbrush might be useful. I keep an old tooth brush in my cleaning supplies just for this purpose.

I've seen some hack bronze sculpture dealers selling non-ionic cleaning solutions that are supposedly Ph balanced. My experience in over 25 years of collecting bronze sculpture says that is completely unnecessary. Think about it. If you need to control the Ph of the water you clean the sculpture with what is the rain going to do to it. Do you think the clouds test the Ph before raining on your sculpture? If you need to Ph balance the cleaning solution for a bronze sculpture you might want to consider buying a higher quality sculpture.

Once the sculpture is clean, rinse out the rag and wipe down the sculpture with clear water to remove the scap residue. Again, use the toothbrush with clear water to clean hard to reach areas. If you have access to a hose near the sculpture this will work great to make sure the scap is completely removed. <u>Next, allow the sculpture to dry completely. This is very important because the next step is to rewax the sculpture and you don't want to trap moisture under the wax coating.</u> Usually a sculpture is dry in a couple of hours.

Once the sculpture is completely dry you are ready to begin waxing. It is best to wax an outdoor sculpture in the heat of the day as this allows the wax to penetrate the pours of the sculpture resulting in a wax coating that will last longer. The best type of wax to use is plain, clear, paste wax. It usually comes in a can and is very inexpensive. Avoid automotive waxes as they usually contain other cleaners, etc. that could be harmful to bronze. But most importantly, car waxes tend to dry white, so if you leave any at all in little cracks or crevasses it will dry white and look terrible and you'll have to start all over again. Although there are many good brands of wax, I'm going to discuss four.

Trewax Clear Paste Wax: Trewax is a very hard carnauba wax, which is extracted from Brazilian Palm Trees. One can should last you many years. It comes highly recommended for its durability and versatility on light or dark patinas. You can buy it online from <u>Acme Hardware</u> for \$5.75 at the time of this writing.

Johnson's Clear Paste Wax: Good old Johnson's Clear Paste Wax also comes highly recommended. Until I learned about Trewax, Johnson's was my wax of preference. It is best used on darker patinas as it has been known to darken lighter colors. It also produces a nice shine when buffed. You can purchase it in most grocery stores for under \$10.00 for a 1-pound can. I just saw it online for \$7.68 at USA Hardware.

Mohawk Blue Label Paste Wax: Blue Label Paste wax was recommended by several sources. It is safe for most patinas and buffs out clean. It is very difficult to find in a retail store, but I was able to find it online for \$10.44 a can. <u>Click here</u> for the web site.

Renaissance Wax: Renaissance Wax is the Cadillac of paste waxes. It is a microcrystalline wax polish that is manufactured in England and is used by museum curators around the word to protect bronze as well as swords and other metal artifacts. It dries very hard and very quickly. Most importantly it is resistant to

I BASIC PURPOSE OF THE POSITION

Performs a variety of technical and administrative tasks related to growing and maintaining plants on for all landscaped areas of the City. To supervise the daily plant propagation, planting, landscaping and maintenance operations of the Horticulture Division of the Public Works Department; will also involve planning, budgeting, procurement, scheduling, planting and maintaining the City's flowerbeds, boxes, and rose gardens.

II DISTINGUISHING CHARACTERISTICS OF THIS POSITION

This is a highly responsible position that requires extensive education, knowledge, talent and experience in landscape planting and maintenance, employee management, communication, organization and administration skills as well as education in herbicide and pesticide applications. This position requires extensive organizational skills and an ability to give attention to details concerning the overall aesthetic of the City.

III ESSENTIAL FUNCTIONS AND RESPONSIBILITIES

- Planning and Ordering of required plant material to meet growth and planting cycles
- Budget planning and controls
- Planting and directing others in the planting of landscape materials;

- Detecting and treating fungus or insect growth on flowers and shrubs
- Pruning and care of roses on a regular basis
- Designing flower beds and other Landscape features
- Mixing and applying chemicals
- Applying herbicides and grass, shrubs and beds

- Planting trees, shrubs and flowers at correct depths

- Ensuring that plants do not have dead leaves, flowers or stalks in beds

- Operating various kinds of landscaping equipment, such as weed eaters, edgers, blowers, hedge trimmers, pole saws and chainsaws, etc.
- Pruning shrubs at correct and appropriate heights
- Assuring work areas are clean
- Respond to Tree trimming and tree removal applications
- Answer and return phone calls
- Meet with business owners and residents concerning tree care
- Inspecting trees on city owned property and organizing work to be performed
- Diagnosing and treating diseased or damaged trees, plants and shrubs

IV OTHER DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

- Attend City Council meetings and present horticulture plans and budget recommendations as necessary.
- Perform related duties and responsibilities as required.
- Remain subject to recall to work during hurricane or other emergency incidents
- Assisting with Special events, as needed
- Assist other duties of the public works department including sanitation, streets and construction
- Public Outreach and Education serve on volunteer committees, work with schools, speak with Civic Organizations, etc.

- Extensive knowledge in the application and use of chemical herbicides and pesticides
- Extensive knowledge of the proper planting techniques for various landscape materials

- Ability to read maps and apply city's tree ordinance if necessary
- Ability to correctly apply mulch
- Ability to determine appropriate watering of plants
- Knowledge of city streets, rights of way, parks and property
- Ability to prune different types of plants at appropriate points (depending upon species)
- Knowledge of plant maturity heights and levels of growth
- Knowledge of plant setting
- Ability to recognize plant diseases and insects

VI ACCEPTABLE EDUCATION, EXPERIENCE AND TRAINING

The minimum requirement for a position as horticulturist is a bachelor's degree in botany, plant science or a related field and three or more years of experience in commercial or public horticulture work environment, preferably in an Alabama municipal setting, or an equivalent combination of education and experience to provide sufficient evidence of the successful performance of the essential elements of the job such as those listed above.

Possession and maintenance of a valid Alabama Drivers' License is required.

VII EXTENT OF PUBLIC CONTACT

VIII PHYSICAL DEMANDS

The City Council met in a Work Session at 4:30 p.m., Fairhope Municipal Complex Council Chamber, 161 North Section Street, Fairhope, Alabama 36532, on Monday, 22 February 2021.

Present were Council President Jack Burrell (arrived at 4:34 p.m.), Councilmembers: Corey Martin, Jimmy Conyers, Robert Brown, and Kevin Boone, Mayor Sherry Sullivan, City Attorney Marcus E. McDowell, and City Clerk Lisa A. Hanks.

Council President Burrell called the meeting to order at 4:36 p.m.

The following topics were discussed:

- The first item on the Agenda was the Discussion for the FY 2021 Recreational Trails Program Grant. Mayor Sullivan said that Councilmembers Martin and Brown; and City Staff have met with group for discussions. Council President Burrell said we need to decide on conservation easement or park (dedicating as parklands); and said he was in favor going after the grant and for this land to be parklands in perpetuity. Councilmember Martin agreed with Council President Burrell; and said he was good to move forward with grant. Councilmember Conyers asked how specific we needed to be for grant. Public Works Director Richard Johnson stated the grant is for a 1.5 mile multiuse train on outside perimeter and leaves interior open. He said access would be on Veterans Drive; trailhead with parking; and sidewalk to continue to Eastern Shore Trail. Mayor Sullivan commented this is the first step using this land. Councilmember Boone questioned the 27 percent and not 20 percent for matching funds. Mr. Johnson replied if we keep engineering to 10 percent, it will hold our match at \$100,000.00.
- Council President Burrell brought up the discussion for Airport Authority Items; and mentioned the bond refinancing with only a 1.14% interest which would enable paying off note quicker. He discussed the possibility of hiring a consultant to go after grants and manage the airport as well as write grants and other duties. Councilmember Martin said this is URG Consulting with 20 years' experience who would seek grants and possibly become manager. Council President Burrell said this would be a \$21,000.00 investment for 6 months; and if this works, it would help the airport become self-sufficient. Councilmember Martin mentioned a Command Center at the airport. Council President Burrell and Councilmember Martin as about the Cares Act funds that the airport sought; and asked City Treasurer Kim Creech to research. The consensus of the City Council was to put this on the March 8, 2021 agenda.
- Councilmember Martin mentioned the Fairhope Environmental Advisory Board appointments on the agenda; and gave an update for the Recreation Board.

- Councilmember Conyers commented that the Library Board asked him to reach out to the City Council regarding a 2 percent increase for their employees. He said they wanted the appropriation increased to pay this 2 percent increase. Council President Burrell said if they have a sizeable amount in another account, the 2 percent could come out of that. He said once you increase the appropriation, it remains permanent. Mayor Sullivan commented during COVID-19 they could have saved since they were not open; and could possibly use that savings. Council President Burrell said that our revenues were cut by 9 to 10 percent.

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND ORDINANCE NO. 1266 AND TO REPEAL AND REPLACE ORDINCANCE NO. 1608 FAIRHOPE CODE OF ORDINANCES: ARTICLE VI, GARBAGE AND TRASH COLLECTION AND DISPOSAL, SECTION 21-75

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF FAIRHOPE, ALABAMA as follows:

Section 1. The Code of Ordinance, City of Fairhope, Alabama, Article VI, Section 21-75, is hereby amended to reflect the following:

Sec. 21-75. - Rates.

(a) In the exercise of the police power of the city and for the purpose of enabling the city to perform a governmental function, there is hereby fixed the following garbage service fees for every occupant within the city:

Apartment House	\$ 20.00
House Trailer	\$ 20.00
Backdoor Service	\$ 23.00
NONRESIDENTIAL	PER MONTH

Minimum 2X per week)	
Each Additional 96 Gal. Receptac	le \$ 5.00
Example – 3 Receptacles	\$ 40.00

(b) Nothing shall prevent an occupant from contracting for garbage service with other licensed collectors within the city; however, the minimum monthly charge must be paid the city by every occupant.

(c) Acquiring garbage containers. Newly annexed properties or newly built homes may acquire a garbage container by contacting the utilities department at city hall and paying a deposit fee set by the current deposit rate. At time of turning utilities on and paying deposits, residents may sign up for a forty-eight-gallon, sixty-four-gallon, and ninety-six-gallon container. The container will have an assigned serial number to the particular address.

(d) Alleyway services. Garbage may be serviced in alleyways but may incur additional charges if the alleys or containers are not accessible to the automated garbage truck. Rates in these areas could be higher if a special truck is needed to service garbage.

Section 2. The above amended garbage rates shall go into effect on April 1, 2021.

Section 3. Ordinance No. 1608 is hereby repealed; and Ordinance No. 1266 is hereby amended as stated above.

Section 4. This ordinance shall take effect on April 1, 2021 upon its due adoption and publication as required by law.

Section 1. <u>Findings</u>. The Council has ascertained and does hereby find and declare that the following facts are true and correct:

(a) The Fairhope Airport Authority (the "Authority") has heretofore issued and delivered its \$8,845,000.00 Airport Improvement Bonds, Series 2007 (the "Series 2007 Bonds"), the proceeds of which were used to pay the costs of (i) acquiring two parcels of real property (the "Property") located around and adjacent to the site of the existing operations of the municipal airport within the City (the "Airport") for future expansion of the Airport including, but not limited to, extending the existing runway and/or constructing a new runway at the airport, constructing a terminal facility, providing a noise reduction buffer area, and constructing parking and general landscape improvements; (ii) constructing and improving taxiways at the Airport; and (iii) refinancing a loan previously made to construct and acquire hangars for general use by aircraft owners and operators (the "2007 Improvements")

(b) In connection with the issuance of the Series 2007 Bonds the Authority requested that the City assist the Authority in financing the 2007 Project by entering into that certain Appropriation Agreement dated as of March 1, 2007 (the "2007 Appropriation Agreement") pursuant to which the City agreed to appropriate funds to the Authority on a limited, annual basis and in amounts referable to certain payments and other costs owed by the Authority in connection with the Series 2007 Bonds.

(c) The Authority heretofore issued and delivered its \$8,935,000.00 Airport Improvement Refunding Bond, Series 2010 (the "Series 2010 Bond") in order to redeem and retire the Series 2007 Bonds, and in connection therewith the City executed that certain Appropriation Agreement pursuant to which the City agreed to appropriate funds to the Authority on a limited, annual basis and in amounts referable to the debt service requirements due under the Series 2010 Bond.

(d) The Series 2010 Bond bore interest at a variable rate, and in light of the rising interest rate environment at the time the Authority issued its fixed rate \$7,445,639.00 Airport Improvement Refunding Bond, Series 2017 (the "Series 2017 Bond"), in order to redeem and retire the Series 2010 Bond, and in

connection therewith the City entered into a Funding Agreement in order to provide the Authority funds equal to maturing installments of debt service on the Series 2017 Bond.

(e) The Series 2017 Bond bears interest at rates significantly higher than the current market interest rates and the Authority has determined to issue and deliver its fixed rate \$6,695,629.00 Airport Improvement Refunding Bond, Series 2021 (the "Series 2021 Bond") in order to redeem and retire the Series 2017 Bond, and in connection therewith the Authority has requested that the City enter into a Funding Agreement in order to provide the Authority funds equal to maturing installments of debt service on the Series 2021 Bond.

(f) The operation and expansion of the Airport has facilitated economic growth and development within the City.

(g) The Authority is a "related public corporation" as that term is defined in Chapter 63 of Title 11 of the Code of Alabama of 1975, as amended.

(h) In order to enable the improvement and expansion of the Airport, the City Council hereby deems it necessary, desirable and in the public interest that the City enter into the Appropriation Agreement, as further described below.

Section 2. <u>Approval of Funding Agreement and Related Documents</u>. Pursuant the applicable provisions of the constitution and laws of Alabama, including particularly Section 4-3-49 and Chapter 63 of Title 11 of the Code of Alabama of 1975, as amended, the Mayor and all other officers of the City are hereby authorized and directed to execute, seal, attest and deliver on behalf of the City the following:

(a) A Funding Agreement between the City and the Authority in substantially the form presented to the meeting at which this Ordinance is adopted, which form shall be attached as <u>Exhibit A</u> to the minutes of the meeting at which this Ordinance is adopted and which is hereby adopted in all respects as if set out in full in this Ordinance, with such minor changes as shall be approved by the Mayor, which approval shall be conclusively evidenced by execution of the Funding Agreement by the Mayor;

(b) Such other documents, instruments, and certificates and to take such other actions on behalf of the City as may be necessary and appropriate in connection with the sale by the Authority of the Series 2010 Bond. Section 3. <u>Provisions of Ordinance Severable</u>. The provisions of this Ordinance are hereby declared to be severable in the event that any provision hereof shall be held invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction; such invalidity shall not affect any other portion of this Ordinance.

FUNDING AGREEMENT dated March _____, 2021, between the **FAIRHOPE AIRPORT AUTHORITY**, a public corporation organized and existing under the provisions of the laws of the State of Alabama (herein sometimes called the "Authority"), and the **CITY OF FAIRHOPE**, **ALABAMA** (herein sometimes called the "City").

RECITALS:

WHEREAS, the Authority has heretofore issued and delivered its **\$8,845,000** Airport Improvement Bonds, Series 2007 (the "Series 2007 Bonds"), the proceeds of which were used to pay the costs of (i) acquiring two parcels of real property (the "Property") located around and adjacent to the site of the existing operations of the municipal airport within the City (the "Airport") for future expansion of the Airport including, but not limited to, extending the existing runway and/or constructing a new runway at the airport, constructing a terminal facility, providing a noise reduction buffer area, and constructing parking and general landscape improvements; (ii) constructing and improving taxiways at the Airport; and (iii) refinancing a loan previously made to construct and acquire hangars for general use by aircraft owners and operators (the "Improvements"); and

WHEREAS, in connection with the issuance of the Series 2007 Bonds the Authority requested that the City assist the Authority in acquiring the Property, refinancing the Loan and acquiring and constructing the Improvements by entering into that certain Appropriation Agreement dated as of March 1, 2007 (the "2007 Appropriation Agreement") pursuant to which the City agreed to appropriate funds to the Authority on a limited, annual basis and in amounts referable to certain payments and other costs owed by the Authority to Allied Irish Banks p.l.c. in connection with the Series 2007 Bonds; and

WHEREAS, the Authority heretofore issued and delivered its \$8,935,000 Airport Improvement Refunding Bond, Series 2010 (the "Series 2010 Bond") in order to redeem and retire the Series 2007 Bonds, and in connection therewith the City executed that certain Appropriation Agreement dated ______, 2010 (the "2010 Appropriation Agreement") pursuant to which the City agreed to appropriate funds to the Authority on a limited, annual basis and in amounts referable to the debt service requirements due under the Series 2010 Bond; and WHEREAS, the Series 2010 Bond bore interest at a variable rate, and in light of the rising interest rate environment at the time the Authority issued its fixed rate \$7,445,639 Airport Improvement Refunding Bond, Series 2017 (the "Series 2017 Bond"), in order to redeem and retire the Series 2010 Bond, and in connection therewith the City entered into a Funding Agreement (the "2017 Funding Agreement") in order to provide the Authority funds equal to maturing installments of debt service on the Series 2017 Bond; and

WHEREAS, the Series 2017 bears interest at rates significantly higher than the current market interest rates and the Authority and the City have determined that the Authority issue and deliver its fixed rate \$6,695,629 Airport Improvement Refunding Bond, Series 2021 (the "Series 2021 Bond") in order to redeem and retire the Series 2017 Bond, and in connection therewith the Authority has requested that the City enter into this Funding Agreement in order to provide the Authority funds equal to maturing installments of debt service on the Series 2021 Bond; and

WHEREAS, the operation and expansion of the Airport has facilitated economic growth and development within the City, and the City has determined to enter into this Funding Agreement with the Authority.

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the respective agreements on the part of the Authority and the City herein contained, the Authority and the City do hereby agree as follows:

Section 1. Funding Agreement Term. The Authority and the City hereby covenant and agree that this Finding Agreement shall be in full force and effect from the date of execution and delivery hereof through and including payment in full of the Series 2021 Bond.

Section 2. Payment Provisions. The City hereby covenants and agrees, on or before the dates specified or otherwise referenced on Exhibit A, to pay to the Authority, in immediately available funds, an amount sufficient to enable the Authority to make the payments of principal and interest with respect to the Series 2021 Bond as set forth on Exhibit A hereto and made a part hereof as if set forth in full herein. By the execution and delivery hereof, the City approves the terms and conditions of said borrowing by the Authority. The obligation of the City to make the payments provided for herein shall be absolute and unconditional, irrespective of any rights of set-off, recoupment or counterclaim it might otherwise have against the Authority.

Section 3. General Obligation Pledge. The obligation on the part of the City to pay the amounts required to be paid and to perform the agreements on the part of the City herein required to be performed hereunder shall be a general obligation of the City for which the City pledges its full faith and credit.

Section 4. Authority. This Funding Agreement is being entered into pursuant to authority conferred upon the City by the Constitution and laws of the State of Alabama, including, without limitation, Chapter 63 of Title 11 of the Code of Alabama 1975, as amended. The Authority agrees to comply with the provisions of said Constitution and laws, including the provisions of the said Chapter 63 in the receipt and application of amounts paid by the City to the Authority pursuant to the provisions of this Funding Agreement.

Section 5. Third Party Beneficiaries: Assignment. The holder of the Series 2021 Bond is hereby designated as a third-party beneficiary of this Funding Agreement. This Funding Agreement and the Authority's rights to receive amounts from the City pursuant to this Funding Agreement may be assigned and pledged by the Authority to any holder of the Series 2021 Bond as security for the Series 2021 Bond. This Funding Agreement shall not be assigned by the City, and any instrument purporting or attempting to assign the interest of the City hereunder shall be void.

Section 6. City and Holder Consent to Amendment of Series 2021 Bond. Section 9. Severability. In the event that any provision of this Funding Agreement shall be held invalid or unenforceable by any court of competent jurisdiction, such provision shall be deemed and construed to be severable from the remaining provisions of this Funding Agreement with the intended result that such holding shall not invalidate or render unenforceable any other provisions of this Funding Agreement.
