Fairhope Museum to unveil new exhibit March

The Fairhope Museum of History is thrilled to announce the opening of their newest exhibit, "Utopia on the Bay", opening to the public Friday, March 18th. This exhibit will replace the current, "Dogwoods: More Than External Beauty" exhibit located on the second floor of the museum.

"Utopia on the Bay" is an exploration of the influence of Mobile Bay on the formation of the country's oldest and largest single-tax colony and utopian experiment. In 1894, the founders of Fairhope, Alabama, sought out a location to start their utopian dream that would provide economic opportunity and inspiration for the reformers that would follow them. The eastern shore of Mobile Bay provided both.

Exhibit displays will illustrate how the bay's access to the rich veins of clay helped Fairhoper's establish themselves in the pottery industry, bay breezes and high bluffs attracted countless tourists, the magnificence of the bay ignited the imaginations of influential artists and writers, and the majestic bay boats kept it all afloat.

This new exhibit will feature interactive displays that will explore the history of the bay before colonists, when Native Americans utilized its shores. Lastly, the exhibit will examine the relationship between the people of Fairhope and the wildlife of the bay over time.

Farmer's Market begins again


