



LETTER FROM THE MAYOR



As we ring in 2022, the City of Fairhope will begin projects that will improve our community for years to come.

This year you will see the transformation of the alleyway at the parking garage to Arts Alley, which will bring with it a transportation hub and restroom facility and hopefully, alleviate some of the parking issues downtown.

At Gayfer Road and Greeno, turn lanes will begin to help reduce traffic that builds up and causes delays each day.

Our three major RESTORE projects will begin to move at a faster rate, allowing us to hopefully begin construction on the \$10 million sewer upgrades and the long-stalled Working Waterfront. We will also continue to engage the public for the Comprehensive Plan during the first quarter of the year.

And by Fall 2022, the Church Street Infrastructure Project will be nearing completion, allowing for upgraded utility lines and stormwater drainage systems from Oak Street to Fels Avenue.

If it seems like there's a lot going on, you're right. We are excited to see the wonderful things 2022 will bring!
