The City Council, City of Fairhope, met in regular session at 6:00 p.m., Fairhope Municipal Complex Council Chamber, 161 North Section Street, Fairhope, Alabama 36532, on Monday, 12 August 2013.

Present were Council President Pro Tem Michael A. Ford, Councilmembers: Rich Mueller, Diana Brewer, and Kevin Boone, Mayor Timothy M. Kant, City Attorney Marion E. Wynne, and City Clerk Lisa A. Hanks. Council President Jack Burrell was absent.

There being a quorum present, Council President Pro Tem Ford called the meeting to order. The invocation was given by Gray Strickland, Pastor of The Way Community Church, and the Pledge of Allegiance was recited. He mentioned the passing of Bonnie Bishop who was the wife of David Ed Bishop former City Councilmember and member of the County Commission; and mother of Jody Bishop former Municipal Judge and now Circuit Judge of Baldwin County. He asked for everyone to keep the family in their prayers.

Councilmember Brewer moved to approve minutes of the 22 July 2013, regular meeting; minutes of the 22 July 2013, work session; and minutes of the 22 July 2013, agenda meeting. Seconded by Councilmember Boone, motion passed unanimously by voice vote.

Mayor Kant addressed the City Council regarding the following items:

- Chief Joe Petties thanked the individuals who donated the money for the new Police
  Department bicycles. He then presented the City Council and Mayor Kant a framed
  picture that was designed by Kimberly Wilson who is one of our dispatchers.
  Lieutenant Fred King read the poem by Elizabeth Howard West which was used as
  part of the picture. Ms. Wilson was also given a framed picture and was thanked for
  all of her hours that she put into this picture.
- Sherry Sullivan addressed the City Council and reported that the looping of the Council Chambers was completed a couple of weeks ago and anyone with t-coil hearing aids will be able to hear the meetings. She said that Michael Cunningham from Wired for Sound was in the back with a device listening through the looping. She also said that we would be checking into possibly purchasing approximately 10 transmitters for the hearing impaired who do not have hearing aids.
- Mayor Kant mentioned when the article came out regarding the need to dredge our harbor it did not take long for the Corps of Engineers to come out and measure our channel. After their analysis of the channel, it appears that only the north side of the channel, 15 feet of the 80 feet is not within the regulated depth.

Jill Cabaniss, Finance Director, addressed the City Council and presented a Summary Financial Report nine months ended June 30, 2013. The General Fund had a cash balance of \$11,295,457 and the Utility Funds had a cash balance of \$23,993,129 for a total cash balance of \$35,288,586. The excess revenue over expenditures was \$1,290,866.

Councilmember Brewer addressed the City Council regarding the Education Advisory Committee. She said proposals have been turned in from our five schools and we will be looking at these in the next couple of weeks.

A Public Hearing was held as advertised on a proposed ordinance to Amend Zoning Ordinance No. 1253. Councilmember Boone introduced in writing Ordinance No. 1500, an ordinance to amend Ordinance No. 1326: A Planned Unit Development known as the Greeno-Gayfer Medical Park. The Planning Commission gave a favorable recommendation of this ordinance. The property of Bone Set Too, LLC, generally located on the southwest corner of the intersection of Greeno Road and Gayfer Avenue, Fairhope, Alabama.

Planning Director Jonathan Smith briefly explained the proposed ordinance. He stated this is the Bayside Orthopedics' building which is zoned for medical use only. The amendment would allow for professional and governmental use of 25 percent of the building.

Council President Pro Tem Ford opened the Public Hearing at 6:16 p.m.

Dr. Joey Carter with Bayside Orthopedics addressed the City Council and commented that the building is approximately 32,000 square feet. The U. S. Game and Fish Commission is the tenant who has requested approximately 5,000 square feet of the building. We are excited about them coming and this would be a good addition to the community as well as Fairhope in general.

No one present opposed the proposed ordinance, the Public Hearing closed at 6:19 p.m.

In order to take immediate action, Councilmember Brewer moved for immediate consideration. Seconded by Councilmember Mueller, motion for immediate consideration passed unanimously by the following voice votes: AYE – Mueller, Brewer, Ford, and Boone. NAY – None. Councilmember Brewer then moved for final adoption of Ordinance No. 1500. Seconded by Councilmember Boone, motion for final adoption passed by the following voice votes: AYE – Mueller, Brewer, Ford, and Boone. NAY – None.

Councilmember Brewer moved to approve the appointment of Gary Gover, Shawn Graham, Terry Hargroder, Jeanine Normand, Don Prosch, and Mike Shelton to the Fairhope Environmental Advisory Board for a four-year term ending August 2017. Seconded by Councilmember Mueller, motion passed unanimously by voice vote.

Councilmember Brewer introduced in writing, and moved for the adoption of the following resolution, a resolution to award Bid for 46KV Transmission and 12KV Distribution Lines Upgrade for the Electric Department (Bid Number 022-13). Seconded by Councilmember Boone, motion passed unanimously by voice vote.
