Labor Day Recipe

Take advantage of the last of the summer vegetables and make this refreshing, healthy summer salad for your Labor Day celebration!

Summer Tomato, Onion & Cucumber Salad

Ingredients:

- 3 tablespoons rice vinegar
- 1 tablespoon canola oil
- 1 teaspoon honey
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 1/2 teaspoon ground pepper
- 2 medium cucumbers
- 4 medium tomatoes, cut into 1/2-inch wedges
- 1 Vidalia onion or sweet onion, halved and thinly sliced
- 2 tablespoons coarsely chopped herbs, such as parsley, chives and/or tarragon

Preparation:

1. Whisk vinegar, oil, honey, salt and pepper in a bowl
2. Slice cucumbers into thin rounds. Add cucumber slices, tomato wedges and onion slices to the dressing; gently toss to combine. Let stand up to one hour at room temp.
3. Just before serving, add herbs and toss again.
