The City Council, City of Fairhope, met in regular session at 6:00 p.m., Fairhope Municipal Complex Council Chamber, 161 North Section Street, Fairhope, Alabama 36532, on Monday, 24 June 2013.

Present were Council President Jack Burrell, Councilmembers: Rich Mueller, Diana Brewer, Michael A. Ford, and Kevin Boone, Mayor Timothy M. Kant, City Attorney Marion E. Wynne, and City Clerk Lisa A. Hanks.

There being a quorum present, Council President Burrell called the meeting to order. The invocation was given by Deacon George Yeend, of St. Lawrence Catholic Church, and the Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

Council President Burrell stated there was a need to pull Agenda Item Number 6; An Ordinance regarding Security Fees for Sidewalk/Street Usage; and to add an Agenda Item after Agenda Item Number 13; a Request of First Baptist Church requesting a Brief Variance in the Noise Ordinance for a 21 Gun Salute on June 25, 2013 at the Funeral Ceremony for a War Veteran, which was explained by Chief Petties.

Councilmember Brewer moved to approve minutes of the 10 June 2013, regular meeting; minutes of the 10 June 2013, work session; and minutes of the 10 June 2013, agenda meeting. Seconded by Councilmember Mueller, motion passed unanimously by voice vote.

Councilmember Brewer addressed the City Council and introduced the Education Advisory Committee for their presentation along with principals: Patrice Krueger, Carol Broughton, and Jon Cardwell. Committee member Julia Summerlin first thanked the Mayor and Councilmembers and then announced the three principals who would give a brief presentation on how the schools were using the appropriated funds from the City. We are here to provide accountability and to show how the taxpayers' dollars are being used.

Patrice Krueger, principal of J. Larry Newton School, addressed the City Council and thanked them for their commitment to the schools. Ms. Krueger said their project is a school wide project from kindergarten through sixth grade. The project is called "One Ocean, One World." She introduced two of her teachers: Christina Stacey who teaches fifth grade and Duelah Reehl who teaches third grade. The project is based through technology and they briefly mentioned several examples included in the project: virtual field trips, Newton's own discovery channel, iPads for the school, and part of the project would be for students to come to the City Council and give reports.

Carol Broughton, principal of Fairhope Intermediate School, addressed the City Council and said their focus is on a kindergarten through twelfth grade plan. She said they have already ordered Lego robotics for their camp for ninth graders through twelfth graders. This project will be used school wide next year for the empowerment of the children. We also will have MacBooks for all teachers and geo cache systems.

Jon Cardwell, principal of Fairhope High School, addressed the City Council and explained their focus was on the sciences and mathematics; known as STEM. The students will have labs and tools to learn skills. There will be moving labs in the classroom. We now have true twenty-first century students.

Mayor Kant addressed the City Council regarding the following items:

- Mentioned it was a third grader who brought in a petition and statistics regarding smoking and this is why the City was one of the first to have no-smoking in restaurants.
- Spoke with the Chancellor of the two-year college who said with our high school and two-year college students we could do a great deal more working together. A good example is our aviation school at the airport.
- Commented that the K-1 Center could possibly be used for a
 Performing Arts School; and the Mayor of Ocean Springs invited
 us to see what they have done with their old school. We should
 see what we can do with that building for education.
- 4. Reminded everyone of the upcoming Fourth of July Celebration.

Councilmember Brewer addressed the City Council and said she would comment on the Education Advisory Committee when we get to the agenda item on EAC bylaws. She was glad that Mayor Kant has suggested that they go visit Ocean Springs to see what they have done with the building; it is identical to the K-1 building. It would be great for a Performing Arts Center and the Film Festival could tie into this as well.

Council President Burrell addressed the City Council regarding the following items:

- Mentioned the looping of the Council Chambers and that we were going forward with this project.
- Commented about the playground by the K-1 Center and we are moving forward; and the fencing on the agenda is a start.

- 3. Agreed that the K-1 Center would be a great spot for a Performing Arts Center or a Film Institute.
- 4. Announced the first Annual Invitational Golf Tournament for the Police Department would be in the fall.
- Stated that Mississippi State was in the World Series and asked for everyone to support the Bulldogs.

Councilmember Brewer introduced in writing Ordinance No. 1496, an ordinance to establish the Bylaws of the Education Advisory Committee. In order to take immediate action, Councilmember Boone moved for immediate consideration. Seconded by Councilmember Mueller, motion for immediate consideration passed unanimously by the following voice votes: AYE – Burrell, Mueller, Brewer, Ford, and Boone. NAY - None.

Councilmember Brewer said she appreciated the presentation and liked the connectivity of the schools. This was a big commitment for the City and we charged citizens to be our advisors. We need to keep education as a priority. Councilmember Brewer then moved for final adoption of Ordinance No. 1496. Seconded by Councilmember Boone, motion for final adoption passed by the following voice votes: AYE – Burrell, Mueller, Brewer, Ford, and Boone. NAY - None.

Councilmember Mueller introduced in writing, and moved for the adoption of the following resolution, a resolution to award bid for Three Fixed Permanent Backup Generator Stands for the Sewer Department to Bay South Ltd, Inc. in the amount of \$26,500.00 (Bid No. 015-13). Seconded by Councilmember Brewer, motion passed unanimously by voice vote.
