#### **DYAS TRIANGLE - RECOMMENDED DEED PROHIBITIONS**

**Mission:** To preserve and protect the property known as the Dyas Triangle to be used as public parkland for the enjoyment of the community in a natural state and with protection of the environment, natural resources, and animal habitat as the priority.

**Prohibitions:** In accordance with the mission, we suggest the following prohibitions:

- 1. Any commercial or industrial use of the property.
- 2. The placement or construction of any buildings other than restroom facilities.
- 3. Removing, destroying, or cutting of trees, shrubs or other vegetation, except as required for a) fire breaks, b) maintenance of designated trails and habitat, or c) prevention or treatment of disease.
- 4. Disposal or dumping of waste, refuse, or debris on property.
- 5. The above-ground installation of communication towers, antennas, and related facilities unless constructed in a manner to preserve the environmental aesthetic.
- 6. The exploration for, or development and extraction of, any minerals and hydrocarbons by any mining or extraction method.
- 7. Any alteration of the surface of the land including excavation or removal of soil, sand, gravel, rock, etc. unless directly tied to habitat or watershed restoration and management.
- 8. Any use or activity that causes or is likely to cause significant soil degradation or erosion or significant pollution of any surface or subsurface waters.
- 9. Any maintenance of the property that is inconsistent with the mission and environmental management plan established for the property.
- 10. Use of motorized and/or battery powered vehicle on the property other than mobility devices for disabled individuals, with the exception of maintenance vehicles and emergency services.
- 11. The placement of any above ground utility infrastructure larger than a total of 0.25 acres. Minor utility infrastructure less than 0.25 acres must be located adjacent to exterior boundaries/concentrated in the right-of-way and must be obscured and constructed in a manner to preserve the environmental aesthetic.
- 12. The introduction of any non-native vegetation to the property.
- 13. Manipulating, impounding, or altering of the natural watercourse of Fly Creek unless associated with watershed restoration.
- 14. The permanent installation of artificial lighting anywhere on the property except in parking lot and restroom facilities.

### Good Afternoon!

We did make some of these prohibitions broad - at one point we started listing everything we didn't want to see in there, but then realized we were running the risk of leaving something out. So we then decided to focus on defining compatibility with the mission statement and philosophy of the designated land use. The specificity of each and every allowed/disallowed use and how the park will be run would be hashed out in the Park's Ecosystem and Recreation Management Plan.

So, in answer to some of your comments regarding the recommended deed prohibitions, please see below in bold type...

- 1. Ok (define commercial, is hosting a wedding at a garden a commercial venture if they rent the space?)
  We assume that COF Ordinance 1575 (COF Park Usage) covers rules related to gatherings, fees, and required permits in public spaces and does not need to be restated here. The intent of this prohibition is to keep the area "natural," nuisance-free, and public, whereby no commercial entity can make money off of community property and people can enjoy a free space. If an outdoor pavilion is constructed, the Park Ecosystem and Recreation Management Plan can define specific, non-commercial uses for that pavilion and the protocol by which to attain/schedule them.
- 2. What about a nature center, kiosk, additional restrooms? (I agree, we might have a visitors entrance/center in the future)
  - The mission of the park is to provide park space "in a natural state with protection of the environment, natural resources, and animal habitat as the priority" for the People of Fairhope. We assumed that a developed bathroom facility would be placed at the parking lot and no other buildings would be permitted as to preserve that natural space/feeling of nature. We defined a building as a roof with walls; thus, a kiosk with trail, natural resources, and other information is not a building and would be located at the parking area as well. We do not recommend that a "nature center" facility is needed here as there are several already existing in the area (Weeks Bay, Pelican's Nest) and, ultimately, this is not a large space. The size of this location requires that a Park Ecosystem and Recreation Management Plan take a hard look at compatibility between uses and we caution using this space to be too many things.
- 3. Do not agree, should say with permission of City horticulturalist or tree committee. (or a trail, bike trail, ped trail, picnic area)
  - If necessary, we recommend the following addition: "All vegetation management will be performed as prescribed in the Park Ecosystem and Recreation Management Plan and enacted by qualified agents operating under the guidance of that Plan." However, this notion is covered in prohibition 9, which explicitly states that all actions within the park link back to the mission and Management Plan prescribed for this location. The intent of this prohibition is to ensure that it maintains as a natural area, showcasing species that are native and appropriate for this region/location, and that no collecting, harvesting, or other commercial venture be allowed.
- 4. What about clean-up and putting debris out for pick-up? (does placing trash in a receptacle fit that definition?)

  This prohibition deals with illegal dumping. Likewise it was envisioned to ensure that it did not become a

dump or staging area (especially as a holding area for storm debris) that may damage or hinder the effectiveness of the ecosystem restoration and watershed function. Certainly trash and debris pickup is necessary at this location and pickup process would be incorporated into the final design.

That is a good point. However, it is not anticipated that trail construction should require excavation. May want to add, "Minimal ground disturbance is anticipated during initial trail development as identified in the Park Development Plan or ongoing maintenance as prescribed in Park Ecosystem and Recreation Management Plan."

This prohibition is SPECIFICALLY written to apply to the construction of trails. Considering that this location is directly adjacent to Fly Creek and has highly erodible soils, it is crucial that all trails are designed, constructed, and used in a manner that does NOT promote or accelerate soil degradation or erosion.

The City Council, City of Fairhope, met in regular session at 6:00 p.m., Fairhope Municipal Complex Council Chamber, 161 North Section Street, Fairhope, Alabama 36532, on Monday, 15 November 2021.

Present were Council President Jack Burrell, Councilmembers: Corey Martin, Jimmy Conyers, Jay Robinson, and Kevin Boone, Mayor Sherry Sullivan, Attorney Marion E. "Tut" Wynne, City Attorney Marcus E. McDowell (Arrived at 6:25 p.m.), and City Clerk Lisa A. Hanks.

There being a quorum present, Council President Burrell called the meeting to order. The invocation was given by Pat Davey, Assistant Pastor of Eastern Shore Presbyterian Church, and the Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

Council President Burrell stated there was a need to add on an agenda item after Agenda Item Number 26: a request by Lee Walker, Fairhope Sunset Rotary Club Foundation, requesting permission the use of the City streets for a fundraising event that will benefit the Fairhope-Point Clear Rotary Youth Club on Saturday, January 15, 2022 for the Annual 0.5K Charity Run in Fairhope from 3:00 p.m. to 3:30 p.m.

Councilmember Boone moved to add on the above-mentioned item not on the printed agenda. Seconded by Councilmember Robinson, motion passed unanimously by voice vote.

Council President Burrell stated the next item on the agenda is the election for a Council President and Council President Pro Tempore. Council President opened the floor for Council President nominations. Councilmember Martin nominated Councilmember Conyers. Seconded by Councilmember Robinson and no other nominations were made. The floor for nominations was then closed. Councilmember Conyers was elected Council President unanimously by voice vote.

Council President Conyers took the presider's seat. The floor was then opened for Council President Pro Tempore nominations. Councilmember Burrell nominated Councilmember Robinson. Seconded by Councilmember Martin and no other nominations were made. The floor for nominations was then closed. Councilmember Robinson was elected Council President Pro Tempore unanimously by voice vote.

Councilmember Martin moved to approve minutes of the 25 October 2021, regular meeting; minutes of the 25 October 2021, work session; and minutes of the 25 October 2021, agenda meeting. Seconded by Councilmember Boone, motion passed unanimously by voice vote.

Mayor Sullivan addressed the City Council and presented the 2021 Veteran of the Year to Doug Mansmann. She said the former Veterans of the Year make up the Committee that chose Mr. Mansmann; and hopefully some are in the audience tonight. She said this award is voted by his peers. Mr. Mansmann thanked the Committee for choosing him for this award.

Mayor Sullivan recognized Joanne Brown who made wreaths for the Police Department, Fairhope Volunteer Fire Department, and our Healthcare Workers. She presented the Mayor with a wreath with all three color ribbons for each category mentioned above. Mayor Sullivan mentioned the following other items: Junior City Council; Tree Lighting Celebration; Movie in the Streets; Open House this weekend; and Christmas Parade on December 3, 2021.

Special Projects and Grant Manager Jessica Walker addressed the City Council and presented this year's Junior City Council. Mayor Sullivan said they are working on many projects for the City.

Chief Stephanie Hollinghead addressed the City Council and presented the Police Department's Officer of the Quarter to Tyler Sellers who is a third generation Police Officer and has been an Officer for 12 years. Chief Hollinghead mentioned Officer Sellers being a Traffic Homicide Investigator who is a dedicated employer and full of compassion. She said this is the third quarter for the Officer of the Quarter.

Councilmember Burrell said he was excited about sitting here now. He thanked the City Council for allowing him to serve nine years. Councilmember Burrell said he has heard rumors that he was stepping down; but stated he was not resigning.

Councilmember Martin commented Councilmember Burrell has done an outstanding job; and should be given kudos for his time and commitment. Councilmember Martin stated his service was a job well done.

Councilmember Robinson echoed Councilmember Martin's comments. He said this position takes heat from citizens and others more than other positions. Councilmember Robinson thanked Councilmember Burrell for his service as Council President.

Councilmember Boone said he greatly appreciates a job well done for nine years.

Council President Conyers said he has big shoes to fill; and he has known Councilmember Burrell for 20 years. He thanked Councilmember Burrell for his service and said he did a tremendous job. Council President Conyers said that the Burrell family are know for their community service.

Councilmember Robinson moved for final adoption of Ordinance No. 1733, an ordinance to amend Zoning Ordinance No. 1253 and to rezone the property of Anthony Tkae and Kristin Kalmbacher from R-4 Low Density Multi-Family Residential District to R-3 TH High Density Single-Family Townhouse Residential District. The property generally located at the east terminus of Gaston Avenue and on the east sided of South Section Street, at 211 South Section Street, Fairhope, Alabama. PPIN Number: 41038. Introduced at the October 25, 2021 City Council Meeting) Seconded by Councilmember Martin, motion for final adoption passed by the following voice votes: AYE – Burrell, Martin, Conyers, Robinson, and Boone. NAY - None.

Councilmember Robinson introduced in writing, and moved for the adoption of the following resolution, a resolution that the City Council hereby authorizes submission of an FY22 ATRIP-II Grant to ALDOT requesting grant funds to construct dedicated left and right turn lanes on Volanta Avenue at the intersection with Greeno Road (U.S. Highway 98), acceleration/deceleration lanes on US Hwy 98 and signalize the intersection; and authorizes the Mayor to sign all required grant application documents on behalf of the City. The grant is being submitted as an 80/20 match with an estimated project cost of \$1,364,903.00: Grant will fund \$1,109,903.00 and the City will fund the preliminary Engineering Design, ALDOT PE Review, and Utility Relocation Cost (Fees estimated to be \$255,000.00). Seconded by Councilmember Burrell, motion passed unanimously by voice vote.

# AUTHORIZING THE SUBMISSION OF AN FY 2022 ALABAMA TRANSPORTATION REHABILITATION AND IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM- II (ATRIP-II) GRANT APPLICATION

WHEREAS, the Alabama Department of Transportation (ALDOT) is accepting applications from municipal governments for Fiscal Year 2022 Alabama Transportation Rehabilitation and Improvement Program- II (ATRIP-II) Grants; and

WHEREAS, the City of Fairhope has identified the need to construct dedicated left and right turn lanes on Volanta Avenue at the intersection with Greeno Road (U.S. Highway 98), acceleration/deceleration lanes on US Hwy 98 and signalize the intersection; and

WHEREAS, the total project cost is estimated to be \$1,364,903.00, and, if funded, the grant will pay for 100% of Construction and CE&I Cost at an estimated \$1,109,903.00 and the City would cover 100% of the Preliminary Engineering, ALDOT PE Review and Utility Relocation Cost at an estimated \$255,000.00; resulting in an approximate 81.3/18.7 project cost share; and

**WHEREAS**, if funded, the City will see this project through to completion and will be responsible for providing long-term maintenance of the new facilities;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF FAIRHOPE, IN REGULAR SESSION ASSEMBLED, that the City of Fairhope authorizes submission of an FY22 ATRIP-II Grant to ALDOT requesting grant funds to construct dedicated left and right turn lanes on Volanta Avenue at the intersection with Greeno Road (U.S. Highway 98), acceleration/deceleration lanes on US Hwy 98 and signalize the intersection.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, that the City Council authorizes the Mayor to sign all required grant application documents on behalf of the City.

#### ORDINANCE NO. \_\_\_\_

#### AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 1510 KNOWN AS THE PERSONNEL RULES, POLICIES AND PROCEDURES ORDINANCE

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FAIRHOPE ALABAMA, as follows:

Section 1. The ordinance known as the Personnel Rules, Policies, and Procedures Ordinance (No. 1510), adopted 14 April 2014, together with the Personnel Handbook of the City of Fairhope, be and the same hereby is changed and altered in respect to the certain sections below:

Add the following to:

#### VI. EMPLOYEE BENEFITS

#### **SECTION 6.10. LONGEVITY PAY**

The City provides longevity pay for regular full-time employees who have completed the required probationary period and for full-time appointed officials. Employees are eligible for longevity pay each year based on the employee's years of service from the *last* hire date. Employees must be actively employed by the City to accumulate longevity pay and do not accumulate longevity pay while on unpaid leave of absence in excess of thirty (30) days.

Employees are eligible for longevity pay as follows:

Years of Service as of October 1st	Payment
One Year to Four Years	\$250.00
Five Years to Fourteen Years	\$500.00
Fifteen Years plus	\$1,000.00

Longevity Pay will be paid to full-time employees and full-time appointed officials in December.

Section 2. The sections, paragraphs, sentences, clauses and phrases of this ordinance are severable, and if any phrase, clause, sentence, paragraph or section of this ordinance shall be declared unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, then such ruling shall not affect any other paragraphs and sections, since the same would have been enacted by the municipality council without the incorporation of any such unconstitutional phrase, clause, sentence, paragraph or section.

Section 3. This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its due adoption and publication as required by law.

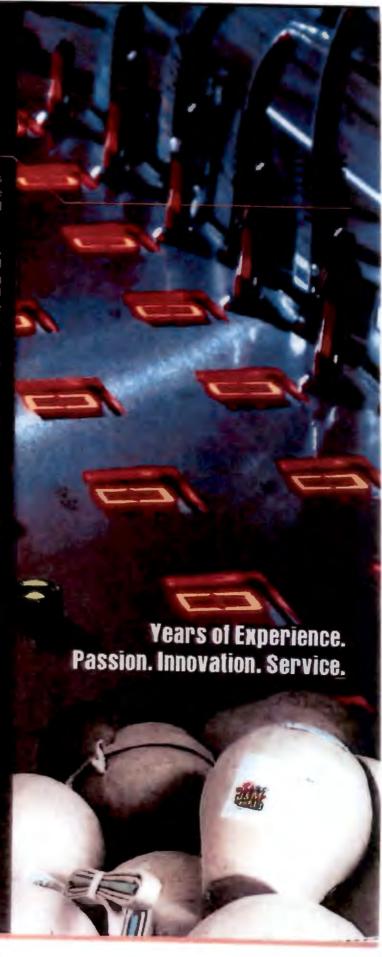

The proposal herein addresses the services to be provided by Thompson and proposed fee required to complete the scope of work.

### **Project Understanding**

On November 2, 2021, Thompson Engineering (Scott Hardy, Dave Upton, and Matt Rogers) met with the City of Fairhope (Jason Langley, Curtis Cooper, and Tim Manuel) to discuss a proposed sanitary sewer lift station to be located near the intersection of SR-181 and SR-104 at the new commercial development. This lift station will discharge into a new force main located along SR-181 and will flow south to SR-104, then west along SR-104 to CR-13, then south along CR-13 to Fairhope Avenue, and then west along Fairhope Avenue to Bishop Road where it will connect to the existing system. 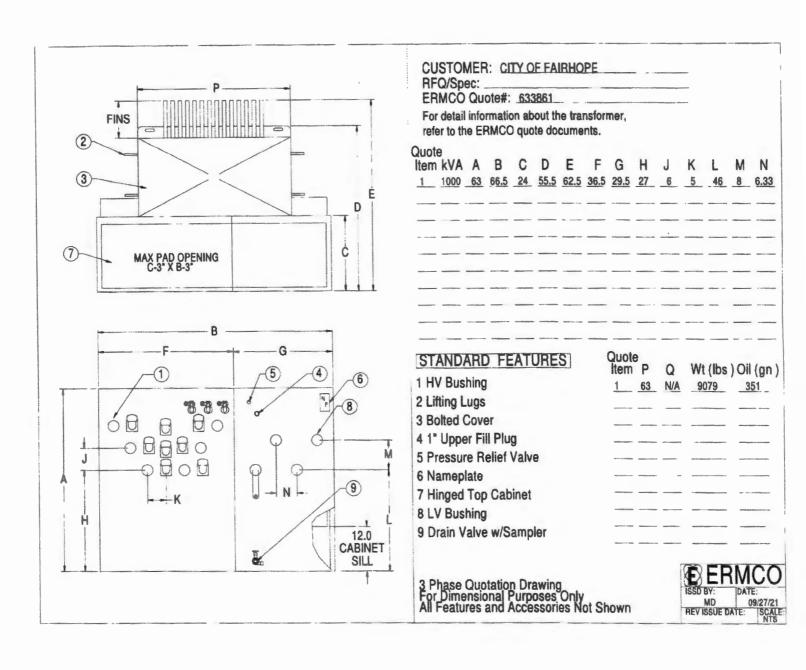

## Job Summary

Under the general supervision of the Electric Supervisor, the employee performs skilled duties to manage and direct the electrical maintenance and construction needs of various City buildings and facilities. The employee oversees the design, installation, and repair of electrical power systems, diagnoses electrical problems using diagrams or blueprints and installs and repairs electrical systems. The employee installs circuit breakers, connects electrical systems, and replaces conduits, wiring, ad circuit breakers to ensure the safe provision of electricity. This is a senior -level position, requiring master electrician certification to City of Fairhope requirements. The employee can be responsible for less experienced employees and directs the work of less experienced employees. Employee exercises independent judgment and is given latitude in completing assigned work. Work is performed under established procedures with regular inspections during progress and final inspection of completed work. This job is

considered safety-sensitive and is subject to pre-employment background check and random drug screens.

### **Essential Functions**

**ESSENTIAL FUNCTIONS:** The following list was developed through a job analysis; however, it is not exhaustive and other duties may be required and assigned. A person with a disability which is covered by the ADA must be able to perform the essential functions of the job unaided or with the assistance of a reasonable accommodation.

ESSENTIAL FUNCTION: Electrical Maintenance and Monitoring. Performs skilled electrical work at the master electrician level following accepted procedures and the National Electrical Code (NEC) in order to maintain proper operation of all electrical fixtures and services throughout City facilities.

- 1. Troubleshoots electrical system circuits, controls, and equipment to locate and correct failures.
- 2. Analyzes and repairs or replaces lighting components, electrical breakers, control boxes and wiring circuits on electrical systems and equipment, including primary and secondary power.
- Ensures electrical conduit complies with electrical codes.
- Connects electrical systems to powerlines to provide electricity to the building.
- 5. Tests electrical systems to ensure proper installation and operation.
- 6. Inspects electrical systems to determine whether repairs are needed.
- 7. Replaces conduit, wiring, and circuit breakers as needed.
- 8. Determines causes of failures, selects components, and makes repairs.
- 9. Selects replacement components and installs them.
- 10. Performs complex and routine work on single- and multi-phased power systems and components up to 600 volts.
- 11. Performs preventative and routine maintenance on City backup power generators; performs monthly generator inspections.
- 12. Operates, maintains, and repairs electrical portion of control systems, mechanical and electrical systems including digital and manual heating, ventilation, and air conditioning (HVAC) systems, boilers, lighting, refrigeration, power distribution equipment, fire alarm and suppression systems, electrical and water systems, and other equipment critical to the operation of the City.
- 13. Programs and updates control sensors, controllers, and monitoring devices.
- 14. Performs technical work including diagnosing motors for overload and failure; performs voltage and resistance tests.
- 15. Performs accurate and timely line location duties for marking electrical facilities and prevent damage.

- 16. Inspects, troubleshoots, and conducts tests; pinpoints problems using a range of testing devices.
- 17. Utilizes standard electric installation and repair equipment to perform installation, maintenance and troubleshooting procedures; uses various hand and power tools.

ESSENTIAL FUNCTION: Electrical Installation. Performs electrical installation for new construction, remodeling, and special events for City buildings and facilities in order to maintain proper operations.

- 1. Designs electrical schemes and configurations to meet customer needs.
- 2. Installs new services and equipment; runs conduit for fixtures, receptacles, control circuits, and lighting; selects and installs wires, accomplishes connections, and tests installation.
- 3. Installs code conforming electrical service and distribution components in renovated areas of City facilities.
- 4. Installs appropriate circuit breaker boxes and panels and lays out service and outlets/switches to meet code requirements.
- 5. Installs and repairs electrical wiring, systems, and fixtures in buildings; conduits and pipes to house electrical wires and cables; and circuit breakers and other electrical hardware and connects wiring to them.
- 6. Installs new circuits in accordance with applicable codes.
- 7. Selects wiring, outlets, switches, breakers, circuit protection, etc., to meet load and service demands.
- 8. Correctly sizes and installs electrical services for new or relocated equipment.
- 9. Selects conductor size, conduit or raceway, circuit protection devices and controls, and installs them according to code requirements.
- 10. Connects, disconnects, and maintains machinery and equipment, including HVAC units, shop equipment, fire alarm systems, elevators and City building lighting.
- 11. Properly connects and grounds equipment and tests electrical runs to ensure operability.
- 12. Installs temporary electric services to support City approved functions and events.

# ESSENTIAL FUNCTION: Planning and Estimating. Provides technical support in the planning and estimation of electrical maintenance work.

- 1. Plans the layout and installation of electrical wiring, equipment, and fixtures.
- 2. Complies with all safety standards and regulations of the NEC.
- 3. Plans and estimates repair jobs.
- 4. Provides and acquires quotes and materials.
- 5. Monitors and verifies that repair work performed is completed and that work meets the system requirements for safe and efficient operation.

6. Makes cost estimates of necessary repairs to be performed by division personnel and recommends repair/replace decisions.

#### **NON-ESSENTIAL FUNCTION:**

- 1. Supports other Division personnel in maintenance work.
- 2. Assists with City special events such as placing barricades and barriers.
- 3. Responds to emergency calls during hurricanes, inclement weather, or other emergency situations.
- 4. Performs other job-related duties as required or assigned.
